After Russ Jacobs requested that each speaker speak no longer than two minutes, that the Sergeants at Arms ensure that they speak for no more than two minutes, and that, to the best of our ability, we alternate between pro and con opinions on each proposal, Gary Roush made a motion to that effect. **Motion adopted.**

Gary Roush moved to accept Proposal 1. **Motion adopted.**

Gary Roush moved to accept Proposal 2. **Motion adopted.**

Gary Roush moved to accept Proposal 3. **Motion adopted** after debate by show of hands, 30 ayes and 4 noes.

Jeff Lipps moved to reject Proposal 4. Gary Roush raised a point of order, suggesting that the motions ought to be worded consistently to avoid confusion. The point of order was lost, with Russ Jacobs explaining that the motions never have been. Debate proceeded on the motion to reject Proposal 4. **Motion adopted** by show of hands, 20 ayes and 18 noes.

Gary Roush moved to accept Proposal 5. **Motion lost** after debate by show of hands, 14 ayes and 23 noes.

Gary Roush moved to accept Proposal 5a. **Motion adopted** by show of hands, 21 ayes and 16 noes.

Russ Jacobs announced that a change to Proposal 7a had been suggested to make the language more consistent with Proposal 5a, by replacing *Judging five hounds per stake* to *Judging a minimum of five hounds in one stake*. A vote by the members of the Rules Evaluation Committee was taken, with all three voting in favor of the modification. Rich Whritenour then moved to accept the modified Proposal 7a. **Motion adopted.**

- 2 Submitted by Marilyn Standerford: Move that the Board direct REC to address Chapter II, Section 1, #6 to include e-mail in addition to certified mail.
- 3 Submitted by Marilyn Standerford: Move that the Board direct REC to address Chapter II, Section 3, #3 to be reworded to not “imply” that *correct addition* to mean change but rather just remove *correct*.
- 4 Submitted by Marilyn Standerford: Move that the Board direct REC to address Chapter IV, Section 1, #1 and change the words “submitting in writing” to *via the date request form or ASFA website*.
- 5 Submitted by Marilyn Standerford: Move that the Board direct REC to address Chapter IV, Section 3 and change from “Two sample copies” to *one sample copy*.
- 6 Submitted by Marilyn Standerford: Move that the Board direct REC to address Chapter IV, Section 3, stating a field trial secretary may not “mail out” and change to *publish or distribute* premium list until... (remove “for mailing”).
- 7 Submitted by Marilyn Standerford: Move that the Board direct REC to address Chapter IV, Section 8, 3(t), 4(e), and 5(e) because they conflict in stating *must*, *suggested*, and *optional*.
- 8 Submitted by Marilyn Standerford: Move that the Board direct REC to address Chapter V, Section 2 to change to ... “or page of formal *printing* to “or page of formal *publication*”.
- 9 Submitted by Marilyn Standerford: Move that the Board direct REC to do housekeeping on Chapter VI, Section 1 (b) to be consistent with previous change last year for Chapter IV, Section 8, 3b.
- 10 Submitted by Tom Cigolle: Move that Chapter II, Section 1 title be changed to read Field Trial Secretary (*should* be a member of the host club).
- 11 Submitted by Tom Cigolle: Move that Chapter II, Section 7, Item 1 to add at the end “Such change shall be posted at the trial”.

352 12 Submitted by Dean Wright: Move to separate the rule book from the constitution
353 on the web site and add to that button “ASFA Constitution”.

354 13 Submitted by Dean Wright: Move to amend Chapter XI, Section 7b to extend the
355 time for judges to go without judging from 2 years to 3 years.

356 14 Submitted by Dean Wright: Move to change Chapter XI, Section 4 to allow a
357 provisional judge to judge 6 breeds rather than 4.

358 15 Submitted by Jim Anthony: Move that the Board direct the Ways and Means
359 Committee look into ASFA starting a program similar to the AKC CAT tests.

360 Russ Jacobs made a motion to refer a group of the itemized motions to the Rules
361 Evaluation Committee (REC). After debate and amendment, the **motion that the Board**
362 **refer the items numbered 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, and 11 to the REC** was **adopted**.

363 After debate and amendment on item 2, the **motion that the Board direct REC to address**
364 **Chapter II, Section 1, #6 by replacing *current address of the affected owner* with *current***
365 ***address and e-mail address of the affected owner* and by replacing *by certified mail* with**
366 ***by certified mail and by e-mail*** was **adopted**.

367 During debate on item 10, Tom Cigolle stated that his intention was to change *must* to
368 *should* and that the addition of *Trial* was unintentional. At the conclusion of debate on
369 item 10, the **motion that the Board direct REC to change the Chapter II, Section 1 title to**
370 **read *Field Trial Secretary (should be a member of the host club)*** was **adopted** by show of
371 hands, 24 ayes and 11 noes.

372 After debate and amendment on item 12, the **motion that the Board direct the Website**
373 **Committee to separate the rule book from the Constitution on the web site and add to that**
374 **a button, “ASFA Constitution”** was **adopted**.

375 After debate and amendment on item 13, the **motion that the Board direct REC to amend**
376 **Chapter XI, Section 7 (b) to extend the time for judges to go without judging from 2**
377 **years to 3 years** was **lost**.

378 After debate and amendment on item 14, the **motion that the Board direct REC to change**
379 **Chapter XI, Section 4 (a) to allow a provisional judge to judge six breeds rather than four**
380 was **lost** by show of hands, 16 ayes and 19 noes.

After debate on item 15, the **motion that the Board direct the Ways and Means Committee look into ASFA starting a program similar to the AKC CAT tests was adopted.**

After a photograph was taken of the Board of Directors, Corresponding Secretary Bill Bowlus-Root, delegate from EBC, and Director (Region 1) Jeff Falkner, delegate from NWRRC, departed. 40 delegates from 31 member clubs remained.


Denise Como moved that the Board direct the REC to address Chapter IV, Section 1 to add *At no time will a requested date(s) be accepted or approved by the Scheduling Chairperson or Scheduling Committee if such date(s) is fourteen days or less prior to the proposed trial(s).* **Motion lost** after debate.

Russ Jacobs made a motion to resolve the issues that arose during debate of the previous lost motion. After debate and amendment, the **motion that the Board address the policy or practice of accepting trial date requests made less than 45 days in advance of the trial date was adopted.**

Judy Lowther moved that the Board direct Judges Licensing to provide the judges list to the website master in an Excel spreadsheet instead of a PDF document. **Motion adopted** after debate.

General Comments

The first half of this year was fairly uneventful, but we made up for it in the second half. As in past years, I want to thank the many people who provided support to me when researching questions and determining the most efficient and effective ways to bring business before the Board. I'd also like to thank the RDs and committee chairs who submitted their reports to me in a timely manner when requested. You made my day!

