



186 *Operational Policy O-MEM01: In addition to Article II, Section 1 and*
187 *Appendix, requirements for membership status are as follows: 1)*
188 *affiliated with the ASFA for a minimum of 2 years (24 months); 2) ten*
189 *households, 15 individual members; 3) must normally have 2*
190 *acceptable trials at least 30 days apart in each of the 2 preceding*
191 *years (12 month periods) In exceptional cases, where the Board*
192 *and/or the Membership Committee finds that the club has exhibited a*
193 *pattern of acceptable trials that meets the goals set forth in*
194 *requirement 3 above, membership status may be granted so long as*
195 *all constitutional requirements have been met.*

210 refer to the attachment. Gary Roush moved to limit each speaker in debate
211 to no more than 2 minutes and to alternate speakers on each side as best as
212 possible; motion adopted.

213 Jeff Lipps moved to accept the modifications to *Chapter I, General Rules,*
214 *Section 3 (a),* as shown:

215 **Section 3. (a)** Hounds determined to have a breed disqualification at
216 the time of roll call shall be barred from regular competition and be
217 given the option of entering the Singles stake. Should they choose not
218 to enter the Singles stake, their entry fees shall be refunded. Spayed,
219 monorchid, cryptorchid, and neutered hounds without breed
220 disqualifications may be entered in regular competition.

221 **Motion adopted.**

222 Richard Whritenour moved to reject modifications to *Chapter II, Officials,*
223 *Section 1.* After debate, **motion lost.** The **motion** to accept the
224 modifications to *Chapter II, Officials, Section 1,* as shown...

225 **Section 1. Field Trial Secretary** (~~must~~ should be a member of the
226 host club)

227 ...was **adopted** by unanimous consent.

228 Rich Whritenour moved to accept the modifications to *Chapter II, Officials,*
229 *Section 1 #6,* as shown:

230 **Section 1. #6** The Field Field Trial Secretary may decline any entries for
231 cause for a period limited to 12 months from the first refusal of entry
232 for cause, but in each instance the Field Trial Secretary shall file good
233 and sufficient reasons for so doing, along with the current mailing
234 address and e-mail address of the affected owner, with the
235 Corresponding Secretary of the ASFA. The Corresponding Secretary
236 will forward a copy of the letter to the affected individual by e-mail and
237 by certified mail.

238 After debate, **motion adopted.**

239 Tom Cigolle moved to accept the modifications to *Chapter II, Officials,*
240 *Section 3 #3,* as shown:

241 **Section 3. #3.** It is strongly recommended that, whenever possible, a
242 field clerk be placed on the field to collect paperwork. The prompt
243 collection after each course allows the field clerk to check for the
244 judge's signature, ~~correct additions~~ verify that the judge's scores are
245 added correctly, and promotes a smoother flow of paperwork.

246 **Motion adopted.**

247 Gary Roush moved to accept the modifications to *Chapter II, Officials,*
248 *Section 7, The Field Committee, #1,* as shown:

249 **Section 7, The Field Committee. #1** The field committee will make
250 every attempt to conduct the trial in accordance with what is published
251 in the premium list. Changes may only be made out of necessity, not
252 convenience. This includes the field committee and their assignments,
253 judges, lure operators, and course plan. Such changes shall be posted
254 at the trial site.

255 **Motion adopted.**

256 Tom Cigolle moved to accept to the modifications to *Chapter IV, Scheduling*
257 *the Meet, Section 1 #1,* as shown:

258 **Section 1. #1.** An approved date must be obtained for a lure field
259 trial. The requesting club must be sanctioned by the American
260 Sighthound Field Association. Applications for dates must be submitted

261 ~~in writing~~ to the Scheduling Committee either by use of the date
262 request form or the on-line date request at www.asfa.org; such
263 applications must be submitted by the Field Trial Secretary or an
264 authorized member of the host club at least 45 days prior to the date
265 requested.

266 After debate, **motion adopted.**

267 Tom Cigolle moved to accept the modifications to *Chapter IV, Scheduling the*
268 *Meet, Section 3*, as shown:

269 **Section 3.** ~~Two~~ One sample ~~copies~~ copy of the premium list and entry
270 form must be sent to the Scheduling Committee Chair no less than 45
271 days prior to the approved date. A Field Trial Secretary may not ~~mail~~
272 ~~out~~ publish or distribute the premium list until such time as it has been
273 approved ~~for mailing~~ by the Scheduling Committee Chair.

274 **Motion adopted.**

275 Tom Cigolle moved to accept the modifications to *Chapter IV, Scheduling the*
276 *Meet, Section 8, 3(t), 4(e), and 5(e)*, as shown:

277 3. The following items must appear within the premium list, in
278 approximately the order indicated (only minor deviations from the
279 indicated order will be approved):

280 ~~(t) Return address and directions to the site.~~ Address to which entries
281 should be mailed.

282 (u) Directions to the trial site.

283 4. It is highly recommended that the following information be included
284 in the premium list mailing.

285 ~~(e) Return address and/or directions to the trial site.~~

286 5. Optional information may be included in premium lists, so long as it
287 is consistent with these running rules and is pertinent to the trial(s).
288 The following items are specifically allowed:

289 ~~(e) Return address and/or directions to the trial site.~~

290 ~~(f)~~ (e) Reasonable health restrictions.

291 After debate, **motion adopted.**

292 Rich Whritenour moved to accept the modifications to *Chapter V, Running*
293 *the Meet, Section 2*, as shown:

294 **Section 2.** Except for national breed specialties, any entry limits shall
295 be restricted to limitations in overall number of hound entries accepted

296 at a trial. National breed clubs may choose, in addition, to require that
297 any hound entered in a national breed specialty must have earned 20
298 ASFA points, or equivalent points in its country of residence, or must
299 be a Field Champion of Record. If a national breed club chooses to
300 impose such a requirement, proof of non-ASFA title and non-ASFA
301 points for hounds should be in the form of a photocopy of the
302 certificate, or page of formal ~~printing~~ publication and included with the
303 entry.

304 **Motion adopted.**

305 Rich Whritenour moved to accept the modifications to *Chapter V, Running*
306 *the Meet, Section 13 (c)*, as shown:

307 (c) Bench stake: for hounds of any individual breed; an entry shall
308 consist of a single hound with proof on file with the ASFA of a
309 conformation champion title from the AKC, CKC or both or a
310 conformation grand champion title from the UKC.

311 In all non-regular stakes there will be only one winner per breed with
312 no championship points awarded. Hounds entered in the Singles stake
313 are not eligible to enter non-regular stakes.

314 After debate, **motion adopted.**

315 Rich Whritenour moved to accept the modifications to *Chapter VI, Records &*
316 *Fees Forwarded to the ASFA, Section 1 (b)*, as shown:

317 **Section 1 (b).** Names ~~and complete addresses~~ of all judges and their
318 city and state of residence and the complete mailing address of the
319 Field Trial Secretary.

320 After debate, **motion adopted.**

321 Rich Whritenour moved to accept the modifications to *Chapter XI, Licensing*
322 *of Judges, Licensing for Additional Breeds, Sections 5 and 10*, as shown:

323 **Section 5:** Any judge regularly licensed in at least three breeds may
324 seek an additional breed by meeting the following requirements; so
325 long as those requirements are met, Singles stake shall also count as
326 an additional breed.

327 (a) Judge provisionally the breed or Singles stake for which the
328 license is sought at no less than three trials with three different
329 licensed judges. (Judging five hounds per breed is a
330 requirement for the first three breeds only and does not apply to
331 any breeds thereafter, or to Singles stake.)

332 **Section 10.** Provisional judges may judge ~~Singles and~~ Limited stake
333 stakes, however, the assignments shall not count toward fulfilling their
334 licensing requirements.

335 During debate, the delegate for O.K.I. Gazehound Organization, Carol
336 Chittum, arrived at the meeting. After debate, **motion adopted** by counted
337 vote, 37 ayes and 22 noes.

338 Gary Roush moved to accept the modifications to *Appendix, Revising the*
339 *Running Rules, Section 9*, as shown:

340 **Section 9.** A proposal that has received a favorable vote at the Annual
341 Convention of Delegates shall be considered a change to the Running
342 Rules and Field Procedures for Lure Field Trials. Such proposals shall
343 be posted on the ASFA website, and any other method of publication
344 as approved by the Board of Directors and shall go into effect ~~January~~
345 ± on October 1 following the ACoD ratification.

346 After debate, **motion lost.**

347 Tom Cigolle moved to combine the proposals 14 and 15 from the Rules
348 Evaluation Committee; motion adopted.

349 Tom Cigolle moved to accept the modifications proposed as shown:

350 The phrase Field Secretary appears in many places in the Running
351 Rules, rather than the more appropriate Field Trial Secretary. REC is
352 requesting permission to do a global search of the Running Rules, and
353 replace Field Secretary or field trial secretary with Field Trial Secretary
354 wherever it appears.

355 The phrasing or wording for Singles stake appears several different
356 ways; Singles, Singles Stakes and Singles Stake. Capitalization of this
357 phrase also varies. REC is requesting to do a global search of the
358 Running Rules, and replace the varying phrases with Singles stake
359 wherever it appears.

360 **Motion adopted.**

361 Elections were conducted for officers.

362 By ballot, Jeff Lipps was elected to the office of President.

363 By ballot, Phil Fullam was elected to the office of First Vice President.

364 The delegate from the Mason Dixon Ibizan Hound Club, Kathy Sanders,
365 nominated Rick Wolpin for the office of Second Vice President, and Rick
366 Wolpin accepted the nomination.

367 By ballot, Rick Wolpin was elected to the office of Second Vice President.

368 Tom Cigolle moved that the remaining officers be elected by acclamation.
369 Motion adopted. Consequently, Joe Shoemaker was elected to the office of
370 Recording Secretary; Sally MacDowell was elected to the office of
371 Corresponding Secretary; and Gary Roush was elected to the office of Chief
372 Financial Officer.

373 Vickie Jacobs presented the reports of the ACoD Site Selection Committee
374 and. Please refer to the attachment.

375 Vickie Jacobs presented the report of the ACoD Planning Committee. Please
376 refer to the attachment.

377 Vickie Jacobs presented the report of the Advisory Committee on Animal
378 Issues. Please refer to the attachment.

379 Gary Roush presented the Gary Forrester Award to Tom Cigolle.

380 Dean Wright presented the report of the Lure Coursing Hall of Fame
381 Committee. Please refer to the attachment.

382 The delegate from the Southern Oregon Racing and Coursing Association,
383 Ann Chamberlain, nominated Nancy King Aiken for the Lure Coursing Hall of
384 Fame. Gary Roush moved that Nancy King Aiken be elected to the Lure
385 Coursing Hall of Fame. **Motion adopted.**

386 Rich Whritenour moved to update the **Eligibility** section of the Regional
387 Invitational Policy by modifying the first sentence and adding a second
388 sentence to read:

389 *Any sighthound that is ASFA pointed, or is pointed in its country of*
390 *residence, or is AKC pointed in lure coursing is eligible to enter a*
391 *Regional Invitational in an appropriate stake, including Single Stake, if*
392 *offered. Proof of non-ASFA points for hounds should be in the form of*
393 *a photocopy of the certificate, or a page of formal printing, included*
394 *with the entry.*

395 After debate, **motion adopted.**

396 Bob Jordan made a motion to instruct the Policy Compilation Committee.
397 After amendment and debate, the **motion** that the Board of Directors direct
398 the Policy Compilation Committee to craft a policy that will close the loop
399 hole that allows the gaming of the running rules, whereby one handler holds
400 a hound after the command tally-ho, allowing the other hound to run solo
401 was **adopted.**

402 Bob Jordan moved that the Board of Directors rescind the modifications to
403 policy O-MEM01 so that it reads:

404 *In addition to Article II, Section 1 and Appendix, requirements for*
405 *membership status are as follows: 1) affiliated with the ASFA for a*
406 *minimum of 2 years (24 months); 2) ten households, 15 individual*
407 *members; 3) must have 2 acceptable trials at least 30 days apart in*
408 *each of the 2 preceding years (12 month periods).*

409 After debate, **motion lost.**

410 Russ Jacobs made a motion on the ACoD minutes. After amendment and
411 debate the **motion** *that each ACoD establish, from its delegates, a Minutes*
412 *Review Committee to review and approve the ACoD minutes within 90 days*
413 *after that ACoD was adopted.*

414 Kathy Lipps made a motion regarding Singles stake and non-regular stakes.
415 After amendment and debate, the **motion** *that the Board of Directors direct*
416 *the Rules Evaluation Committee to allow hounds entered in the Singles stake*
417 *to enter Singles non-regular stakes was adopted.*

418 Dean Wright made a motion on expanding to Canada. After amendment and
419 debate, the **motion** *that the ACoD direct the Field Trial Improvement*
420 *Committee to look into expanding ASFA trials and clubs to Canada and report*
421 *back to the ACoD was adopted.*

422 Brittany Parton moved that the ACoD direct the Field Trial Improvement
423 Committee to examine a mentorship program in which clubs accept and
424 publish volunteer members who can mentor identified amateurs at trials by
425 either having them shadow activities or help release approved hounds. After
426 debate, **motion adopted.**

427 Tom Golcher moved to rescind policy O-MEM01, effectively removing the 30
428 days apart and going with the constitutional requirements. After debate,
429 **motion lost** by counted vote, 17 ayes and 32 noes.