Statements of Irregularity and Protests

During the year, I received one Statements of Irregularity. It was submitted by Joan Doyle regarding the all-breed lure trials held by the Greater Twin Cities Whippet Club on July 19-20, 2014. Her Basenji Ireland was disqualified at the end of the Final course, although the cause was not clear to her and the club may not have handled the incident in the most helpful way. In her letter, Mrs. Doyle indicated she hoped the Board would reverse the disqualification, although I had previously told her that was not an option the Board had for dealing with the situation. We assembled as many supporting documents and statements from participants as we could. Josie Haumont, the Regional Director of Region 5, followed up with the club and the judges, Kay Nierengarten and Michael Small, to get their perspectives, but her attempts to follow up with Mrs. Doyle were not returned. The matter was reviewed by the Board and several points for improvement were identified for follow up by committees and the RD.

There were no Protests with Appeal, Protests with No Appeal, Protests upheld, and no Protests.

Other Correspondence

I received a number of questions, comments, and suggestions from Board members, club delegates, judges, and exhibitors which I responded to or passed along to the appropriate person to handle a reply. Many of these found their way into motions before the Board or to the work done in committees. I also responded to 20 questions posted to the web site, the majority of them looking for lure coursing opportunities for their non-sighthound dogs.

Denise Gentile (Treasurer) and Dominic Carota (Board Member) of the Pharaoh Hound Owners of Northeast sent a letter expressing concern about an ASFA Pharaoh Hound Only Specialty hosted by California Coursing Association (CCA) on December 26th and 27th, 2014. There appear to be scheduling, records, and other issues surrounding this event.

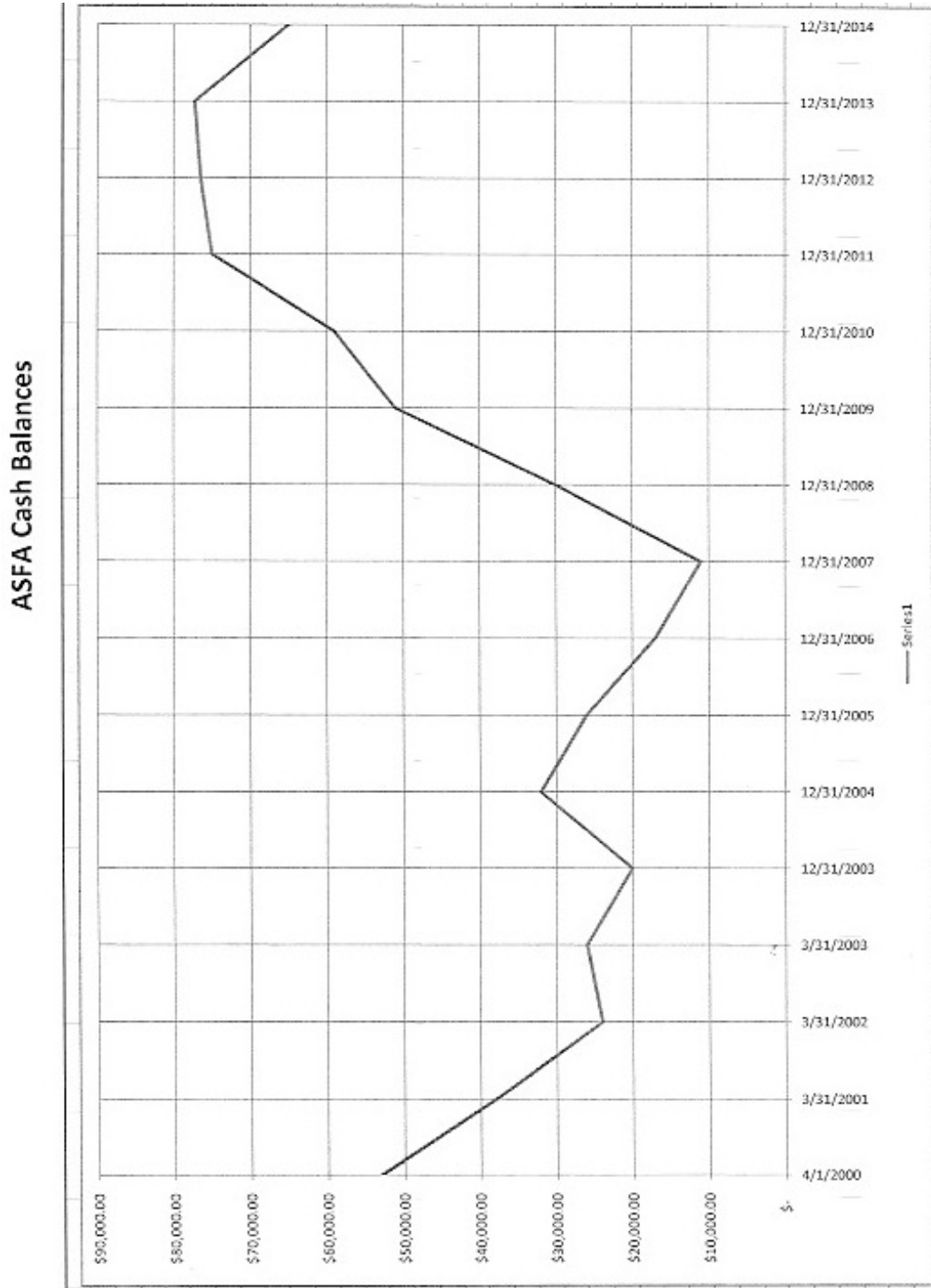

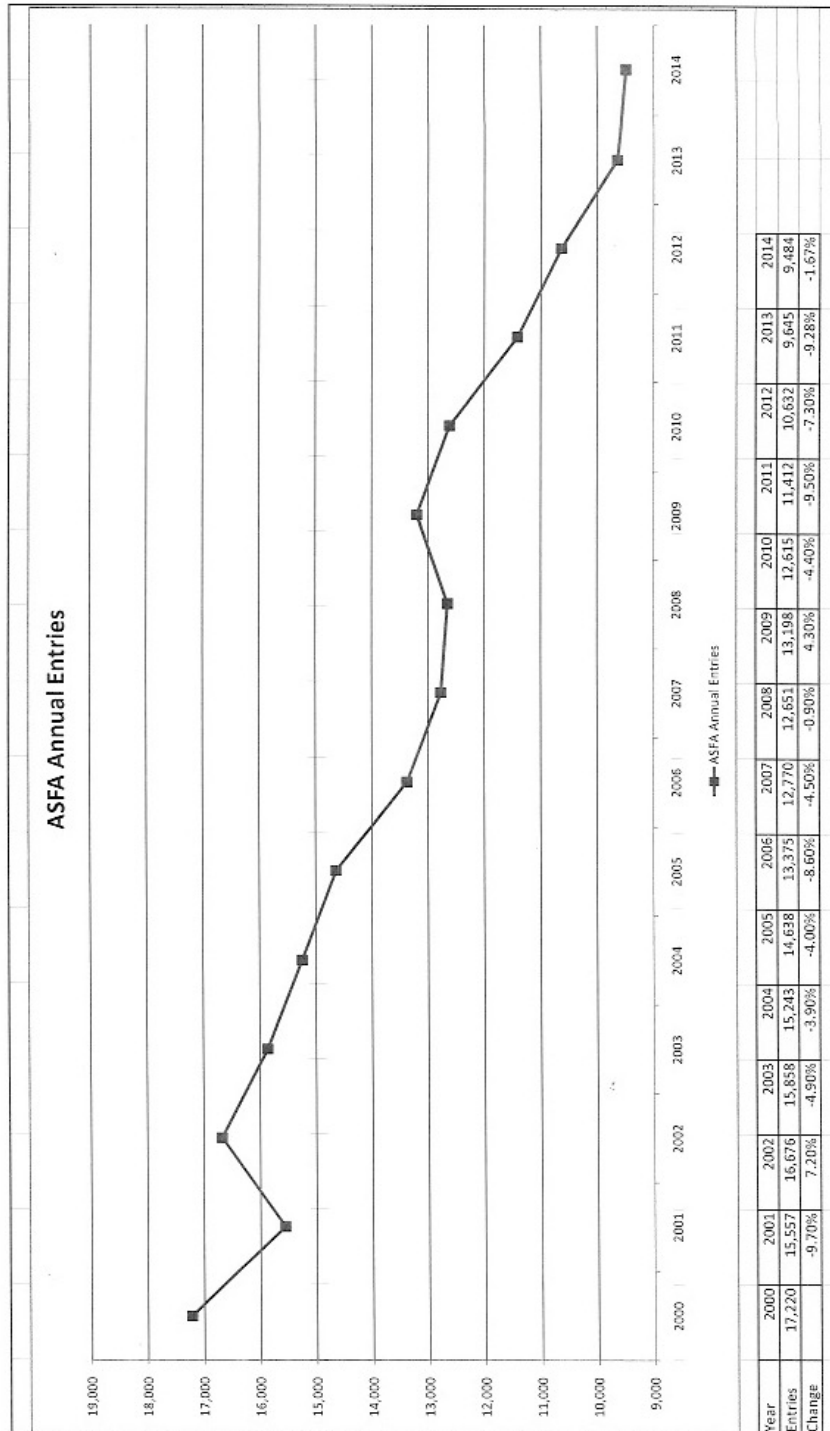
614 Attachment 4 — Graph of ASFA Cash Balances by year

Attachment 9 — Region 2 Report

There were 6 trials held in 2014 for Region 2. We did not have a Regional Invitational this past year. We will need to try to schedule one for this year.

There are severe challenges facing us in 2015.

With favorable weather over the majority of the year, there are a wide variety of canine events that are held year round in our area almost every weekend. These events range from performance events such as straight racing, oval racing, and open field coursing, to agility events, service work, and of course conformation shows. This will force the owners to make choices as to which events to attend and tends to reduce the number of hounds at the trials. Our great weather allows us to hold events year round while other areas of the country face severe cold and snow.

The largest challenge we have is finding fields suitable for coursing. Our state is in a drought that has been ongoing for 3 years. We had a large amount of rain in December, but the driest January on record. At the time of this writing (first week of February) there is a forecast for a large storm to start at the end of this week. Hopefully this will open the “storm door” and bring rain to our parched fields. Many of the fields that we are accustomed to using, have either fallen upon disrepair, or no longer allow canine events. The drought is forcing many municipalities to reduce or even eliminate watering the grass at public parks and schools. I have been visiting schools, parks, and open space areas to see if any of the fields will meet our needs. When I do find a location that may work, the Owners (School Districts, Park Districts, or Municipalities) tend to not allow a canine event. And those that will allow us to run want too much money for the weekend to allow a trial to break even, let alone make a profit. Many of the local ASFA clubs that are also members of AKC are holding AKC’s and CAT testing in order to make additional money.

It is my goal to increase the number of trials scheduled for 2015 and to hold a Regional Invitational. If I can find a field to run on, I am confident I can make it happen. The first trial of the year is this coming weekend, and I am hoping to hold a regional meeting while there. The demand for coursing is still here, and many of the members will be anxious to attend the ones that are held.

I would first like to thank Josie Haumont for the past five years she's served as RD in Region 5. After taking over mid-term she was elected to two full terms and did a wonderful job of pulling the region forward through some difficult times.

I'm happy to be able to say that ASFA lure coursing has taken a bit of an upturn this past year. Though the uptick isn't across the board, five of our seven Member clubs have each averaged more entries than in 2013. Our total regional entry was up nearly 200 hounds from the previous year.

Our Member Clubs consist of Goin' Up North Coursing (GUNC), Greater Twin Cities Whippet Club (GTCWC), Heartland Coursing Association (HCA), Iowa Coursing Association (ICA), Minnesota Coursing Association (MCA), Nebraska Coursing Association (MCA), and St. Louis Area Sight Hounds (SLASH). Show-Me Basenji Club holds Affiliate status in ASFA. Delegates of the national breed clubs for Basenjis, Salukis, and Scottish Deerhounds reside in Region 5. SLASH has been fortunate this past year to host National Specialty lure coursing for Basenjis, Ibizan Hounds, Irish Wolfhounds, Italian Greyhounds, Pharaoh Hounds, and Scottish Deerhounds.

The 2014 Regional Invitational was hosted by Nebraska Coursing Association in Omaha on November 1 with Jeff Lipps, Sandra Moore, and Kim Bork judging. Best in Field over the 64 hound entry was the open whippet Archie, Kamada Archibald Duke Of Bonham owned by Dave DiBlasi. This year's Invitational is scheduled to be held in Cedar Falls, IA on September 26 with Iowa Coursing Association hosting.

829 The clubs of Region VI held their own last year. There was not any noticeable dip in
830 entries.

831 MGA hosted the Region VI Invitational. They had 97 entries. Whippet U won BIF.

832 COACH became active again and hosted three trials over Thanksgiving weekend. They
833 will be hosting the Region VI Invitational this year on October 17.

834 For Region VI, there were a total of 11 clubs hosting 32 trials with a total entry of 1,863
835 participants up from 1,672 the previous year.

836 We have 14 member clubs in the region. Most clubs host two weekends of trials so there
837 is no shortage of trials during spring, summer, and fall. There are a few clubs with limited
838 membership and are starting to share weekends to maintain active status. Some clubs
839 have moved to hosting AKC trials only.

840 I find that the clubs in this region are all well organized and efficient with paperwork and
841 running the trial in efficient manners. There were no rules violations and no one had
842 complaints. Most clubs have enough volunteers to run the events and provide lunch for
843 judges and workers. The trials are relaxed and fun to attend.