430 Denny Baker restated that Cirneco dell'Etna have a height disqualification.

431 Dean Wright announced that by ballot, Whippet "Cayman", Irish Wolfhound
432 "Eleanor", and Borzoi "Scarlett" were elected to the Lure Coursing Hall of
433 Fame.

434 Jeff Lipps moved to establish the ACoD Minutes Review Committee with chair
435 Ping Pirrung and members Ann Chamberlain, Jeanette Dorsey, LaDonna
436 Lundgren, and Marilyn Standerford. **Motion adopted.**

437 Rich Whritenour moved to establish the ACoD Site Selection Committee with
438 co-chairs Vickie Jacobs and Sean McMichael and members Kathy Sanders and
439 Pat Wieland. **Motion adopted.**

451 Hussey, Leigh Littleton, and Kathy Sanders. **Motion adopted.**

452 Speaking for the Lure Coursing Judges Association, Tom Cigolle announced
453 that Scott Hurlbert was named the Lure Operator of the Year.

538 My belief is that the poor performance was due to a lack of preparation,
539 exacerbated by a busy slate of spring events. Having been through the
540 process and given time to prepare, I expect to meet the deadlines this year,
541 which are 17 April 2016 and 19 May 2016. Both the Board of Directors and
542 the ACoD can assist with that by affording me the courtesy of ensuring that I
543 have the motions correctly in writing prior to a vote. Regardless of the
544 outcome of this year's elections, I plan to update the guidelines for the
545 Recording Secretary after completing both of those minutes.

546 Our parliamentary authority is the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order,
547 Newly Revised, which recommends that an organization's executive board or
548 a committee appointed for the purpose should be authorized to approve the
549 minutes when the next regular business session will not be held within a
550 quarterly time interval or in an organization in which there will be change or
551 replacement of a portion of the membership (refer to RONR (11th ed.), p. 474
552 ll. 31-35 and p. 475, ll. 1-7). The intent is that minutes should not languish
553 unapproved for a long period of time, particularly when the approving body

554 (e.g., the 2017 ACoD) could be substantially different in its membership (i.e.,
555 delegates) from the body that conducted the business (e.g., the 2016 ACoD).
556 Consequently, I would suggest that each ACoD appoint a committee for the
557 purpose of approving the minutes of that ACoD after those minutes have
558 been recommended for approval by the MRC.

559 Similarly, I hope that the Board of Directors will reconsider their current
560 custom and allow the minutes of the regular Board of Directors meeting to be
561 submitted to the on-line meeting for approval, after those minutes have been
562 recommended for approval by the MRC.

563 **Regional Director Reports**

564 **Report from the Regional Directors and Invitationals Committee**

565 *Dean Wright, Chair*

566 I would like to thank the members of this committee for their hard work in
567 their Region and for each person's contributions to this committee: Jim
568 Anthony, Lori Silvestri, Ben Brodeur, Kent Standerford, Rick Wolpin, Tom
569 Golcher, Greg Breitbach, Gary Runyan and our newest addition Karen
570 Sanders. We had several conference calls with an average 80% attendance,
571 accomplishing a great deal in those meetings.

572 2015 saw an RD resign and a replacement elected. Three regions did not
573 host a Regional, which we hope to change in 2016. We continued refining the
574 II and the Regional Invitational policies. We also worked on individual items
575 brought to us by Regional Directors. There were only three items brought to
576 the executive committee. We completed the items that were assigned to us

- 614 4. Develop a plan to accomplish goals and assign tasks to committee
615 members
- 616 5. Develop a schedule for the Regional Invitationals so that Regionals do
617 not overlap in adjacent regions.

640 *01/15/15*

- 641 1. To serve, discuss and vote on any items referred to the executive
642 committee.
643 2. To keep the Regional Directors informed and receive feedback from
644 Regional Directors on the items referred to the executive committee.

645 **Invitational Committee Chair Guidelines**

- 646 1. Solicit and keep everyone up to date on Regional Invitationals
647 scheduled so as to not duplicate dates in two adjacent regions.
648 2. Handle any items assigned to us by the ASFA Board of Directors or the
649 ACOD within three months after the ACOD and Board Meeting.
650 3. Discuss any items referred by RDs after their Regional or the II and
651 make recommendations for changes to the policies or guidelines to
652 correct.

653 **Proposed Changes to the Regional Invitational Policy**
654 Regional Invitational Policy (Operational Policy O-INVIT03)

655 (As approved by the Board of Directors, March 2015) *updated with board*
656 *changes, January 2016 and March 2016*

657 The chair of the Invitationals Committee shall submit a copy of this current
658 Regional Invitational Policy to the Internet Liaison for publication on the ASFA
659 website.

660 Each year the ASFA will sanction a series of lure field trials, the purpose of
661 which shall be to promote and further test those hounds that have attained a
662 certain number of points toward their ASFA Field Championship, and those
663 hounds that are ASFA Field Champions or Lure Coursers of Merit of record.

664 These lure field trials consist of a series of Regional Invitationals, held in the
665 various ASFA regions.

666 **Requesting permission.** The club submits a request to its Regional Director
667 at least 4 months prior to the proposed date. This request should include:

- 668 • Name of the club
- 669 • Proposed date or dates
- 670 • Location of trial and description of grounds
- 671 • Entry fee
- 672 • Additional activities (if any)

673 **Date or Dates.** A date that has already been approved by the Scheduling
674 Chairman for a trial in that region, or is a priority date in effect for a club,
675 cannot be used unless the club holding the date notifies Scheduling, in
676 writing, that it will relinquish the date for the Regional Invitational. The club
677 relinquishing the date would retain priority for the following year. After a
678 date has been approved for the Regional Invitational, no other trial shall be
679 held in the region on the same date.

680 A Regional Invitational may be held any time from January to December, but
681 there shall be only one weekend each year in each region. On that weekend,
682 the club may host either a one-day or a two-day Regional Invitational, upon
683 the approval of the RD.

684 **Entry limits.** There shall be no entry limits without prior approval from the
685 Regional Director.

686 **Location and grounds.** The trial must be held within the regional
687 boundaries. The grounds must be adequate to accommodate a large trial for
688 the region. Course lengths must be within rule specifications (500 yards or
689 more), but a length in excess of 750 yards is recommended. The grass must
690 be a length that allows the lure operator clear visibility of the lure.
691 Consideration should also be given to accessibility, lodging, refreshments and
692 restroom facilities.

693 **Entry fees.** Will be set by the host club and may have a higher fee for late
694 entries.

695 **Additional Activities.** Activities such as banquets, seminars, dog shows,
696 awards, etc., (if offered) should be listed in the premium.

697 **Eligibility.** Any hound that is ASFA pointed, or is pointed in its country of
698 residence, or is AKC pointed is eligible to enter a Regional Invitational in an
699 appropriate stake, including Single Stake, if offered. Proof of non-ASFA
700 points for hounds should be in the form of a photocopy of the certificate, or a

701 **page of formal printing, included with the entry.** For a Limited breed to be
702 eligible, the entry must have one first placement, or two second placements,
703 with competition in the Limited Stake. For a Limited or Provisional breed to
704 be eligible, the hound must have received a placement with competition. All
705 points or placements must be earned by the closing date of the event. An
706 eligible hound may be entered in any number of Regional Invitationals.
707 Hounds entered in the Single Stake are not eligible to be entered in Breeder,
708 Kennel, or Bench stakes.

709 *Rational: This will make the eligibility for the Regional Invitational consistent*
710 *with the eligibility for the International Invitational. The regional will be*
711 *pointed but the International Invitational says equivalent points or an AKC*
712 *Field Champion.*

713 **ASFA Website.** One page will be available on the ASFA website for
714 announcing and providing the premium for each Regional Invitational,
715 provided the host club(s) submits ad copy to the Internet Liaison
716 (webmaster@asfa.org). The date of the "current" Regional Invitational can
717 be announced on this page as soon as the date is approved by Scheduling for
718 the next year. The page will remain available after the trial to post results
719 and pictures. Again these must be provided by the host club(s) to the
720 Internet Liaison. The article and photos of each Best of Breed and Best in
721 Regional Invitational should be submitted as soon as possible after the trial.
722 There is no charge to the host club(s) for this page. All reported content
723 added to this page will be submitted to webmaster@asfa.org by a single
724 representative of the Regional Invitational Field Committee.

725 The host club(s) may also circulate the premium list (upon scheduling's
726 approval) by submitting a copy of the premium list to
727 asfa.premiums@gmail.com within the deadlines to ensure timely distribution.

728 **Per capita fees to ASFA.** The Regional per capita fee is published on the
729 ASFA website. This fee will be forwarded to the Records Coordinator with the
730 trial results. The per capita fee for each Bench, Breeder/Kennel stake entry,
731 if offered, will be forwarded to the Records Coordinator with the trial results.
732 Copies of the Bench stake, Breeder stake and/or Kennel stake entry, if
733 offered, will accompany the records.

734 **Rosettes and Trophies.** ASFA provides rosettes for all placements and
735 ASFA medallions for the High Scoring Single and each Best of Breed winner.
736 The host club must request these from the Regional Director at least 25 days
737 before the trial. The host club may offer additional trophies at the club's own
738 expense or through donations. The Best of Breed rosettes shall be 15 inches
739 in length. The winners of the Bench, Breeder, and Kennel stakes, if offered,

740 shall receive rosettes. All unused ribbons and medallions will be returned to
741 the Awards Chair within 14 days after the trial.

742 **General.** The premium list shall include both the host club's and ASFA's
743 Officers and Board Members. Judges must be regularly licensed for the
744 breeds that they judge. Equipment provided by the host club should be
745 adequate to handle a large entry for the region. A veterinarian should be on
746 call or at the trial site.

747 Each year, the Regional Director will review all proposals received from clubs
748 requesting to host a Regional Invitational. Once a decision is made, the
749 Regional Director shall notify, in writing, the Scheduling Chairman and each
750 club that submitted a proposal.

751 All additional requirements and exceptions to the ASFA rulebook relating to
752 Regional Invitationals are noted; all ASFA rules and policies shall apply to
753 Regional Invitationals.

754 The ASFA Board of Directors must approve exceptions to any of these
755 invitational policies. Consult the ASFA Corresponding Secretary or your
756 Regional Director for more information.

757 **Regional Invitationals Policies Review.** The Invitationals Committee shall
758 review the Regional Invitational Policies on an annual basis. The review is
759 **not** intended to be a re-write of the policies, but rather a time to address
760 issues that may have come up during the most recent Regional Invitationals,
761 and edit appropriately for Policy and Rulebook changes.