844 The item of note from the region is that the trial workers and entrants are consistent. This
845 indicates a lack of influx of new people into the sport.

846 The biggest problem for the region is lack of really good coursing fields. Some clubs
847 have been at the same locations and use the same course plans where experienced dogs
848 are no longer coursing but guessing which plan is being used. Need some way for clubs
849 to get out of comfort zones and look for new fields.

Region 7 includes the states of FL, GA, SC, NC, AL, MS, and TN.

First I would like to thank Dale Parks for running Region 7 for the past two years. He did a great job for the region.

In 2014, 14 clubs ran 43 trials including the II. Total dogs entered were 1906 of which 408 were from the II. This is an increase of 81 dogs including the II over 2013. Region 7 had 53 dogs in the top 20 representing 13 breeds and 2 dogs finished #1, IB Rocco (R. DeVillez) and RR Zoli (J and C Slattery/Dale Parks). A stand out club was GOGLC which held 10 trials with 406 dogs running and hosted the II with 408 dogs running for a total of 814 dogs.

Our goals for this year are to increase participation from sighthound owners and to offer training seminars which include Judging, Lure Operation, Field Trial Secretary, Huntmaster, Roll Call and Course Layout. Region 10 covers the state of California south from the northern boundaries of San Luis Obispo, Kern and San Bernardino counties, Arizona, Hawaii, and Nevada south of Highway 6.

2014 saw our lowest entry numbers in years, as well as a decrease by more than half of the number of ASFA clubs in the region. Region 10 has not held a Regional Invitational since January of 2013, and we will be remedying that as well as other challenges this year.

Region 10 is currently facing a number of challenges, including a large decline in number of ASFA clubs (that have mostly chosen to only host AKC events from now on), a loss of available fields due to drought and other challenges.

Region 10 currently has 2 all-breed Member clubs, 1 National Breed Club, and 2 Affiliate clubs. 2015 has already seen an increase in the number of clubs in region 10, however, with Central Coast Association of Sighthounds (CCASH) in Paso Robles, CA, earning 'Fast Track' Affiliation status on January 1st, 2015. The Central Coast generally has mild weather all year, and CCASH has a large number of long-time ASFA enthusiasts as members, so CCASH is hoping to host their first couple of trial weekends in 2015.

Region 10's season is already under way. By this publication, CCA will have already held their first 4 trials of the year. CCA hosted 19 trials in 2014, tying for the most trials of any ASFA club in the country. Their entries per trial, however, were small due to only hosting Specialty trials in the past few years. The largest entry for any region 10 club was for the Silken Windhound National trial hosted by the national parent club, ISWS, in June 2014 in Tacoma Washington (region 1).

As a new Regional Director this year, I will be working to improve communication in the region and to encourage individuals and clubs to embrace and/or rekindle their enthusiasm for the sport of lure coursing. As the most active club in Region 10, I will be working with CCA to encourage them to continue to host ASFA trials and to work with members to overcome biases against ASFA. I will be working with each club in the region to address their unique challenges. I believe greater communication will get us far in achieving our common goals. To achieve this, I am creating Yahoo! and Facebook groups for the region, as well as planning to travel throughout the region this year to meet individuals and club officers in-person to learn their perspectives and encourage participation in the sport.

Records 101 (update 2/14)

As directed by the ASFA Board of Directors, I wrote an article for FAN about records and common errors that I experience. The article was printed in the May/June 2002 FAN. What I came up with were lists of points which I felt were important. These applied to any person attending an ASFA event in regard to the submission of records. While some of them are only suggestions, others are rules or policies. I then did my best to reference which rule/policy. This update will hopefully bring these lists current with our latest rulebook and subsequent changes. I hope to keep adding to this and would love for any person to email me with additions. They could be something that is done in their area and has improved their trials from the records prospective or a rule/policy that I missed.

Entries

1. Always use the most current form available.
2. If you create your own computer-generated version, be sure to include all the information just like the current ASFA entry form. Especially the registration number which has a tendency to be cut off.
3. Always include or encourage the inclusion of email addresses. This makes contacting the owner/agent easier should a question arise or to confirm when the hound completes a title.
4. Be sure entries are legible and complete. This has become very important again as some AKC registrations do not include the owners address. I can only input what I can interpret. **I will be glad to generate a computer entry for your hound if you ask.**
5. Club name/initials and the date of the trial must be at the top of the entry. (Ch. IV, Sec 6.)
6. All entries must be 5 ½ X 8 ½. (Ch. IV, Sec. 3, #1.) Please be sure to only separate from other half of sheet.
7. Entries are to be completed in entirety by all exhibitors. This is especially important for first time-entered hounds. (Ch. II, Sec 1, #7.) Every FTS should be reviewing for completeness when they are filling out the record sheet. Then obtaining any missing data from the owner at the trial if necessary. Owner address is not always listed on AKC registration so make sure address is there and legible.
8. If the entry is marked that it is a first ASFA point trial, it is the FTS's responsibility to be sure that the hound certification and the required copy of acceptable registration is included. If the Hound Certification has been waived, a copy of the signed waiver and proof of the title must accompany first entry in an ASFA pointed trial.
9. Be sure to mark if you have multiple entries (same owner) and you want them separated when possible. This will also serve as a notation when the Stake gets split into multiple flights. (Ch. V, Sec. 9.)
10. The entry must be marked if the hound has been dismissed for the trial to count as a clean trial. (Ch. VIII, Sec 5.)
11. If a hound is lame, in-season, absent, etc. at roll call (not pulled after a course), document at the top of the entry. **An entry MUST be included with the trial results for these hounds.** (Ch. VI, Sec. 1 C.)
12. A photocopy of acceptable registry must be submitted with a hound's first ASFA entry. This includes Single Stake. (Waived for NGA registered hounds.) (Ch. V, Sec. 4 (a), effective 1/1/03). **It is the responsibility of the owner/agent to supply this but it is the responsibility of the Field Trial Secretary to require it.** Copies of pedigrees (certified or not) are NOT acceptable.
13. Be sure to mark the area to indicate any changes to the hound's record and what changes, highlighting that area is helpful. I try to catch all the corrections. If you mark a change and I do not update, please email me as this is the most accurate method of communication.

Judges Sheets

1. Must be signed by the judge. This is to be checked by the field clerk when the judge hands the sheet in for scoring. (Ch. II, Sec. 3, #3.)

2. Club initials and date of event must be listed.
3. Breed, course, stake, and judge (1 or 2) must be marked. The easiest way to insure that this is done is for the FTS to have sheets marked when they are given to the judge. The clerk then needs to verify correct sheet was used.
4. The judge must initial all changes.
5. A reason **must** be marked for any hound that is excused, dismissed or disqualified. (Ch. III, Sec. 19.) It is the responsibility of the field clerk or secretary to be reviewing the sheet when it is handed in by the judge. If a reason is not listed, return the sheet to the judge for completion.
6. A suggestion to help decrease the risk of reversing Judge #1 and #2 scores when entering them onto the record sheet is to place #1 on top of #2 with the total scores of both visible. You can then look down at yellow #1/#2, etc. The exception is if there are blanket errors noted on either sheet.
7. The field clerk should be checking for completeness of the judge's sheet when it is handed in after a run. Then the FTS should check again before submitting the records.

Record Sheets

1. Must be completed in entirety. This includes the BIF sheet!!
2. Computer-generated sheets may be submitted as long as they contain the required information and give the same appearance of an ASFA form.
3. Any hound listed on the sheet and scratched out must have a reason listed; i.e., pulled, lame, in-season, absent, etc. (Ch. VI, Sec. 1 (f).)
4. Only lame, in-season, hounds pulled due to change of judge/lure operator, or hounds determined to have a breed disqualification are eligible for refund of the entry fee. (Ch. I, Sec. 3.) The record sheet should reflect the refund was given. All other hounds listed will count toward per-capita.
5. Writing must be legible!! Especially if there were changes made to the course(s) and/or blanket color(s).
6. Always recheck the addition. Owners/handlers should also check addition as they review the posted sheets. We are all, after all, only human.
7. All forfeits must be clearly marked or the tie will stand. Just because there is a placement marked does not constitute a forfeit. There are to be no assumptions.
8. BOB should be marked above the 1 of the winning hound.
9. Only the total score of runoffs/BOB should be listed when more than one judge.
10. Judges (including Provisional) are to be listed in alphabetical order by last name. (Operational Policy TRIALS15.)
11. If a stake is mixed it cannot be changed after the prelims. (Operational Policy TRIALS14.)
12. Hounds entered in the single stake should be listed on the same record sheet. It is helpful if breed initials are with the call name.
13. When the record sheet is changed due to a mathematical error or entry error, initial changes.
14. The name of the field clerk is required on the sheet. (Operational Policy TRIALS04.)

Over All

1. Original paperwork is to be submitted and copies retained by the club. Be sure to separate NCR forms, only submitting the white copy.
2. Follow the organization listed on in Records 101 (previously listed in Rule book).
*When stakes are mixed they can be listed either on the same record sheet (space permitting) or separate. Place the open entry, open record sheet, FCh entries then FCh record sheet followed by the judge's sheets in order. If they are listed on the same sheet then put the Open entries, FCh entries, record sheet followed by the judge's sheets. The same scenario can be used when running different breeds together.
3. Please do not send records in any method that requires a signature. There are multiple methods available to send the records and track them. Tracking is always a good idea.
4. Per capita fee and fines must be submitted by club check or money order. No personal checks can be accepted. (Ch. VI, Sec. 1 (g).)

5. Per the Regional Invitational Guidelines **“A per capita fee of \$1.00 per Breeder/Kennel/Bench stake entry will be forwarded to the Records Coordinator with the trial results. Copies of Breeder stake and Kennel stake entries will accompany the records.”**
6. Use of some method of listing entries/counts for per capita count is helpful when there is a discrepancy in the per capita submitted and the amount required.
7. An error found after the trial but prior to submission of records will not count against the club if the club includes the steps that have been taken to handle the situation. (Please review Operational Policy RCD12 for further explanation.) So, it is strongly suggested that you check over everything prior to sending them off.
8. All changes in ownership marked on entries must be accompanied with a copy of the changed registration form.
9. Records must be received within 14 days or be postmarked within 10 days of the approved trial(s). See Chapter VI, Section 1 of the current Running Rules. I strongly suggest a copy of the mailing receipt be kept as proof of mailing in the event of late receipt. **Please send ASAP!!**
10. **Please add me to your mailing list so that I automatically receive your premium, electronic versions are fine with me.** We would like all mailing to include the entire 9 number zip code to see if this helps with the USPS delivery. So, please update your records to indicate my mailing address as follows:

11. It is highly encouraged that both owners and clubs look at the results printed on the Web Site for accuracy. If an error is found, please contact me immediately and I will investigate your information. I can be reached for questions either by email, snail mail, or phone. If I don't know the answer I will find out and we will learn together. If ever you see misinformation in regard to your hound(s) please let me know immediately and I will make the necessary corrections. When you contact me be sure to identify the hound by breed, call name, registered name, and registration number.
12. **New for 2011 – A new policy which allows me to double the late fine to a club that is late a second time in a 12 month calendar year. So the first incident is \$5.00 per day and any subsequent incident would be \$10.00 per day.**

Special Note for Invitationals

The Regional Director is responsible to order the Rosettes and Medallions from the Awards Chairperson a minimum of 2 weeks prior to the trial. An estimate of the number of items required as close as possible is required. After the trial all remaining Rosettes and Medallions are to be returned to the Awards Chairperson within 2 weeks after the trial.

Most Frequent Records Errors

1. Copy of acceptable registration not included.
2. Incomplete Records sheets. This most frequently is the BIF sheet but occurs with breed sheets.
3. Not marking forfeits, just marking the placement(s).
4. Missing club/date information at the top of the entry.
5. Missing entries for hounds listed on Record sheet(s) but marked lame, in-season, etc.
6. Entry size, is to be 5 ½ X 8 ½.
7. Addition errors. I am of the belief that as owners as we check the posted scores we too should be checking the addition. Field Trial Secretaries should recheck the records prior to submitting. If you find the error, initiate the action to correct (i.e. notify owners of error), and include a letter detailing error and steps taken then no Error Notice will be sent.

8. Missing signatures on both entries and judge's sheets.
9. Giving hounds placements that have not total 50% of possible combined score.

Organization of Trial Records for Submission

(Previously listed in the rulebook)

The following required items must be promptly sent to the Records Coordinator following each trial, indicated in Ch. VI:

1. Proper per capita check (current fee for each hound entered which has not been excused as lame or in season at or prior to roll call).
2. One copy of the approved premium list, with corrections to list of judges, if appropriate.
3. All entry forms, judges sheets and record sheets, completely filled out and written legibly.

The preferred order to use in organizing this material for submission is:

1. Per capita check
2. Premium list
3. Field records in the following order:
 - A. Afghan Hound
 - 1) Open stake
 - a) Entry forms in record sheet order
 - b) Record sheets
 - c) Preliminary course judges sheets in course-number order
 - d) Final course judges sheets in course-number order
 - e) Judges sheets from runoffs, if any
 - 2) Field Champion stake
 - a) through e), as above
 - 3) Veteran stake (if any)
 - a) through e), as above
 - 4) Best of Breed run judges sheets, if any. (Total scores and blanket colors are posted to the proper record sheet in column labeled "BOB Runoff.")
 - B. Azawakh (follow same order as above)
 - C. Basenji (same as above), etc., by breed in alphabetical order
 - D. Limited stakes by breed in alphabetical order (same as indicated for Open stake above).
 - E. Singles stake (same as above)
 - F. Best in Field record sheet (filled out completely)
 - G. Best in Field judges sheets in course number order.