- 762 1. The timing of the annual reviews:
- 763 a. Regional Invitational review shall begin no later than 90 days
764 after the running of the first Regional of the current year's
765 Regional Invitationals.
- 766 2. The process that should be followed:
- 767 a. Issues that cause concern or problems are given to the
768 Invitational Committee Chairman by clubs, exhibitors, or anyone
769 with first-hand knowledge of the issues.
- 770 b. The chair shall present the issues to the committee members
771 and will establish a timetable and process for discussion and
772 formulation of a resolution. Modifications or changes must be
773 approved by a simple majority vote of committee members.
- 774 c. At the completion, the resolution will be made into a motion and
775 submitted to the ASFA Board of Directors at its next face to face
776 Board meeting in accord with standard Board of Directors
777 procedures. Unless the Invitationals committee deems it
778 necessary to move it forward on the electronic meeting forum.

779 d. If the Board of Directors passes the motion, the results will be
780 disseminated through normal ASFA channels.

781 **Report from Region 2**

782 *Rick Wolpin, Director*

783 There were 7 trials held in 2015 for Region 2. We did not have a Regional
784 Invitational again this past year. My home club (SWC) has been in disarray
785 for the past few years but would like to put on a regional event this year. We
786 will have to see if we can get the support from within the club.

787 There are quite a number of challenges facing us in 2016.

788 AKC events have been gaining in popularity in Northern California. One of the
789 main reasons is monetary. For example, one of the clubs in our region that
790 always holds ASFA trials in February is now doing only AKC. In my
791 communication with them, they indicated that they earn around \$400.00 for
792 an ASFA trial, while earning over \$1,000.00 for an AKC trial. These are
793 difficult numbers to overcome.

794 One of the other challenges has been the ongoing drought in California. Many
795 of the fields that we are accustomed to using, have either fallen upon
796 disrepair, or no longer allow canine events. The drought is forcing many
797 municipalities to reduce or even eliminate watering the grass at public parks
798 and schools. I have been visiting schools, parks, and open space areas to see
799 if any of the fields will meet our needs. When I do find a location that may
800 work, the Owners (School Districts, Park Districts, or Municipalities) tend to
801 not allow a canine event. And those that will allow us to run, want too much
802 money for the weekend to allow a trial to break even, let alone make a
803 profit. We have received a significant amount of rain this winter due to the El
804 Niño, but more than likely it is not going to end the drought.

805 Many of our clubs have stopped running trials due to age issues (both human
806 & canine). One of the Principals of the Pharaoh Club had several hounds that
807 were strong runners. One of them passed away while the other is over 12
808 years old. Although he has younger pups, they have not taken to coursing as
809 of yet. The same is true with my own hounds.

810 It is my goal to try and increase the number of trials scheduled for 2016 and
811 to hold a Regional Invitational. If I can find a decent field to run on, I am
812 confident I can make it happen. The demand for coursing is still here, and
813 many of the members will be anxious to attend the ones that are held.

863 Good morning,

864 We hope you are enjoying the local culture on this small planet!

865 Thank for everyone that has stepped up to keep this sport alive.

866 Last year our region increased by 40 entries and gained new clubs to ASFA
867 ranks.

868 We managed to hold the regional for 2015 in central Texas and plans are
869 moving forward to our 2016 event.

870 To add to the choices of places to gain the last points of the year, the CDECA
871 invites everyone to Waller, TX. End of year old School trial. Gary Newton is
872 providing a field breakfast.

873 In closing thanks for your time.

874 **Report from Region 5**

875 *Kent Standerford, Director*

876 Another year of ASFA coursing has passed in Region 5 with not a lot of
877 changes this past year. As with everywhere else in the country, we're
878 having challenges keeping our entries coming in at the levels we'd like to
879 see. I am happy to say that one of our longstanding clubs has seen a
880 resurgence in membership and are enthusiastically working toward an active
881 year after hosting our Regional Invitational in September last fall. Iowa
882 Coursing Association held a wonderful trial of around 50 hounds with the
883 whippet Relish, Tadita N Tru-Luv's Enjoying The Ride, FCh winning Best in
884 Field on a very challenging course.

885 This year's Regional Invitational will be hosted by Heartland Coursing
886 Association over Memorial Day weekend in Lawrence, KS. We'd love to
887 welcome all of you at the wonderful fields at Clinton Lake State Park.

888 This year is truly a full one for our region. Nebraska Coursing Association will
889 be host for the 2016 International Invitational to be held at the National
890 Balloon Classic Fields again for the first time in 12 years. If you haven't had
891 the good fortune to have coursed on those fields, try to make time to come
892 to Indianola, IA October 22 & 23 for three courses in the rolling hills of Iowa.

893 From Duluth, MN in July to Missouri and Kansas in the spring and fall, folks
894 from across the country are welcome to course with us in Region 5.

895 **Report from Region 6**
896 *Greg Breitbach, Director*

897 The clubs of Region VI held their own last year. There was not any
898 noticeable dip in entries. Our total entry was assisted by the Whippet
899 National being held in Wisconsin.

900 COACH hosted the Region VI Invitational. They had 54 entries. Ridgeback
901 Zoli won BIF.

902 LARK will be hosting the Region VI Invitational this year on September 24 in
903 Ohio.

904 For Region VI, there were a total of 10 clubs hosting 40 trials, up from 32
905 trials the previous year with a total entry of 1,913 participants up from 1,863
906 the previous year.

907 We have 12 member clubs and 1 affiliate in the region. We lost Bluegrass
908 due to lack of paying dues, and in 2016 will lose Great Lakes Irish Wolfhound
909 Club due to lack of interest by members and lack of entries from other areas.
910 We have a group of people in Kentucky starting a new club to replace
911 Bluegrass.

912 Most clubs host two weekends of trials so there is no shortage of trials during
913 spring, summer, and fall. There are a few clubs with limited membership and
914 are starting to share weekends to maintain active status. Some clubs also
915 provide AKC trials or have moved to hosting AKC trials only.

916 I find that the clubs in this region are all well organized and efficient with
917 paperwork and running the trial in efficient manners. There were no rules
918 violations and no one had complaints. Most clubs have enough volunteers to

919 run the events and provide lunch for judges and workers. The trials are
920 relaxed and fun to attend.

921 The item of note from the region is that the trial workers and entrants are
922 consistent. This indicates a lack of influx of new people into the sport.

923 The biggest problem for the region is lack of really good coursing fields.
924 Some clubs have been at the same locations and use the same course plans
925 where experienced dogs are no longer coursing but guessing which plan is
926 being used. Need some way for clubs to get out of comfort zones and look
927 for new fields.

928 **Report from Region 7**

929 *Jim Anthony, Director*

930 2015 was a great year for region 7. 14 clubs held 46 trials and ran 1618
931 dogs. An affiliate club moved up to be a member club (SSRRC). GCHC in
932 Mobile, Alabama come on board as a new club—now we have coursing in
933 Alabama. We ran many seminars and have seen a rise in help for the clubs
934 (Judging, Lure Ops, Field trial secretaries, Huntmaster and Roll call).

935 In 2016, I plan to run more training seminars and increase entries by good
936 communications. Our regional is all set for the end of March and region 7 has
937 run 10 trials so far this year.

938 **Report from Region 8**

939 *Dean Wright, Director*

940 Region 8 is alive and well.

941 Continuing to Rock N Roll in 2016.

942 I would like to thank the region 8 clubs for their dedication to ASFA in 2015.
943 Region 8 consists of 14 clubs, 11 member clubs, 3 affiliate, and 2 parent
944 clubs. We held forty-two ASFA trials with a total entry of 1547 hounds, which
945 were down from 1837 in 2014. Our very successful 2-day regional was held
946 in October by the joint efforts of CHAMP and DASH. The number 3 club in the
947 country for entries came from Region 8, Upper Chesapeake Bay Saluki Club
948 with a total entry of 445. Region 8 had 5 basenjjs in the TOP 5 of ASFA with
949 8 of the top 10 Basenjjs coming from Region 8. 19 Region 8 hounds were in
950 the Top 10 of ASFA and 36 Region 8 hounds were in the ASFA top 20. A
951 whippet from region 8 received Top honors in heavy competition going down
952 to the end of the year.

953 On January 31st we held our 38th annual Regional meeting with 19 in
954 attendance representing 10 clubs.

956 photos, the history of our region, a brag section and much, much more.

957 My goals for Region 8 in 2016 are:

- 958 • *Have and entry of 80 at our Regional Invitational.*
- 959 • *Have an increase of 10% in entries in 2016.*

960 **Report from Region 9**

961 *Ben Brodeur, Director*

962 Region 9 includes, New York, Connecticut, Massachusetts, Rhodes Island,
963 New Hampshire, Vermont & Maine with 5 member and 1 affiliate clubs
964 bordering Region 6 & 8.

965 At the 2015 ACoD, I was appointed for a 2-year term as the ASFA Region 9
966 Director. During the 2015 coursing season I contacted Cathy Sanderson and
967 Jeanie Martin of LCLC in Western NY and asked them if they would consider
968 hosting the 2015 Region 9 Invitational. They brought it up to their
969 membership and agreed to host a two-day Regional in September which was
970 quite successful in spite of the monsoon rains. GONE also held an additional
971 trial in November and are hoping to continue doing so. As an RD, I
972 participated in conference calls initiated by RD Chair Dean Wright etc.

973 During the coursing season, I made it a point to attend at least 1 scheduled
974 trial per club and mentioned that I'm willing to assist them in any way
975 possible. Unfortunately, one of the most difficult challenges for 2015 was that
976 2 of the Region 9 Clubs were having leadership problems (with one of them
977 not being satisfied with the lack of a response in a timely manner concerning
978 the last minute 2014 West Coast ASFA Trial Breed Specialty scheduling
979 inquiry which left them with a sour note) and so they did not hold any ASFA
980 trials. After an extended discussion with Rich & Denise we decided to cancel
981 CLASS's September trial due to the lack of helpers. As I mentioned at last
982 year's ACoD one major concern is the lack of participants getting involved at
983 trials and it seems that no matter which trial you attend it's the same story /
984 worker bees which led to contacting Club Presidents to ask their membership
985 for suggestions as to how we can improve ASFA.

986 As to my goals for 2016, last October I contacted Denise Como and Rich
987 Whritenour and they agreed with CLASS hosting the 2016 ASFA Regional 9 at
988 their September Trial which has already been approved by the Scheduling

989 Chair. I will continue to work with my Region 9 Clubs with the hope of
990 bringing the 2 clubs in question back into the fold. Club members always
991 bring up the fact that they would like to have new judges, but unfortunately
992 most of the time it's cost prohibitive for a club to do so, which leads to, is
993 there a way that ASFA can assist in defraying such cost?

994 In 2015, Region 9 held 15 trials with 3 clubs participating for a total entry of
995 616 (2014 entries / 4 clubs were 527) or 6% of ASFA's total entry of 9235.
996 Trials held per club: CLASS 4 trials / 1 canceled, GONE added a weekend for
997 a total of 7, LCLC 4 trials including their 1st Regional, NERRC & PHONE none.

998 Looking forward to seeing everyone at the 2016 ACoD.

999 **Report from Region 10**

1000 *Lori Silvestri, Director*

1001 Region 10 covers the state of California south from the northern boundaries
1002 of San Luis Obispo, Kern and San Bernardino counties, Arizona, Hawaii, and
1003 Nevada south of Highway 6.

1004 2015 was a tough year for ASFA Region 10, starting in mid-January with a
1005 letter of complaint from a club in another region being poorly handled by the
1006 ASFA executive board who chose to not contact anyone who could provide
1007 relevant facts, including me as the Regional Director, the club in question or
1008 any individuals who participated in the trial written about. This lack of
1009 communication resulted in a misguided letter of reprimand being sent to a
1010 hard-working, productive and ethical minded club and individual in Region
1011 10, making allegations which documentation proved to be false. As the
1012 subject of this poorly handled political issue was a well-liked, motivational
1013 and core worker who has helped most if not all of the clubs in this region in a
1014 variety of ways for many years, the end result was understandably and
1015 regrettably the loss of a couple more ASFA clubs in region 10 who lost faith
1016 in the ASFA and chose to host AKC trials instead. Last year, I worked with a
1017 couple of members of the ASFA Board to draft a proposed policy that if
1018 approved should help us as an organization to avoid this type of mistake in
1019 the future, in any region.