Copies of the records submitted must be retained for the club files. It is strongly recommended that the club retain proof of the date of mailing. If the original package is lost in the mail, the trial results can be reconstructed.

Filling in the Trial Record Sheets

The record sheets must be completely and legibly filled out. This includes the complete names of the judges, the call names and registration numbers of the hounds, etc. If an entered hound is not competing, the reason should be entered on the record sheet, as should the reason for any excusal, dismissal, or disqualification. For tie runoffs, the blanket color and total score only should be entered in the "Runoff" column; similarly, for Best of Breed runs, enter only these items in the "BOB Runoff" column.

Submission of Records

Current Running Rules for ASFA listed on previous page. Below is a brief guideline with reminders.

1. Per capita check. Remember this cannot be a personal check.
2. Copy of premium. While the rulebook only indicates one copy it is appreciated if there is one for each day with any changes marked on it.
3. Letter of explanation if there were any changes to the trial specifically judges.
4. Entries for first breed (breeds are to be in alphabetical order). The entries should be in the order that is listed on the record sheet.
5. Record sheet, completely filled out and legible.
6. Judge's sheets, these should be in the order of courses with Judge # 1 course #1 followed by Judge #2 for course #1 and so on. Any runoffs should follow the sheets for the stake that they occurred in and lastly BOB.
7. In the event of mixed stakes: if it can fit onto one record sheet that is fine just be sure to define which is Open, FCh, or Vet by a line or notation. All entries would then be in order and the judge's sheets the same as above.
8. In the event 2 breeds are run together then put the entry for the first followed by the record sheet the entry for the next then the next record sheet (this can also be placed on the same record sheet as long as there is a clear notation). The judge's sheets would then follow.
9. Some FTS's paperclip the info for each breed together, some staple and some just have them stacked. It makes no difference as long as they are in order.
10. It is also good to include a breakdown of each day for the per capita. It makes it easier to figure out when there is a conflict.

* It is greatly appreciated when there is a note included with all the FTS contact information which is not always listed in the premium. I especially would like an email address for any questions that may arise during processing of the trial(s).

During 2014, the Board adopted the following policies:

1. Operational Policy O-RULO7: The acronym ASFA, when used for the American Sighthound Field Association, shall not be used for any commercial venture without prior approval by the Board of Directors. Only ASFA events specifically designated as hosted by the ASFA (i.e., the ACoD, the Regional and International Invitationals, the approved National Specialties) may include the ASFA acronym as part of the title of the event. (03/14)

This repeats Administrative Rule A-RUL08 in the Operational Policies.

During 2014, the Board modified the following policies:

1. Administrative Policy A-RD04: Each year Regional Directors shall complete a Field Representative's report form on at least one trial hosted by each Club attended within their regions. Completion of the report is optional only if the Regional Director is a member of the host Club or Field Committee. A copy of the report shall be forwarded to the Field Trial Improvement Committee Chairperson and the Club Field Trial Chairperson within 30 days of the trial. (04/94) A151

The first sentence has been changed to: "At least every two years, Regional Directors, or their designee, shall complete a Field Representatives report form on at least one trial hosted by each club attended within their region."

2. Administrative Policy A-ELEC02: The Nominating Committee will ask the nominee for Recording Secretary to attend the Board Meeting and Convention for the purposes of shadowing the outgoing Secretary. Any other potential nominee may attend for the same purpose. The newly elected Recording Secretary shall be reimbursed per Board reimbursement policy, provided he/she has attended and assisted in taking minutes at both the Board meeting and Convention. The third sentence has been modified as follows: "The invited nominee shall be reimbursed per Board travel reimbursement policy."

3. Operational Policy O-FORM01: Upon request, one set of free forms will be mailed to a club or individual per year. The Forms Committee is empowered

Committee members: Leigh Littleton, Chair, Judges' Licensing, Greg Breitbach, Katie Kaltenborn, Leigh Littleton, and Dean Wright

Purpose

- To develop the system of licensing and continued training that will encourage and promote the highest quality and standards throughout ASFA judging.
- To propose and evaluate ideas, issues, and proposals that could affect the general quality of judging at ASFA trials and make recommendations to the ASFA Board and appropriate Committees.
- To coordinate with the Judges' Licensing Committee and review any rule or policy changes recommended by said committee.

Completed Goals for 2014-2015

1. *Revise and resubmit proposed rule changes to Chapter XI, Section 12 (Judges' discipline) after examining all ASFA BOD minutes for items pertaining to judges' discipline.*

The committee received most of the Board minutes, organized and digitalized the minutes. They were being reviewed by Katie Kaltenborn. Katie was unable to complete the review and Bill Martin took over. It appears that some minutes are not included in the record or at least one occurrence of a judges' disciplinary outcome was not mentioned in any minutes. Therefore we are unable to present data at this time to support our development of a published process for each stage of discipline regarding a provisional or licensed judge, as previously submitted.

2. *Revise and resubmit proposed rule changes concerning provisional judge requirements after analyzing all trials held in 2013.*

We submitted three proposals to the Board of Directors and all three were approved and sent to the Rules Evaluation Committee.

These three proposals are based on the following information.

After recording all the entries for every trial held in 2013, we summarized entries by breed in each region. The Summary Datasheet is in the attachments to this report.

We determined how many qualifying judging assignments (QA) were available using the current standard of 7 dogs in a breed, judged 3 times. We found that Region 3

Minutes of the 2015 ASFA Annual Convention of Delegates

had only 9 QA, 4 regions had 20 or less, and the remaining 5 regions range from 38 to 95 QA. In other words, 5 regions should have enough assignments for provisional judges to complete the requirements without expensive travel but the other 5 are extremely lacking.

We then looked at the first choice, requiring 5 dogs in a stake instead of 7 in a breed. This would ensure a judge had to do cross-course judging at least in prelims. Region 3 would see an increase of 40%, going from 9 QA to 15 QA. The remaining regions would see 11% change or less. Overall there is only 9% increase in opportunities for a provisional judge.

The second choice was requiring 4 dogs in a stake. Overall, this increases qualifying assignments by 27% for all of ASFA. However, judging four dogs in a stake means a judge does not see 3 dogs run together.

After lengthy discussion among the committee members, we reached a compromise. We therefore submitted Rule Change Proposal 5 (to be voted on at the ACoD) as one of our proposals.

Proposal 5 increases the number of qualifying assignments, especially in regions with very few opportunities for provisional judges. The Rules Evaluation Committee's alternative, 5a, was rejected by our committee because there is no significant increase in qualifying assignments. To increase opportunities we recommended 2 breeds, judged 3 times, with 4 in a stake and added the 3rd breed with 5 in a stake to ensure at least one breed required cross-course judging. The Chair of Judges' Licensing, Leigh Littleton, gave his approval and indicated that record keeping was not a problem.