1020 Region 10 is currently facing a number of challenges, including not only a
1021 large decline in number of ASFA clubs (who have mostly chosen to only host
1022 AKC clubs from now on), but also a loss of available fields due to drought and
1023 other challenges.

1024 Region 10 currently has 1 all-breed member club, 1 National Breed Club, and
1025 2 Affiliate clubs. Central Coast Association of Sighthounds (CCASH) in Paso

1026 Robles, CA, completed the one year 'Fast Track' Affiliation and became an
1027 Affiliated club on January 1st, 2016. The Central Coast generally has mild
1028 weather all year, and is at the northernmost boundary of region 10, thus
1029 supporting entries from both region 10 and region 2 where there have not
1030 been many recent trials.

1031 Region 10's season is already under way. By this publication, CCA has
1032 already held their first 4 trials of the year. CCA hosted 22 trials in 2015;
1033 their entries per trial, however, were small due to only hosting Specialty
1034 trials in the past few years. CCA's impact on ASFA is actually greater than
1035 would be predicted by their numbers, since they actively train trial officials
1036 and support other clubs as needed. Region 10's newest club, CCASH, hosted
1037 their first three trials in 2015 with a total of 85 entries.

1038 This year, I will continue working to improve communication in the region
1039 and to encourage individuals and clubs to embrace and/or rekindle their
1040 enthusiasm for the sport of lure coursing. I will be working with each club in
1041 the region to address their unique challenges. I believe greater
1042 communication will get us far in achieving our common goals.

1043 **Report from the Rosettes and Medallions Committee**

1044 *Evelyn Jones, Chair*

1045 The 2015 Regional Invitations began early with Region 3 holding the first one
1046 of the year in March. Regions 4 & 7 holding the last ones after Thanksgiving.
1047 There were two Regions that did not hold any Regional Invitational, Region
1048 1 and 2.

1049 Region 1 did host the International Invitational. A total of 26 medallions were
1050 sent to be given out to the BOB winners.

1051 At the 2015 ACoD, a total of forty-four plaques were distributed.

1052 Eighteen plaques were handed out for the #1 hound, that ran against
1053 competition, in each breed.

1054 One plaque was handed out to the highest scoring hound of all breeds.

1055 Thirteen plaques were handed out to the Parent Clubs for the #1 member
1056 hound.

1057 Eleven plaques were handed out for BOB to the Parent Clubs holding ASFA
1058 trials at their Specialty.

1059 One plaque was sent BOB to the Greyhound National Specialty.

1097 I'd like to thank the members of the committee: Bill Bowlus-Root, Jeff Lipps,
1098 Rich Whritenour and Rick Wolpin for their work on the committee this year.
1099 It is the goal of the committee to have the edits for the minutes back to the
1100 recording secretary within two weeks of receipt.

1101 The minutes from the March 2015 Board meeting were received on the 9th of
1102 July with corrections sent to Joe within two weeks of receipt.

1103 The minutes from the 2015 ACoD were received by the committee on the

1117 I would like to thank everyone for taking the time to update the guidelines
1118 for your office or position. It was really nice when we had the nominating
1119 committee be able to give perspective candidates the guidelines for the

1190 *Josie Haumont, Chair*

1191 I would like to thank my committee Thomas Christ and Russ & Vickie Jacobs.
1192 We've been busy this year and they have all been very helpful and
1193 cooperative. I've been on this committee for 5+ years but they made my first
1194 year as Chair easier.

1195 At the time of this writing we have:

1196 72 Member Clubs
1197 18 Affiliate Clubs
1198 0 Applied Club
1199 4 Fast Track Clubs

1200 The clubs we've worked with this year:

1201 CCASH - Central Coast Association of Sighthounds in Region 10 were Fast
1202 Track and are now an Affiliate Club. They'll be eligible to apply for Member
1203 status in January 2018!

1204 CdECA - Cirneco dell'Etna Club of America in Region 4 applied and have been
1205 approved for Member Status from Affiliate. They've been with the ASFA since
1206 2009.

1207 SWEPT - Silken Windhounds for Endurance, Performance. & Training in
1208 Region 1 were approved for Fast Track in April, had a Fun Trial in June, are
1209 now able to hold ASFA trials and will be eligible to be moved to an Affiliate
1210 club in August of this year.

1211 ORCA - Oklahoma Coursing & Racing Association in Region 4 have been
1212 approved for Applied status. They've had one Fun Trial and have a second
1213 one scheduled for late March. If all goes well they'll be holding ASFA trials by
1214 summer.

- 1215 GCHC - Gulf Coast Hound Club in Region 7 were approved for Fast Track in
1216 May, had a successful Fun Trial in October, are now able to hold ASFA trials,
1217 and will be eligible to be moved to an Affiliate club in November of this year.
- 1218 TSA - Tulsa Sighthound Association were approved by the Board to be moved
1219 to Member status in August. TSA has had a long history with the ASFA and
1220 I'm glad to see them back as a Member club.
- 1221 AHCOA - Afghan Hound Club of Austin in Region 4 was approved for Fast
1222 Track in May, had a successful Fun Trial in June, are now able to hold ASFA
1223 trials, and will be eligible to be moved to an Affiliate club in August of this
1224 year. It's my understanding that this club was previously an ASFA club and
1225 are coming back after many years away.
- 1226 COACH - Central Ohio Area Coursing Hounds in Region 6 has applied for
1227 Member status and is to be discussed and voted on at the board meeting.
- 1228 LVCC - Lehigh Valley Coursing Club had previously stopped holding trials and
1229 has now applied for Fast Track to come back.
- 1230 R4COM - Raisin River Rhodesian Ridgeback Club of Michigan in Region 6 has
1231 applied for Member status and is to be discussed and voted on at the board
1232 meeting.
- 1233 We would like to thank the new clubs coming into ASFA we now have 3 new
1234 clubs eligible to hold trials than we did at this time last year with one more
1235 on the way! I'm also encouraged by the clubs moving from Affiliate to
1236 Member status. That tells me the clubs want to be more active in not only
1237 holding trials but in the organization itself.
- 1238 The committee would like to thank the Regional Directors that completed
1239 Trial Evaluations over the past year. Regional Directors are the eyes and ears
1240 of the ASFA while at field trials in your region. Committees like the
1241 Membership Committee rely on your feedback to base our decisions.
- 1242 We did have a few clubs whose dues lapsed last year which sadly appears to
1243 be a result in many cases of declining entries and fewer available fields. I
1244 have had an inquiry from one of those clubs already thinking about coming
1245 back, with any luck they'll be back soon.
- 1246 Don't forget Dues are due by May 1st. You can print the form and mail it with
1247 the check or you can fill out the online form and pay with PayPal.
- 1248 We have also improved the online process for dues renewal that nearly
1249 nobody but the Membership Chair and the Treasurer even knew was a

1250 problem before. We've worked with the Website Committee and the
1251 Webmaster to not allow an online renewal form to be submitted without a
1252 PayPal purchase and the PayPal purchase is now submitted to the Treasurer
1253 and Membership with all the club information together. Previously the online
1254 form came to Membership and the payment went to the Treasurer, we have
1255 spent a great deal of time trying to get them to match up. The online form
1256 previously could be submitted without payment which created even more
1257 confusion. Thank you to all involved for getting that more streamlined.

1258 Several years ago the previous Membership Chair wanted to digitize the
1259 Membership files. Once he got into it he found it to be a huge project and
1260 wasn't able to complete it. I plan to continue this project, I have created
1261 digital files for all the clubs, every time I get something new in I'm using that
1262 instead of the paper file. If it comes to me as paper, I'm scanning it and
1263 putting it in the digital file and the paper file. Eventually I would like to scan
1264 the paper files. I don't plan to have this completed in 2016.

1265 We have reviewed how our forms are used and have updated a few.

1266 MEM06 Information Regarding ASFA Affiliation – We had a paragraph at the
1267 bottom of the page that assumed the Membership Chair was mailing
1268 information to a club that was inquiring about membership. Since everything
1269 is readily available on the website and some items are no longer in paper
1270 format (rule book), we've given the link and information on where it is on the
1271 website.

1272 MEM02 Application for Membership – We used to ask clubs to list when a trial
1273 they were listing as a trial to be considered as a qualifying trial to become a
1274 member was published in FAN. This way the committee could verify it
1275 quickly. When we did away with FAN it was switched to Website Publication
1276 Date. This was unneeded and has since been removed.

1277 MEM14 Fast Track Affiliation Process – We added the line (e) Submit
1278 Application for Membership status to Membership Chair, renumbered
1279 subsequent lines, and removed the sentence from (c). Clubs were finding the
1280 process unclear on when to submit the application and when to request the
1281 Fun Trial date.

1282 As the chair I'm in the process of updating all of the form letters that we've
1283 used over the years to communicate with the clubs. As I need them I'm
1284 updating them. I've also started to use email mail merge to send mailings for
1285 dues renewal reminders which saves a lot of time and is more efficient.

1286 Looking forward into 2016 the committee plans to continue to review our
1287 forms, procedures, and requirements to update and make them more user
1288 friendly.

1289 **Report from the Scheduling Committee**

1290 *Audrey Silverstein, Chair*

1291 I would like to start my report by saying THANK YOU to Marilyn Standerford
1292 and Denise Como for their patience and tolerance with all my questions!!!
1293 Thank you Ladies!!!

1294 Since taking over Scheduling on May 23, 2015, I have met many people both
1295 online and actually in person. It is nice to put a face with a name and email
1296 address.

1297 This is not a hard job, but it can be time consuming. Most of the people I
1298 have come across have been very nice and tolerant when I tell them to make
1299 changes/corrections to their premium lists. A few have questioned my
1300 directions and that is when I have contacted My Ladies for backup
1301 confirmation!! A few people feel like the world revolves around them and
1302 feel I should drop everything to review their premiums. I must say, I try to
1303 reply within 48 hours.

1304 Last year, or should I say from May 23rd to Dec 31, 2015, 10% of the
1305 premiums I received were late. But I have collected every penny of those
1306 late fees and sent the checks to Sean. Not a bad percentage and the ASFA
1307 made some extra money!! As of this year, only 3 premiums have been late
1308 as of 2/28/16.

1309 I send updates to Marilyn every 3-14 days depending on how many date
1310 requests/changes are sent to me.

1311 I have received many positive comments from the fancy since I have sent
1312 premiums directly to Miss Jean, the webmaster.

1313 **Report from the Records Coordination Committee**

1314 *Lori Coulson, Records Coordinator*

1315 *Provided as a separate document.*

1316 **Report from the Website Committee**

1317 *Marilyn Standerford, Internet Liaison*

1318 **Titles and Top 20**

1319 All reports are submitted to the webmaster in a timely manner within receipt
1320 from Records. We are working on the minimal requirement for reformatting.

1321 **Trial Schedules**

1322 All reports are formatted and submitted to the webmaster in a timely manner
1323 within receipt from Scheduling.

1324 **Membership**

1325 All reports are submitted to the webmaster in a timely manner within receipt
1326 from Membership. I do not re-format these.

1327 **Judges Licensing**

1328 Leigh submits his reports directly to the webmaster. I reformat the Judges
1329 listing to be in two formats for publication on the website. One format is by
1330 State, and one is by Name. If there are other formats required, please let me
1331 know.

1332 **Rulebook**

1333 I have updated the rulebook with current REC and CRC changes provided by
1334 the respective committee chairs, as were effective January 1, 2016.

1335 **Forms, Pages, Links**

1336 I try to go through the website to fix any typos, outdated information, at
1337 least once a year. If you find any corrections/questions, please let me know.