We retained the number of dogs total in a breed at the current 21 requirement to keep standards high. The Rule Evaluation Committee's Proposal 5a lowers the minimum number of dogs to 15 per breed and incorrectly states in the 'Effect' that our proposal is different from the current standard. In the rationale the REC states 'the number seems arbitrary'. The requirement of 7 dogs in a breed judged 3 times is in the Rule Book.

3. *Develop wording for the proposed Susan Weinkein award for the Judge of the Year.*

We recommend that the Judges' Handbook be changed to honor Susan Weinkein in the title.

4. *Examine including judging BIF in provisional requirements.*

We worked with the Chair of Judges Licensing Committee to design a new form for provisional judges to include judging BIF. A sample is found in the attachments to this report. The committee recommends adoption of the new form.

5. *Follow up on policies affecting judging and the outcome of our submissions as determined by the Board.*

Dean confirmed that the policies are updated.

6. *Continue to develop the Apprentice/Provisional Judging Symposium material (as approved by the BOD March 27, 2012) specifically for new Judge applicants.*

We still plan to videotape the same courses from two different vantage points, mid-field and finish line, in a format that is compatible with PowerPoint. These videos will be embedded in the symposium presentation. We are still looking for volunteers with the necessary equipment to accomplish this goal.

7. *Increase the number of licensed judges through continuing development of the current Judging Symposium program and support current judges through continuing education.*

Eleven new apprentice and provisional judges have been licensed in 2014-2015 after attending a symposium.

8. *Encourage each region to hold a symposium once a year and have dates listed on the ASFA website.*

1961 Licensing questions have been answered promptly.

1962 There have been no judging problems needing commentary. However, the Licensing
1963 Chair wholeheartedly supports the effort to simplify our licensing requirements for
1964 people in areas with limited trial entries – without compromising the needed learning
1965 experience. I believe this subject was discussed at the Board Meeting & Convention two
1966 years ago – and over the course of the last two years the Judges Committee has discussed
1967 possible rules revisions. The current proposal from the REC would be a small
1968 improvement, but not as much as I think is needed.

1969 In addition, I am again this year suggesting that the Convention consider the possibility
1970 of making the rules less punitive with respect to a judge who is not active for a moderate
1971 period of time. The proposal from the REC seems to be designed to address special cases
1972 only, with a very cumbersome procedure. I have never seen someone “forget” how to
1973 judge. Learning may take a bit of time and experience, but once it’s learned, it’s learned.
1974 SO – I recommend that we extend that 2 year limit to 4 or 5 years. Many clubs would
1975 prefer to have a few more potential judges available.

The following Amendments to the Constitution will be submitted for approval to the 2014 Annual Convention of Delegates. THESE ARE PROPOSALS ONLY.

Per Article XI, Section 2 of the Constitution, Amendments require a two-thirds vote of the convention delegates present and voting at the ACoD. Those proposals receiving a favorable vote will be considered an Amendment to the ASFA Constitution and By-Laws. Such Amendments will be published on the ASFA website following the 2014 ACoD, and will go into effect on January 1, 2016.

PROPOSAL #1

Article X,

Section 6. Convention Voting for Recognizing New Breeds. After one year Provisional status the member clubs may vote and after two years Provisional status the member clubs shall vote on whether to accord the breed full recognition. If the national parent club wishes full recognition after one year, a letter requesting such status must be sent to the Corresponding Secretary by January 1st of the year following at least one full calendar year of Provisional status. However, if a breed has not kept a minimum of 15 hounds actively coursing with entries totaling 45 per calendar year they will be kept in the Provisional status without coming up for vote. Member club delegates present at the Annual Convention of Delegates at which a breed has come up for recognition will vote with each member club allowed one vote ~~each per delegate~~. However, a member club not in attendance at the ACoD may send in one absentee ballot to be received not less than two weeks before the ACoD in which a breed has come up for recognition. A two-thirds majority of clubs voting shall be required for full approval....

Rationale: This change clarifies that member clubs get one vote whether they are voting by mail or voting at the Annual Convention of Delegates.

The Committee recommends that the ACoD approves the proposal.

2119 Explanations for the proposal are included, along with REC recommendations. THESE
2120 ARE PROPOSALS ONLY; those that receive a favorable vote will be considered a
2121 change in the Running Rules and Field Procedures for Lure Field Trials. Such proposals
2122 will be published on the ASFA website after the 2015 ACoD, and will go into effect on
2123 January 1, 2016.

2128 **Proposal 1** 2129 **Ch III Judging**

2130 **Section 3.** No judge shall handle a hound in the stake or stakes where he is officiating. No hound may be
2131 entered in a stake where a judge is officiating if the hound is owned or co-owned by that judge, or if the
2132 hound is owned or co-owned by a member of that judge's immediate family or residence. Such hounds may
2133 be entered at that meet in other stakes where the judge is not officiating. No Judge shall officiate at a
2134 certification course for any hound which he/she owns or co-owns or which is owned or co-owned by a
2135 member of that Judge's immediate family or residence.

2136 **Effect:** To make clear that judges cannot certify their own hounds, or those owned by their family or
2137 residence.

2138 **Reason:** This brings a longstanding policy (JUDG18) into the rulebook.

2139 *The REC recommends that this proposal be accepted.*

2140 **Proposal 2** 2141 **Ch XI Licensing of Judges**

2142 **Section 4.** Provisional Status (seeking regular license)

2143 (a) During the period for which a provisional license is granted, the applicant is free to accept judging
2144 assignments. (On all premium lists, announcements, flyers, and so forth, an asterisk preceding the judge's
2145 name shall denote provisional.) The provisional license encompasses all breeds, but at no time shall a
2146 person judge more than four breeds in addition to Singles stakes and Limited stakes, for which he is not

regularly licensed at any one trial without special dispensation as stated in Section 8 of this chapter. This provision applies both to Regional Invitationals and to standard trials.

Effect: To clarify what provisional judges can judge at Regional Invitationals and other trials.

Reason: This brings a longstanding policy (JUDG20) into the rulebook.

The REC recommends that this proposal be accepted.

Proposal 3

CH XI Licensing of Judges

Section 7 (b) If the ASFA records indicate that a person has not judged at a trial in the preceding two years, the license shall lapse and the judge shall lose all previous status. Except that, if a licensed judge shall be stationed outside of the United States by a branch of the U.S. Military, and such service makes it impossible for him or her to judge ASFA trials, the time spent out of the U.S. shall not be counted as part of the two year inactive period. Additionally, if there are extenuating circumstances such as, for example, serious illness on the part of the judge or his or her family, making it impossible for him or her to judge ASFA trials during the two year inactive period, the judge may apply during the period of inactivity to the Chair of Judges Licensing for a suspension of some or all of the two year period. The Chair of Judges Licensing may recommend to the Executive Committee of the ASFA Board of Directors that some or all of that two year time period not be counted as part of the two year inactive period. The final decision as to whether some or all of that period of time be waived shall be made by the Executive Committee of the ASFA. In either case, the Board of Directors of the ASFA shall be notified of such action promptly.

Effect: To allow for exceptions to the two year maximum inactive period for judges.

Reason: There may be exceptional circumstances that make it advisable to extend the period of inactivity allowed.

The REC recommends that this proposal be accepted.

Proposal 4

Chapter V Running the Meet

Section 12, Paragraph (e) ~~No ASFA championship points will be awarded; however, ASFA championship points will be awarded to the hound winning Best in Field based on 4 points for itself and each dog defeated up to a maximum of 40 points for that trial. (For example: if there were 6 dogs running for BIF, the winner would receive 24 championship points in addition to the points already earned that day. If the winning dog was the only one of its breed, it would now have 28 points for that trial (24 +4). If the winning dog already earned 20 points for that trial, it would now have 40 as 8 points would not count from the BIF total.)~~ The hound that wins Best in Field will be credited with a first placement in a stake.

Effect: To award championship points for BIF wins.

Reason: Some dogs that run very well do not have strong competition in breed, and they must run much longer before they earn a title than do dogs of others breeds.

2183 *The REC recommends that this proposal be rejected.*

2184 *Rationale:* Since points and placements would now be available through BIF, many clubs who do not offer
2185 it will be pressured to do so, incurring additional time to run BIF and expense for a BIF rosette.
2186 (Eventually, ASFA will probably have to require BIF.) This rule would have the general effect of
2187 cheapening ASFA titles—many hounds have, in the past, “run much longer before they earn a title than do
2188 dogs of others breeds,” earning points four at a time. It will also make it more difficult for owners to keep
2189 adequate records of their hound’s points, making it more likely that they will enter in the wrong stake. It
2190 could also pose additional headaches for FTSs and the Records Coordinator. Finally, the REC is concerned
2191 that this would, for the first time, allow a hound to win championship points and placements--perhaps even
2192 an ASFA title--without defeating a hound of its own breed.

2193 **Note:** Rule change proposals 5 and 5a are alternatives; if 5 is approved, 5a will not be considered.

2194 **Proposal 5**

2195 **Chapter XI, Section 4, subsection (b) and add subsection (c)**

2196 **Section 4. Provisional Status (seeking regular license)**

2197 (b) Any person seeking a regular license for a breed must judge the performance of ~~seven~~ a minimum of
2198 four or more hounds per trial in one stake in that breed for two breeds.

- 2199 1. at a minimum of three trials; and
2200 2. under three or more different licensed judges.

2201 (c) Any person seeking a regular license for a breed must judge the performance of a minimum of five
2202 hounds in one stake for one additional breed.

- 2203 1. at a minimum of three trials; and
2204 2. under three or more different licensed judges.

2205 **Effect:** Changes breed requirements for provisional judges seeking a regular license from seven hounds
2206 per trial to four hounds in a stake for two breeds, and 5 hounds in a stake for one breed.

2207 **Reason:** This is the recommendation of the Judges Committee.

2208 *The REC recommends that this proposal be rejected.*

2209 *Rationale:* REC believes that it would be useful to reduce the total number of dogs that must be judged, if
2210 the revision also requires cross course judging. However, it finds the “four hounds for the first two breeds,
2211 then five hounds” approach to be unnecessarily complex and likely to be confusing. We propose as an
2212 alternative:

2213 **Proposal 5a**

2214 **Chapter XI, Section 4, subsection (b)**

2215 **Section 4. Provisional Status (seeking regular license)**

2216 (b) Any person seeking a regular license for a breed must judge the performance of ~~seven~~ a minimum of
2217 five or more hounds ~~per trial in one stake in that breed~~ for three breeds.

- 2218 1. at a minimum of three trials; and
2219 2. under three or more different licensed judges.

2220 **Effect:** reduces the total number of dogs to be judged from seven to five, and keeps it constant for the first
2221 three breeds.

2222 **Reason:** this should make it easier for provisional judges to become fully licensed while requiring that
2223 they practice cross course judging, in a simpler format.

2224 *The REC recommends that this proposal be accepted.*

2225 **Note:** The following proposal will be considered only if proposal 5, rather than proposal 5a, passes.

2226 **Proposal 6**

2227 **Chapter XI, Section 4, subsections (b) and (c)**

2228 **Section 4. Provisional Status (seeking regular license)**

2229 **Add the following to both subsection (b) and subsection (c):**

- 2230 3. and an overall total of no fewer than 21 hounds in each breed.

2231 **Effect:** Changes breed requirements for provisional judges seeking a regular license by requiring that they
2232 judge at least 21 hounds in each of the first three breeds.

2233 **Reason:** This is the recommendation of the Judges Committee.

2234 *The REC recommends that this proposal be rejected.*

2235 **Rationale:** The number 21 seems arbitrary and unnecessary; the REC believes that either 5 or 5a should
2236 stand alone.

2237

2238 **Note:** Proposal 7 will be considered only if proposal 5 *or* 5 *and* 6 pass; exact wording to be voted upon will
2239 depend upon which of those proposals passes. If neither 5 nor 6 pass, then 7a will be considered.

2240 **Proposal 7**

2241 **Chapter XI, Section 5. Licensing for Additional Breeds.** Any judge regularly licensed in at least three
2242 breeds may seek an additional breed by meeting the following requirements:

2243

- 2244 (d) Judge provisionally the breed for which the license is sought at no less than three trials with three
2245 different licensed judges. (Judging ~~seven~~ four or five hounds per ~~breed~~ stake for an overall total of 21
2246 dogs in that breed is a requirement for the first three breeds only and does not apply to any breeds
2247 thereafter.)

2248 **Effect:** Makes this section compatible with Section 4 if Rule Change 5 and 6 are adopted.

2249 **Reason:** This is the recommendation of the Judges Committee.

2250 *The REC recommends that this proposal be rejected.*

2251 *Rationale:* If 5 and 6 are rejected, 7 becomes unnecessary.

2252 **Proposal 7a**

2253 **Chapter XI, Section 5. Licensing for Additional Breeds.** Any judge regularly licensed in at least three
2254 breeds may seek an additional breed by meeting the following requirements:

2255 (e) Judge provisionally the breed for which the license is sought at no less than three trials with three
2256 different licensed judges. (Judging ~~seven~~ five hounds per ~~breed~~ stake is a requirement for the first three
2257 breeds only and does not apply to any breeds thereafter.)

2258 **Effect:** Makes this section compatible with Section 4 if Rule Change 5a is adopted.

2259 **Reason:** This is necessary if 5a passes.

2260 *The REC recommends that this proposal be accepted.*