1338 **Contact Us**

1339 There were 53 e-mails to the Webmaster via the website. (This is about the
1340 average number of e-mails.) These were answered in a timely manner. As
1341 has been customary, I forward any e-mails that come to the webmaster that
1342 are not website related to the Corresponding Secretary for an "official"
1343 response.

1344 **Report from the Website Publication Committee**

1345 *Kent Standerford, Chair; Ben Brodeur, Lori Silvestri, Lori Stebritz, and*
1346 *Marilyn Standerford*

1347 The past year has been a challenge to get current records published with the
1348 changes in reports from the records programs. That has taken up a lot of
1349 our Web Designer's time.

1350 This year we worked on updating the look and "ease of use" of the ASFA
1351 website. Our committee mapped out a new site for better flow of
1352 information. The appearance of the new homepage should facilitate mobile
1353 usage and make it easier to find what you are looking for with far fewer
1354 clicks.

1355 While the new look isn't up and "live", much of the site has been redone and
1356 will be available to the Board at the Board of Directors meeting. We are
1357 planning to have the revamped site up and running in the summer.

1358 **Report from the Forms Creation and Distribution Committee**

1359 *Marilyn Standerford, Chair*

1360 Thank you to the member of the Committee—Debb Meyer.

1361 **Status of ASFA Store**

1362 Still functional. Not a lot of activity. We are actively working on the "New
1363 Store site".

1364 **Status of PayPal**

1365 I'd say 99.5% of the sales of ASFA Store products are via PayPal; .5% is
1366 probably "in person" sales—ACoD, trials, II; and physical checks mailed to
1367 me from clubs.

1368 Please be aware that just because you don't have a PayPal account **DOES**
1369 **NOT** mean you cannot check out as a guest using PayPal. You do **NOT** have
1370 to have an account.

1371 If you are purchasing forms—for a rapidly approaching trial—please also send
1372 an e-mail to me letting me know when the trial dates are. I have become the
1373 "villain" in the poor planning on the clubs' part for ordering forms. Truly—not
1374 my fault. Consider checking your forms inventory now, and getting your
1375 order in for your next trial—or for the year.

1376 **Publications**

1377 Guideline to Hosting a Lure Field Trial—needs to be revisited for updates.

1378 This was requested at the 2014 Board meeting. Nothing has been submitted
1379 again this year. With the new rulebook and rule changes, constitution
1380 changes, and policy changes every year, this publication should be updated
1381 on an annual basis by **Field Trial Improvement Committee**. Because of
1382 the constant change and updating that should be occurring, it doesn't pay to
1383 have a high inventory on hand. So **updates** can be implemented very quickly
1384 and there is no waste in money to the ASFA. I currently print these as they
1385 are ordered.

1386 All ASFA forms were updated as of January 1 to reflect changes in ASFA
1387 business—including contact chairmen, and REC/CRC changes.

1388 **REMINDER**

1389 It is the responsibility of the Forms Chair to maintain the official copy of the
1390 ASFA Forms and Publications. That means that if you need to have updates

1391 and changes made to your forms, publications, or any printed matter, you
1392 may send the updates to forms@asfa.org, and I will make the changes for
1393 you.

1394 It is imperative that the official, most up-to-date versions are on file with the
1395 Forms Chair. Go to the website, and download the forms for which your
1396 committee is responsible (or print them from the CD). You may mark it up in
1397 any way you need to and either scan it in and e-mail it to me, or just mail it
1398 to me. You may clearly reference sections in an e-mail... I can follow edits
1399 pretty clearly, if you identify them. I do not provide the Word version of all of
1400 the forms. It is too difficult to maintain the "official" form at that point.

1401 If you are wondering for which forms your committee is responsible, look in
1402 the folder for your committee on the CD. You can look in the specific folder
1403 for your committee and see each of the forms listed in that folder for which
1404 you are responsible. There is a Forms Index indicating where the forms are
1405 located on the CD as well.

1406 When the edits by your committee have been completed, you send them to
1407 me. I will update the forms, return them to you for final approval. Upon the
1408 final approval, I submit it to webmaster and liaison for inclusion on the
1409 website, if appropriate. If there are substantial changes and not updates,
1410 they will have to go to the Board for approval—in the ASFA format.

1411 **ASFA PACKETS**

1412 All we send out in the ASFA packets are the Guidelines to Hound Certification
1413 and the Beginner's Guide to Lure Coursing. **Every club** is entitled to one set
1414 of 25 of each of these publications each year. Honestly, if you are going to
1415 use them, I'll send more. These can be requested via e-mail to
1416 forms@asfa.org or fill out the on-line request at
1417 <http://www.asfa.org/forms/pubs.htm>.

1418 **Report from the Public Relations Committee**

1419 *Rick Wolpin, Chair*

1420 The initial goals for Public Relations Committee for 2015 were:

1421 1. Monitor the Facebook page.

1422 The page currently has 1,137 "likes" and is still increasing. We had
1423 been averaging between 40 and 70 visits per week, but that has
1424 decreased over the last year to 10–20. I plan on promoting the
1425 Facebook page at the ACoD to see if we can get more member clubs to
1426 post.

1427 2. Continue with the incentive awards for the trials and hounds entered.

1428 We will present these awards again at this year's ACoD.

1429 New items:

1430 1. We have put out a poll to see why some of the member clubs are not
1431 attending the ACoD. At the time of this report, we have had responses
1432 from only one of the Regional Directors. I will discuss this with them at
1433 the RD meeting during the ACoD and if it warrants discussion, bring it
1434 up at the board meeting.

1435 2. Dean Wright would like to send out thank you cards to Field
1436 Secretaries and congratulation cards to the winners of the Best in
1437 Field. This will be done at his own expense. The Regional Directors are
1438 in favor of this.

1439 **Report from the Policy Compilation Committee**

1440 *Gary Roush, Chair; Russ Jacobs, Jeff Lipps, Gary Runyan, and Rich*
1441 *Whritenour*

1442 During 2015, the Board adopted the following policies:

1443 1. Operational Policy O-REC17: If there is a judge change after a
1444 premium list has been published, there must be a note to that effect
1445 included with the records sent to the ASFA Records Coordinator.
1446 (03/15)

1447 *This repeats Administrative Rule A-RUL08 in the Operational Policies.*

1448 2. Administrative Policy A-BOD24: Each motion made in the Board's
1449 electronic meeting shall be accompanied by a statement of the
1450 financial impact the motion, if approved, would have on the revenues
1451 and/or expenses of ASFA. (08/15)

1452 *It is important that the Board understand the financial impact of its*
1453 *actions.*

1454 3. Administrative Policy A-SCH08: Unless specifically requested not to do
1455 so by the hosting club, the Scheduling Chair will forward a PDF copy of
1456 each approved premium list to the Webmaster for posting in the Trial
1457 Schedule section on the ASFA website. (08/15)

1458 *This will provide a wider dissemination of premium list to interested*
1459 *participants.*

1460 During 2015, the Board modified the following policies:

1461 1. Administrative Policy A-BOW02: The ASFA will recognize the Bowen
1462 system as official and publish an official Top Twenty each year for each
1463 breed and the Singles Stake. (04/87) A14

1464 *Add "and the Singles Stake to the end of the sentence." This confirms*
1465 *what we are already doing.*

1466 2. Administrative Policy A-MIN02: The Recording Secretary will circulate
1467 draft copies of minutes only to the Minutes Review Committee within
1468 30 days of a Board meeting and 60 days of a Convention. The
1469 Recording Secretary will circulate draft copies of minutes only to the
1470 Minutes Review Committee. In the event that the majority of the MRC
1471 does not agree with the wording in the draft minutes, the MRC shall
1472 draft alternative wording which shall be circulated by the Recording
1473 Secretary with the draft minutes. After final review by the MRC, the
1474 Recording Secretary shall circulate minutes to all members of the
1475 Board and key Chairperson within 3 months of a Board meeting and
1476 within 5 months of a Convention. (01/11) A137

1477 *Replace "key Chairperson" with "all Chairpersons." This provides the*
1478 *minutes to all chairpersons.*

1479 3. Administrative Policy A-MIN05: It is the responsibility of key
1480 Chairpersons and/or employees of the ASFA to review the Board of
1481 Directors and Annual Convention of Delegates minutes to determine
1482 any Board actions that affect their positions and responsibilities.
1483 (04/98) A261

1484 *Delete the word "key" in the first line. This makes it the responsibility*
1485 *of all Chairpersons to review the minutes to identify issues or tasks*
1486 *they need to address.*

1487 4. Administrative Policy A-RCD06: The Records Coordinator will make a
1488 reasonable attempt to follow up on judging changes noted on the trial
1489 results which are submitted without explanation. (11/88) A144

1490 *Add "and notify Judges Licensing of exceptions" to the end of the*
1491 *sentence. This keeps Judges Licensing aware of unexplained judging*
1492 *changes.*

1493 5. Administrative Policy A-RUL03: The Policy Compilation Chairperson
1494 shall prepare current Operational policies to be posted on the ASFA
1495 website. Additional copies are available on the ASFA website. The
1496 Chairperson shall also prepare an update of all policies amended,

1497 adopted, or deleted during the prior calendar year for distribution to
1498 the ACoD. (R01/11) A132

1499 *Delete the second sentence as it is confusing. The policies can be*
1500 *downloaded from the website.*

1501 6. Administrative Policy A-BOD04: Non-attendance at two or more
1502 consecutive Board meetings may be considered dereliction of duty.
1503 (04/90) A121

1504 Grounds for dereliction of duty by a Regional Director include but are
1505 not limited to either or both of the following: a) failure to attend two or
1506 more consecutive annual meetings of the Board of Directors, and b)
1507 failing to submit a ballot, whether Yea, Nay or Abstain, for at least
1508 70% of the motions voted on during online meetings over the course
1509 of the year between annual meetings of the Board of Directors.

1510 *Replace the existing policy (not underlined) with the underlined policy.*
1511 *This more specifically sets forth standards for Regional Directors.*

1512 7. Administrative Policy A-RD08: Whenever possible, the Regional
1513 Director Committee will meet on the first or second day of the Board of
1514 Directors meeting. (04/98) A268

1515 *Adds "or second" after the word "first." This provides flexibility as to*
1516 *the date of the meeting.*

1517 8. Operational Policy O-SCHD06: The 150-mile separation policy applies
1518 to sanctioned all-breed trials and specialty event trials of the same
1519 breeds. One club cannot hold more than one trial on the same day
1520 within a 150-mile radius. (04/94) 49

1521 All breed clubs may exclude a breed from their all-breed trial if, and
1522 only if, the club also holds a specialty trial for that breed on the same
1523 day at the same site, either concurrently or consecutively.

1524 *Adds the underlined sentence to the existing policy. This clarifies that*
1525 *clubs can exclude a breed from their all-breed trial as long as they*
1526 *hold a specialty trial for that breed.*

1527 9. Operational Policy O-REG01: Any hound that is ASFA pointed is eligible
1528 to enter a Regional Invitational in an appropriate stake, including
1529 Singles Stake, if offered. For a Limited or Provisional breed to be
1530 eligible, the hound must have received a placement with competition.
1531 All points and placements must be earned by the closing date of the

1534 Hounds entered in the Singles Stake are not eligible to be entered in

1537 *based upon combining scores from different judge.*

1538 10.Operational Policy O-MEM01: In addition to Article II, Section 1 and
1539 Appendix, requirements for membership status are as follows: 1)
1540 affiliated with the ASFA for a minimum of 2 years (24 months); 2) ten
1541 households, 15 individual members; 3) must have 2 acceptable trials
1542 at least 30 days apart in each of the 2 preceding years (12 month
1543 periods) OR have exhibited a pattern of acceptable trials that, in the
1544 opinion of the Membership Committee and/or the Board, meets the
1545 goals previously set forth in requirement 3.

1546 *This provides some flexibility in evaluating whether the trials held by a*
1547 *club applying for membership show the club's ability to hold acceptable*
1548 *trials over a period of time.*

1549 During 2015, the Board deleted the following policies:

1550 1. Administrative Policy A-FORM04: When PayPal (or a similar service) is
1551 used to pay for ASFA products, a service fee will be added to each
1552 transaction to accommodate the costs associated with the use of the
1553 service. The service fee will be determined by the Chief Financial

1556 2. Administrative Policy A-WEB02: Hound records will be made available
1557 on the ASFA website with only the information that can be cross-
1558 referenced in FAN: Hound's call name, hound's registered, and owner's
1559 name. (04/99) A280

1560 *FAN is no longer published.*

1561 3. Administrative Policy A-RD05: Minutes of each regional meeting shall
1562 be forwarded to the Corresponding Secretary by the Regional Director.
1563 (11/93) A153

1564 *The policy has very rarely been carried out by any Regional Director.*
1565 *Most regional meetings have been held after a field trial and very*
1566 *rarely have a quorum.*

1567 **ASFA Board Changes to International Invitational Policy**

1568 International Invitational (II) Policy (~~Operational Policy 217~~)(O-INVIT02)

1569 (As approved by the Board of Directors, March 2015)

1570 Each year the ASFA will host the International Invitational. The purpose of
1571 which shall be to promote and further test those hounds that have attained a
1572 certain number of points toward their Field Championship and hounds that
1573 have earned the Field Champion or Lure Courser of Merit titles. When hosting
1574 the International Invitational, the ASFA will endeavor to abide by established
1575 regional rotation schedules but reserves the right to locate the event in
1576 alternate geographical areas as the ASFA deems appropriate.

1577 The chair of the Invitationals Committee shall submit a copy of these current
1578 II policies to internet liaison for publication on the ASFA web site.

1579 **Date.** ~~International Invitational priority dates will be the 3rd weekend of the~~
1580 ~~year (January) or the 22nd weekend (end of May or beginning of June)~~
1581 ~~following the AKC Corresponding Date Table, unless the 22nd weekend is~~
1582 ~~Memorial Day weekend. In such cases, the spring date shall be on the 23rd~~
1583 ~~weekend.~~ The International Invitational may be held at any time from
1584 January to December, except that any club with a corresponding priority date
1585 for a trial to be held within 150 miles of the International Invitational site at
1586 the time of scheduling the International Invitational must agree, in writing to
1587 the Scheduling Chairman, to relinquish the date for the holding of the
1588 International Invitational. Any club relinquishing the date would retain
1589 priority for the following year.

1590 Additionally, any club holding a priority date for a trial to be held at a site
1591 more than 150 miles from the International Invitational site in any year
1592 which chooses not to hold that trial on the same dates as the International
1593 Invitational that year would retain priority for that date for the following
1594 year.

1595 No other trial shall be held on the same weekend within 150 miles of the
1596 International Invitational. Both Saturday and Sunday will be reserved for the
1597 event.

- 1612 • the overall economics of the proposed event
- 1613 • appropriate section of the country for that year
- 1614 • the club(s) deemed most likely to co-host the highest quality event
- 1615 • timely receipt of proposal

1616 If, in the opinion of the Invitationals Committee and/or the ASFA Board, no
1617 viable proposal is received from the section with priority by the conclusion of
1618 the ACoD, two calendar years before the year of International Invitational,
1619 any club(s) in the country may submit a proposal to co-host the International
1620 Invitational. This proposal should be submitted by the ACoD one calendar
1621 year before the trial year in question. The co-host club(s) will be chosen with
1622 consideration to the following.

- 1623 • the overall economics of the proposed event
- 1624 • the proposal that appears to be likely to result in the highest quality
1625 event
- 1626 • the region that has hosted an International Invitational least recently
- 1627 • club(s) status (member, longevity, etc.)

1628 When a proposal is submitted to the Invitationals Committee, such proposal
1629 will be provided to the CFO. The CFO will be responsible for reviewing the
1630 overall economics of the proposal and, as appropriate, discuss alternative
1631 terms with the proposing club(s) prior to any submission of the proposal to
1632 the Board.

1633 The Scheduling Chairman, Records Coordinator, Membership Chairman and
1634 the respective Regional Director shall be asked for comments regarding the
1635 potential Cohost club(s) and field committee members before a final decision
1636 is reached. The co-host club(s) will be approved by the Board of Directors,
1637 following the order of preference stated above, no later than December 1st,

1638 two calendar years before the event in question, if possible, and each of the
1639 club(s) submitting a proposal shall be advised of the decision.

1640 If no proposals from club(s) are received by the beginning of the Board
1641 meeting one calendar year prior to the year of the International Invitational

1652 **Club(s) Proposal.** The club(s) submits a proposal to the ASFA
1653 Corresponding Secretary. This proposal should include at a minimum:

- 1655 • Proposed date including appropriate weather and daylight statistics
- 1656 • Approximate location of trial and description of the grounds
- 1657 • Entry fee
- 1658 • Additional activities (if any)
- 1659 • Proposed budget
- 1660 • Financial terms of the co-host arrangement
- 1661 • **Grounds.** The grounds must be adequate to accommodate an entry of
1662 300 or more hounds. Course lengths must be within rule specifications
1663 (500 yards or more), but a length in excess of 750 yards is
1664 recommended. The grass must be a length that allows the lure
1665 operator clear visibility of the lure. Consideration should also be given
1666 to accessibility, lodging, refreshments and restroom facilities. A
1667 description of grounds should include dimensions of running area,
1668 either by yards or acres, and should include aerial photographs of

- 1703 **ASFA Website.** One page will be available on the ASFA website for
1704 announcing and providing the premium for each International Invitational,
1705 provided the co-host club(s) submits ad copy to the Internet Liaison
1706 (webmaster@asfa.org). The date of the "current" II can be announced on
1707 this page as soon as the date is approved by Scheduling for the next year.
1708 The page will remain available after the trial to post results and pictures.
1709 Again these must be provided by the host club(s) to the Internet Liaison. The
1710 article and photos of each Best of Breed, Best in International Invitational
1711 and winner of the Gillette Stake should be submitted as soon as possible
1712 after the trial. There is no charge to the co-host club(s) for this page. All
1713 reported content added to this page will be submitted to
1714 webmaster@asfa.org by a single representative of the II Field Committee.

1715 The co-host club(s) may also circulate the premium list (upon scheduling's
1716 approval) by submitting a copy of the premium list to
1717 asfa.premiums@gmail.com within the deadlines to ensure timely distribution.

1718 **General.** The sample premium list should be ~~mailed~~ submitted to the
1719 Scheduling Chairman and the Regional Director at least 120 days before the
1720 trial and should include both co-club(s)' and ASFA's Officers and Board
1721 Members. The approved premium list shall be distributed to each club(s)
1722 delegate, each judge for the event, and all ASFA Board Members by the FTS
1723 of the co-host club. Judges shall be fully licensed for the breed(s) that they
1724 judge.

1725 Equipment provided by the co-host club(s) should be adequate to handle an
1726 entry of 300 or more hounds per day. The co-host club(s) is encouraged to
1727 recruit lure operators and other members of the field committee and judges

1730 **After the trial.** Within a reasonable time after the International Invitational,

1744 International Invitational are noted; all other ASFA rules and policies shall
1745 apply to International Invitational. The ASFA Board of Directors must
1746 approve exceptions to any of the previously listed invitational policies.

1749 **Rosettes and trophies.** Rosettes will be awarded for all placements

1809 With the ASFA Board's approval, the co-hosting club(s) may award other
1810 rosettes and/or trophies as may be funded from trophy donations. These
1811 trophies shall not be in competition with the approved perpetual trophies
1812 (i.e.: they may be a breed flight winner or highest scoring bench champion
1813 for a particular breed).

1814 The cohost club(s) at each II is responsible for obtaining a completed and
1815 signed II Perpetual Trophy Return Agreement from each individual who takes
1816 possession of a perpetual trophy. (A \$100 fine will be imposed and all points
1817 and placements will be held on all hounds owned by an individual who does
1818 not return an II perpetual trophy). The completed forms shall be forwarded
1819 to the Corresponding Secretary. The co-host club(s) is responsible for
1820 contacting the previous year's winner of each trophy and arranging for the
1821 return of the trophies to be at the II trial site.

1822 **The Gillette Stake.** The Gillette Stake is a premier event held annually at
1823 the International Invitational. This competition is to showcase form and
1824 function in our finest sighthounds and to honor the father of the sport of lure
1825 coursing in America, Lyle Gillette.

- 1826 • **Eligibility.** Entry shall be open to hounds that have achieved all of the
1827 following:
 - 1828 ○ AKC or foreign bench championship, and
 - 1829 ○ ASFA Field Championship, and
 - 1830 ○ 20 or more ASFA points during the 12-month period prior to the
1831 closing date of the International Invitational.
- 1832 • **Entry** Each hound must be entered in either the Field Champion or
1833 Veteran stake on Saturday of the International Invitational. The field
1834 trial secretary must receive a special entry form for the Gillette stake,
1835 and proof of bench championship, by the closing date of regular
1836 entries. There is no additional fee for an entry in this stake.
- 1837 • **Competition** The Gillette stake competition will be run on Saturday,
1838 following the same procedures as a regular Best in Field. The eligible

1849 the perpetual Lyle Gillette Memorial Trophy. An ASFA medallion shall
1850 be awarded for the winner to keep.
- 1851 • **Decisions** The field trial chairman shall be responsible for any and all
1852 decisions regarding this stake, not specifically covered above, unless
1853 the chairman has a hound eligible to compete in this stake. Then, the
1854 field trial secretary shall make all decisions. If the secretary also has a
1855 hound eligible to compete, the field trial committee shall make the

1857 The Invitational Committee shall review the Invitational Policies on an annual
1858 basis. The review is **not** intended to be a re-write of the policies, but rather a

- 1862 a) International Invitational review to begin no later than 90 days after

1889 **Requesting permission.** The club submits a request to its Regional Director
1890 at least 4 months prior to the proposed date. This request should include:

- 1891 • Name of the club
- 1892 • Proposed date or dates
- 1893 • Location of trial and description of grounds
- 1894 • Entry fee
- 1895 • Additional activities (if any)

1896 **Date or Dates.** A date that has already been approved by the Scheduling
1897 Chairman for a trial in that region, or is a priority date in effect for a club,
1898 cannot be used unless the club holding the date notifies Scheduling, in
1899 writing, that it will relinquish the date for the Regional Invitational. The club
1900 relinquishing the date would retain priority for the following year. After a
1901 date has been approved for the Regional Invitational, no other trial shall be

- 1932 **ASFA Website.** One page will be available on the ASFA website for
1933 announcing and providing the premium for each Regional Invitational,
1934 provided the host club(s) submits ad copy to the Internet Liaison
1935 (webmaster@asfa.org). The date of the "current" Regional Invitational can
1936 be announced on this page as soon as the date is approved by Scheduling for
1937 the next year. The page will remain available after the trial to post results
1938 and pictures. Again these must be provided by the host club(s) to the
1939 Internet Liaison. The article and photos of each Best of Breed and Best in
1940 Regional Invitational should be submitted as soon as possible after the trial.
1941 There is no charge to the host club(s) for this page. All reported content
1942 added to this page will be submitted to webmaster@asfa.org by a single
1943 representative of the Regional Invitational Field Committee.
- 1944 The host club(s) may also circulate the premium list (upon scheduling's
1945 approval) by submitting a copy of the premium list to
1946 asfa.premiums@gmail.com within the deadlines to ensure timely distribution.
- 1947 ~~**Per capita fees to ASFA.** A The Regional per capita fee of \$5.00 per hound~~
1948 ~~is published on the ASFA website. This fee will be forwarded to the Records~~
1949 ~~Coordinator with the trial results. A The per capita fee of \$1.00 per for each~~
1950 ~~Bench, Breeder/Kennel stake entry, if offered, will be forwarded to the~~
1951 ~~Records Coordinator with the trial results. Copies of the Bench stake, Breeder~~
1952 ~~stake and/or Kennel stake entry, if offered, will accompany the records.~~
- 1953 **Rosettes and Trophies.** ASFA provides rosettes for all placements and
1954 ASFA medallions for the High Scoring Single and each Best of Breed winner.
1955 The host club must request these from the Regional Director at least ~~60~~ 25
1956 days before the trial. The host club may offer additional trophies at the club's
1957 own expense or through donations. The Best of Breed rosettes ribbons shall
1958 be 15 inches in length. The winners of the Bench, Breeder, and Kennel
1959 stakes, if offered, shall receive rosettes. ~~The Breeder and Kennel stake~~

- 1960 ~~winner's ribbon shall be 15 inches in length. All unused ribbons and~~
1961 ~~medallions will be returned to the Awards Chair within 14 days after the trial.~~
- 1962 **General.** The premium list shall include both the host club's and ASFA's
1963 Officers and Board Members. Judges must be regularly licensed for the
1964 breeds that they judge. Equipment provided by the host club should be
1965 adequate to handle a large entry for the region. A veterinarian should be on
1966 call or at the trial site.
- 1967 Each year, the Regional Director will review all proposals received from clubs
1968 requesting to host a Regional Invitational. Once a decision is made, the
1969 Regional Director shall notify, in writing, the Scheduling Chairman and each
1970 club that submitted a proposal.
- 1971 All additional requirements and exceptions to the ASFA rulebook relating to
1972 Regional Invitationals are noted; all ASFA rules and policies shall apply to
1973 Regional Invitationals.
- 1974 The ASFA Board of Directors must approve exceptions to any of these
1975 invitational policies. Consult the ASFA Corresponding Secretary or your
1976 Regional Director for more information.
- 1977 **Regional Invitationals Policies Review.** The Invitationals Committee shall
1978 review the Regional Invitational Policies on an annual basis. The review is
1979 not intended to be a re-write of the policies, but rather a time to address
1980 issues that may have come up during the most recent Regional Invitationals,
1981 and edit appropriately for Policy and Rulebook changes.
- 1982 3. The timing of the annual reviews:
1983 a. Regional Invitational review shall begin no later than 90 days
1984 after the running of the first Regional of the current year's
1985 Regional Invitationals.
- 1986 4. The process that should be followed:
1987 a. Issues that cause concern or problems are given to the
1988 Invitational Committee Chairman by clubs, exhibitors, or anyone
1989 with first-hand knowledge of the issues.
1990 b. The chair shall present the issues to the committee members
1991 and will establish a timetable and process for discussion and
1992 formulation of a resolution. Modifications or changes must be
1993 approved by a simple majority vote of committee members.
1994 c. At the completion, the resolution will be made into a motion and
1995 submitted to the ASFA Board of Directors in accordance with
1996 standard Board of Directors procedures.
1997 d. If the Board of Directors passes the motion, the results will be
1998 disseminated through normal ASFA channels.

1999 e. The Chair of the Invitationals Committee shall present the
2000 approved changes to the Forms Chair to update the policy and
2001 give to the Internet Liaison for publication on the ASFA website.

2002 **Report from the Judges Committee**

2003 *Greg Breitbach, Chair*

2004 We passed on to REC a proposal to include singles as a breed for provisional
2005 judges after they have completed their first three breeds towards a full
2006 license. We feel this will assist training individuals for judging Best in Field,
2007 and provide potential additional breed for gaining a full judges license.

2008 We also discussed that some exhibitors are not happy with the consistency of
2009 judges utilizing the delay of course penalty on dogs which cannot/will not be
2010 caught and assessing course delay penalties. Some exhibitors feel that dogs
2011 which cannot be caught should not be winning BOB as the end of the course
2012 is as important as the running. We have proposed some wording and sent it
2013 out as a survey to a group of ASFA judges. The time allocated for replies has
2014 expired and we are evaluating the responses which were varied.

2015 In the course of the survey, we found some inconsistency in the list of judges
2016 as posted on the web site and started discussion on how to ensure judges
2017 who have not been active for a period of time and want to restart have not
2018 lost the quality we expect from our judges.

2019 **Report form the Judges Licensing Committee**

2020 *Leigh Littleton, Chair*

2021 License applications have been received and processed promptly, with new
2022 licenses granted as appropriate.

2023 Licensing questions have been answered promptly.

2024 There have been no judging problems needing commentary. The rule
2025 change that passed last year, to simplify our licensing requirements for
2026 people in areas with limited trial entries – does indeed seemed to have
2027 helped, at least a little.

2028 In addition, I am again this year suggesting that the Convention consider the
2029 possibility of making the rules less punitive with respect to a judge who is not
2030 active for a moderate period of time. I have never seen someone “forget”
2031 how to judge. Learning may take a bit of time and experience, but once it’s
2032 learned, it’s learned. The exceptions included in last year’s rule changes
2033 really only apply to unusual cased. SO – I recommend that we extend that

2034 2-year limit to 4 or 5 years. Many clubs would prefer to have a few more
2035 potential judges available.

2036 You may be interested in the following statistics, updated to include 2015.

2043 me know if you want to record what a superb job a judge has done at some
2044 field trial! Our licensing procedure is based on allowing a new judge to spend
2045 time as an apprentice, and then get more experience judging provisionally
2046 with another judge. Feedback from the fancy is an essential part of the
2047 evaluation process, and is always welcome. In addition, I would seriously
2048 request that judges, or applicants, let me know if you feel that you have
2049 encountered significant problems with judging, or if you find difficulties with

2050 the licensing program. It's only through feedback that we will know how to
2051 improve the system.

2067 **Report from the Field Trial Improvement Committee**

2068 *Greg Breitbach, Chair*

2069 Unfortunately, we did not get any traction out of the gate and have no
2070 progress to report this year.

2071 **Report from the Rules Evaluation Committee**

2072 *Dawn Gibas and Russ Jacobs, Co-Chairs*

2073 The following Rule Change Proposals will be submitted for approval to the
2074 2016 Annual Convention of Delegates. New wording is underlined; deleted
2075 wording is ~~struck-out~~. Explanations for the proposal are included, along with
2076 REC recommendations. THESE ARE PROPOSALS ONLY; those that receive a
2077 favorable vote will be considered a change in the *Running Rules and Field*
2078 *Procedures for Lure Field Trials*. Such proposals will be published on the ASFA
2079 website after the 2016 ACoD, and will go into effect on January 1, 2017.

2080 **Rule Change Proposals for the 2016 ACoD**

2081 All proposals were referred from the ASFA Board of Directors.

2082 **(1) Chapter I, General Rules**

2083 **Section 3. (a)** Hounds determined to have a breed disqualification at
2084 the time of roll call shall be barred from regular competition and be

2085 given the option of entering the Singles stake. Should they choose not
2086 to enter the Singles stake, their entry fees shall be refunded. Spayed,
2087 monorchid, cryptorchid, and neutered hounds without breed
2088 disqualifications may be entered in regular competition.

2089 **Effect:** To include moving/entering Singles stake if needed at the time
2090 of roll call due to a disqualification. Clarifies return of entry fees if the
2091 exhibitor chooses not to enter the Singles stake.

2092 **Reason:** This addresses any gray area about moving a hound to
2093 Singles stake as a result of breed disqualifications found during roll call
2094 and the return of entry fees if preferred.

2095 *The REC recommends that this proposal be ACCEPTED.*

2096 (2) Chapter II, Officials

2097 **Section 1. Field Trial Secretary** (must should be a member of the
2098 host club)

2099 **Effect:** To soften the membership requirement for the Field Trial
2100 Secretary. **Reason:** This addresses concerns that there are times
2101 when it is difficult for a club to provide a

2102 club member as an experienced Field Trial Secretary for a trial.

2103 *The REC recommends that this proposal be REJECTED.*

2104 RATIONALE: Given that under our current rules and procedures, clubs
2105 are held responsible for the way that field trials are run, the REC
2106 thinks that it is important that the Field Trial Secretary have an
2107 affiliation with the trial-giving club. However, we would consider a
2108 revision permitting a non-club member to serve as FTS for a very large
2109 or special event: e.g., an II, Regional Invitational, or breed National
2110 Specialty.

2111 (3) Chapter II, Officials

2112 **Section 1. #6** The Field Trial Secretary may decline any entries for
2113 cause for a period limited to 12 months from the first refusal of entry
2114 for cause, but in each instance the Field Trial Secretary shall file good
2115 and sufficient reasons for so doing, along with the current mailing
2116 address and e-mail address of the affected owner, with the
2117 Corresponding Secretary of the ASFA. The Corresponding Secretary
2118 will forward a copy of the letter to the affected individual by e-mail and
2119 by certified mail.

2120 **Effect:** This would facilitate communication by email in addition to
2121 USPS or Certified Mail. This also clarifies and makes consistent the title
2122 of “Field Trial Secretary” in several places.

2123 **Reason:** This allows the Corresponding Secretary of the ASFA to
2124 provide notification to an owner by email and certified mail instead of
2125 just certified mail, thereby increasing the ability to contact a person
2126 within a shorter timeframe.

2127 *The REC recommends that this proposal be ACCEPTED.*

2128 (4) Chapter II, Officials

2129 **Section 3. #3.** It is strongly recommended that, whenever possible, a
2130 field clerk be placed on the field to collect paperwork. The prompt
2131 collection after each course allows the field clerk to check for the
2132 judge’s signature, ~~correct additions~~ verify that the judge’s scores are
2133 added correctly, and promotes a smoother flow of paperwork.

2134 **Effect:** Clarifies that field clerks should be on the field if at all possible
2135 to assist with checking judges sheets to make sure that they are
2136 signed by the judge and the addition is correct.

2137 **Reason:** This addresses concerns that the field clerk is not correcting
2138 a judge’s scores, but checking them to ensure that they are correct.

2139 *The REC recommends that this proposal be ACCEPTED.*

2140 (5) Chapter II, Officials

2141 **Section 7, The Field Committee. #1** The field committee will make
2142 every attempt to conduct the trial in accordance with what is published
2143 in the premium list. Changes may only be made out of necessity, not
2144 convenience. This includes the field committee and their assignments,
2145 judges, lure operators, and course plan. Such changes shall be posted
2146 at the trial site.

2147 **Effect:** To ensure that any changes to the published premium list are
2148 provided to the participants at field trials.

2149 **Reason:** This addresses concerns that changes are not formally
2150 announced to those with hounds entered at field trials.

2151 *The REC recommends that this proposal be ACCEPTED.*

2152 (6) Chapter IV, Scheduling the Meet

2153 **Section 1. #1.** An approved date must be obtained for a lure field
2154 trial. The requesting club must be sanctioned by the American

2155 Sighthound Field Association. Applications for dates must be submitted
2156 ~~in writing~~ to the Scheduling Committee either by use of the date
2157 request form or the on-line date request at www.asfa.org; such
2158 applications must be submitted by the Field Trial Secretary or an
2159 authorized member of the host club at least 45 days prior to the date
2160 requested.

2161 **Effect:** This changes the words “submitting in writing” to allow
2162 submission either via the date request form or ASFA website. This is to
2163 clarify that requesting dates may be done electronically.

2164 **Reason:** This clarifies how the scheduling of field trials is to be done.

2165 *The REC recommends that this proposal be ACCEPTED.*

2166 (7) Chapter IV, Scheduling the Meet

2167 **Section 3.** ~~Two~~ One sample ~~copies~~ copy of the premium list and entry
2168 form must be sent to the Scheduling Committee Chair no less than 45
2169 days prior to the approved date. A Field Trial Secretary may not ~~mail~~
2170 ~~out~~ publish or distribute the premium list until such time as it has been
2171 approved ~~for mailing~~ by the Scheduling Committee Chair.

2172 **Effect:** This changes the current language from “two sample copies” to
2173 one sample copy being sent to the Scheduling Committee Chair. It also
2174 states that a Field Trial Secretary may not “mail out” and/or distribute
2175 a premium list until it has been approved by the Scheduling
2176 Committee Chair.

2177 **Reason:** This addresses concerns that two copies of a premium list
2178 are not needed for the Scheduling Committee Chair and that premium
2179 lists are not distributed prior to approval, which can lead to confusion
2180 as to which premium list is the most current.

2181 *The REC recommends that this proposal be ACCEPTED.*

2182 (8) Chapter IV, Scheduling the Meet

2183 **Section 8, 3(t), 4(e), and 5(e).**

2184 3. The following items must appear within the premium list, in
2185 approximately the order indicated (only minor deviations from the
2186 indicated order will be approved):

2187 (t) ~~Return address and directions to the site.~~ Address to which entries
2188 should be mailed.

2189 (u) Directions to the trial site.

2190 4. It is highly recommended that the following information be included
2191 in the premium list mailing.

2192 ~~(e) Return address and/or directions to the trial site.~~

2193 5. Optional information may be included in premium lists, so long as it
2194 is consistent with these running rules and is pertinent to the trial(s).
2195 The following items are specifically allowed:

2196 ~~(e) Return address and/or directions to the trial site.~~

2197 (f) (e) Reasonable health restrictions.

2198 **Effect:** This addresses language conflicts in Chapter IV, Section 8,
2199 3(t), 4(e), and 5(e) because they state must, highly recommended,
2200 and optional, which is confusing. By stating the need for the address to
2201 which the entries are to be mailed and the directions to the trial
2202 site/location as required in #3(t) and (u), the confusion is removed.

2203 **Reason:** This addresses possible confusion between sections and
2204 provides consistency.

2205 *The REC recommends that this proposal be ACCEPTED.*

2206 (9) Chapter V, Running the Meet

2207 **Section 2.** Except for national breed specialties, any entry limits shall
2208 be restricted to limitations in overall number of hound entries accepted
2209 at a trial. National breed clubs may choose, in addition, to require that
2210 any hound entered in a national breed specialty must have earned 20
2211 ASFA points, or equivalent points in its country of residence, or must
2212 be a Field Champion of Record. If a national breed club chooses to
2213 impose such a requirement, proof of non-ASFA title and non-ASFA
2214 points for hounds should be in the form of a photocopy of the
2215 certificate, or page of formal ~~printing~~ publication and included with the
2216 entry.

2217 **Effect:** Clarifies that the points or title needed to establish eligibility
2218 must be published in a formal publication.

2219 **Reason:** This addresses what is acceptable proof of title and what can
2220 be used for submission with an entry.

2221 *The REC recommends that this proposal be ACCEPTED.*

2222 (10) Chapter V, Running the Meet

2223 **Section 13 (c).**

- 2224 (c) Bench stake: for hounds of any individual breed; an entry shall
2225 consist of a single hound with proof on file with the ASFA of a
2226 conformation champion title from the AKC, CKC or both or a
2227 conformation grand champion title from the UKC.
- 2228 In all non-regular stakes there will be only one winner per breed with
2229 no championship points awarded. Hounds entered in the Singles stake
2230 are not eligible to enter non-regular stakes.
- 2231 **Effect:** To make it clear that hounds in that are entered in the Singles
2232 stake at any trial offering non-regular stakes are not eligible to
2233 compete in these non-regular stakes.
- 2234 **Reason:** This brings clarity to what hounds are eligible for non-regular
2235 stakes.
- 2236 *The REC recommends that this proposal be ACCEPTED.*
- 2237 (11) Chapter VI, Records & Fees Forwarded to the ASFA
2238 **Section 1 (b).** Names and complete addresses of all judges and their
2239 city and state of residence and the complete mailing address of the
2240 Field Trial Secretary.
- 2241 **Effect:** To be consistent with previous change for Chapter IV, Section
2242 8, 3b.
- 2243 **Reason:** This provides consistency across the Running Rules.
- 2244 *The REC recommends that this proposal be ACCEPTED.*
- 2245 (12) Chapter XI, Licensing of Judges, Licensing for Additional Breeds
2246 **Section 5:** Any judge regularly licensed in at least three breeds may
2247 seek an additional breed by meeting the following requirements; so
2248 long as those requirements are met, Singles stake shall also count as
2249 an additional breed.
- 2250 (a) Judge provisionally the breed or Singles stake for which the
2251 license is sought at no less than three trials with three different
2252 licensed judges. (Judging five hounds per breed is a
2253 requirement for the first three breeds only and does not apply to
2254 any breeds thereafter, or to Singles stake.)
- 2255 **Section 10.** Provisional judges may judge ~~Singles and Limited stake~~
2256 ~~stakes~~, however, the assignments shall not count toward fulfilling their
2257 licensing requirements.

2258 **Effect:** To make it easier to obtain the required number of dogs for
2259 additional breeds in pursuit of the regular judge's license.

2260 **Reason:** To allow potential judges in areas not hosting large trials to
2261 obtain numbers for additional breeds.

2262 *The REC recommends that this proposal be ACCEPTED.*

2263 (13) Appendix, Revising the Running Rules

2264 **Section 9.** A proposal that has received a favorable vote at the Annual
2265 Convention of Delegates shall be considered a change to the Running
2266 Rules and Field Procedures for Lure Field Trials. Such proposals shall
2267 be posted on the ASFA website, and any other method of publication
2268 as approved by the Board of Directors and shall go into effect ~~January~~
2269 ~~±~~ on October 1 following the ACoD ratification.

2270 **Effect:** To make approved rules effective on an earlier date.

2271 **Reason:** This addresses concerns on the long period of time between
2272 approving rules and their becoming effective.

2273 *The REC recommends that this proposal be REJECTED.*

2274 RATIONALE: There was no proposed date that accompanied this
2275 proposal for the REC to consider, therefore the October 1 date was
2276 suggested by the REC to provide an opportunity for discussion of the
2277 proposal. The implications of such a change include:

2278 • There is a cost to modifying the rules and records and whatever
2279 else may be affected by a particular rule. A single date, such as the
2280 current January 1 date, achieves some economy in such changes.

2281 • Impactful changes are probably best implemented on January 1 in
2282 order to allow the time for modifications to take place, as well as to
2283 coincide with our standard running calendar (such as changing the
2284 definition of a veteran for a particular breed).

2285 • An earlier implementation date would put more pressure on other
2286 committees and officers to get their business completed sooner in
2287 the year.

2288 • A change in the middle of the year could affect the Top 20 and how
2289 it is tallied.

2290 (14) Various places in the Rulebook

2291 The phrase Field Secretary appears in many places in the Running
2292 Rules, rather than the more appropriate Field Trial Secretary. REC is
2293 requesting permission to do a global search of the Running Rules, and
2294 replace Field Secretary or field trial secretary with Field Trial Secretary
2295 wherever it appears.

2296 **Effect:** Housekeeping; to refer consistently to the position.

2297 **Reason:** The position should be consistently, and correctly, referenced
2298 throughout the Running Rules.

2299 *The REC recommends that this be ACCEPTED.*

2300 (15) Various places in the Rulebook

2301 The phrasing or wording for Singles stake appears several different
2302 ways; Singles, Singles Stakes and Singles Stake. Capitalization of this
2303 phrase also varies. REC is requesting to do a global search of the
2304 Running Rules, and replace the varying phrases with Singles stake
2305 wherever it appears.

2306 **Effect:** Housekeeping to refer consistently to Singles stake.

2307 **Reason:** The phrase should be used and referred to consistently
2308 throughout the Running Rules.

2309 **Report from the Nomination Committee**

2310 *Greg Breitbach, Chair; Darci Kunard and Kathy Sanders*

2311 We had lively discussions regarding the direction and scope of this
2312 committee. We conducted interviews with potential candidates via conference
2313 calls. We made selections which we feel represents a cross section of the
2314 country so that each section will have a voice in the future of ASFA.

2315 **Ad Hoc Committee of the 2015 ACoD Reports**

2316 **Report from the ACoD Planning Committee**

2317 *Vickie Jacobs and Sean McMichael, Co-Chairs*

2318 As the ASFA Convention Planner I am assigned to find a location to hold the
2319 Annual Convention of Delegates and Board Meeting once a year. Every year
2320 the Site Selection Committee picks a city for me to set up the meetings.
2321 These cities are decided by one of three areas in the United States. East
2322 Coast, Central States, and the West Coast.

2323 The location is based on availability of good airplane connections and
2324 hotels. Two years out I need to decide how many delegates will attend and
2325 how many rooms will be rented. For many years as I have been the
2326 convention planner I have always based my numbers on 50 people and 40
2327 rooms. In the past years we have around 45 delegates and 35 rooms rented.
2328 Attendance is lower these past years and so are people who stay at the
2329 hotel.

2330 This year in Seattle we have 45 at the convention. Thank you for coming and
2331 I hope you have a great time. The Red Lion hotel is our host this year and I
2332 hope you enjoy the facility.

2333 I already have a contract signed with the Hyatt Hotel in Omaha, Nebraska
2334 Old Market. This is a new hotel and will provide us with great hospitality and
2335 a great location to walk around the Old Market. Breakfast buffets are
2336 included in our room fee, free Wi-Fi, and free parking. The hotel will let us
2337 provide food and drink for the Friday Hospitality Night and I look forward to
2338 having a great night hosted by Region 5.

2339 2018 will be on the East Coast again and I am looking for suggestions for the
2340 ACoD location.

2341 **Report from the ACoD Site Selection Committee**

2342 *Vickie Jacobs, Chair*

2343 Purpose: The purpose of the ACoD Site Selection Committee is to select
2344 locations for the Annual Convention of Delegates. The convention will rotate
2345 from the East Coast, Central and West Coast.

2346 Goals:

2348 *convention date.*
- 2349 • *To contact club representatives and board members for suggestions*
2350 *of cities. To get suggestions for local hotels.*
- 2351 • *To inform the Convention Planner of the sites selected.*

2352 As you all know Seattle was selected for this year so the West Coast is for
2353 this year.

2354 2017 will be in the Central region in Omaha, Nebraska at the Old Market
2355 Area. My site selection committee will consist of Marilyn Standerford and
2356 Josie Haumont.

2357 2018 will be on East Coast. I have yet to receive any suggestions. If any club
2358 would like to volunteer their city and their willingness to host the hospitality
2359 room on Friday night of the ACoD, please let me know.

2360 **Report from the Advisory Committee on Animal Issues**

2361 *Vickie Jacobs, Chair*

2362 Purpose: To keep the members of the American Sighthound Field
2363 Association informed of Animal Legislation that pertains to the sport of lure
2364 coursing and the care of their canines.

2365 Goals:

- 2366 • *To maintain a relationship with the American Kennel Club Animal*
2367 *Legislation Committee.*
- 2368 • *To notify Regional Directors of pending Legislation that might affect*
2369 *their club members.*
- 2370 • *To report to the convention of delegates at the Annual Meeting of*
2371 *Delegates of action taken for Animal and members rights.*

2372 WE are still dealing with AB 1634 in California. This bill will damage the right
2373 to breed dogs.

2374 **Report from the Constitutional Revision Committee**

2375 *Ping Pirrung, Chair; Russ Jacobs, Jeff Lipps, Leigh Littleton, and Rick Wolpin*

2376 CRC was charged at the spring Board Meeting to clarify Article 5, Section 5
2377 Vacancies on the process to fill a vacancy on the ASFA Board.

2378 The section currently reads:

2379 *Article 5, Section 5 Vacancies. Any vacancies occurring among the*
2380 *officers during the year shall be filled until the next Annual Convention*
2381 *of Delegates by an affirmative vote of a majority of the then members*
2382 *of the Board, except that a vacancy in the office of President shall be*
2383 *automatically filled by the First Vice President and the resulting*
2384 *vacancy in the office of First Vice President shall be automatically filled*
2385 *by the Second Vice President. Any vacancies occurring among the*
2386 *Regional Directors shall be filled by a majority of the votes by the club*
2387 *delegates representing the respective region.*

2388 The CRC felt that there was no need to change the Constitution, rather the
2389 process could be clarified by a policy.

2390 **Report from the Lure Coursing Hall of Fame Committee**

2393 Each year at its Annual Convention of Delegates (ACoD), delegates select
