It was not an easy decision to make but in the end the board decided it was right way to move forward and focus on something that was beneficial for ASFA. - 780 and October, GASM should be holding trials in April and November and GANG will be holding

### 782 Region 8 Report – March 2022

- 783 Kathy Sanders, Regional Director
- Region 8 consists of 12 member clubs (2 of which are Parent clubs) and 3 affiliate clubs. As we
- began 2021 under the cloak of COVID, it appeared that the Regional clubs were able to
- 786 proceed with caution. There were approximately 36 trials held within region 8.
- 787 In 2021, Region 8 clubs held 36 trials, while in 2020 they held 28, so it is great to see more clubs
- 788 who felt comfortable to have trials while following the COVID protocols. The total entry for
- 789 2021 was 1675 compared to 2020 which had total entry of 1286 hounds. With that said, I am
- 790 pretty confident that the #1 club with the most entries in 2021 will come from region 8.
- Our 2-day Regional was held over Thanksgiving Weekend by Upper Chesapeake Bay Saluki
- 792 Club (UCBSC) for the 2<sup>nd</sup> year in a row. In 2020, the total entry for the 2 days was 93 dogs.
- Amazingly, in 2021 we surpassed that with a total entry of 157 dogs (84 & 73 respectively). It
- truly takes a village and this village ROCKS! Who's up for trying to beat that number in 2022??

- may be new exhibitors or children nearby when having discussions with one another. I hope that
- 818 2022 brings us all much happiness and health. And remember "BE KIND".

#### 819 Region 9 Report – March 2022

- 820 Cathy Sanderson, Director
- 821 2021 was a tough year for Region 9. GONE was the most active club in the region. The other
- 822 clubs each held one trial. Ontario had strict covid restrictions and there were some field
- availability problems. Region 9 is the only ASFA region to be split by an international border, this
- year that border was closed to non-essential travel which reduced entries for all clubs in the
- region. The average entry was 40 dogs.
- 826 One of our clubs based in western New York and its members are Canadians, so that club held
- 827 its trials in Ontario. Even though the border opened in November there were some difficult
- 828 restrictions left in place.
- 829 As of this month the border is open without the difficult restrictions, so hopefully Canadians will
- 830 be travelling to many regions again.
- The Region 9 Regional is scheduled for October 15 at Kinnie Farm in Griswold, CT.

#### 832 **Region 10 Report – March 2022**

- 833 Jennifer Gysler, Regional Director
- 834 [Region 10 covers the state of California south from the northern boundaries of San Luis Obispo,
- 835 Kern and San Bernardino counties, Arizona, Hawaii, and Nevada south of Highway 6.
- While we are not exactly back to "normal", Region 10 is trying to get back to where we were
- pre-Covid. Unfortunately, we have lost some fields but are working to find new ones so we can
- increase the number of trials we are able to hold.
- 839 Our Clubs: We have four clubs in Region 10 now. Two are member all breed clubs, California
- 840 Coursing Association "CCA" based in southern California and Central Coast Association of
- 841 Sighthounds "CCASH" based in Paso Robles, Calif. The third club is a national breed club
- 842 (International Silken Windhound Society "ISWS") which has a specialty every year in different
- 843 regions. Our newest club is Desert Fun Bunch, based in the Phoenix area of Arizona. ASFA Lure
- 844 Coursing is back for the Desert Fun Bunch! DFB hosted the club's first ASFA trial as an ASFA
- affiliate club on December 4, 2021, in Mayer, Arizona
- 846 Our Trials: In reviewing the stats for last year, we expected a significant downturn due to the
- 847 difficulties we had, as did many regions, in hosting events, finding locations and being safe.
- Region 10 normally lacks in ASFA trials compared to other areas of the country. The LCI
- program has been helpful to us in increasing interest in ASFA. In 2021, Region 10 hosted 16
- trials, consisting of 180 entries. We held the same number of trials as 2020 but about 50 fewer
- dogs. This appears to be due to lack of field access and some weather-related issues which
- made our one field inaccessible in February. As our back up field was no longer available, we
- 853 simply lost those entries. We seem to have increased interest so far this year and will make
- 854 every effort to increase our numbers this year.
- The positives: Desert Fun Bunch is back holding ASFA trials. We also have another local club
- ready to apply for fast-track status this year. As before, we are emphasizing the positives of
- 857 ASFA to our local exhibitors, both with sighthounds and non-sighthound breeds. Hawaii is still
- on our radar. The individual who was leading the charge for ASFA in Hawaii suffered some
- significant health issues, so the plans to start coursing in Hawaii are on hold for now. Hopefully,
- 860 in 2022, some of our CCA members will be able to travel to the Big Island and host an ASFA trial
- for the locals while garnering interest so they can eventually have their own trials.
- 862 **New clubs:** We plan to have a breed club apply and be approved for fast-track status this
- 863 year.
- 864 LCI: Interest continues to grow in this program, and we are hoping to have even more
- participants in 2022.

The future: By continuing to foster relationships with exhibitors and clubs, along with sharing the positives that ASFA has to offer, I am hopeful we will be able to host more trials in 2022!

- ASFA had been working with a software company to develop an online version of our record keeping software since Microsoft is no longer supporting MS Access. The contract was signed with them in 2017 and we have not received a working software system. You will hear more about this from another committee.
- To move forward we have contracted Eddie Kominek to replace and improve our software and record keeping. Eddie's day job is a software developer, and he has created the LCSoft program for field trial secretaries that some of you may have used.
- A reminder, LCSoft is the only computer program that ASFA accepts to do a random draw.
  The development plan is composed of 4 stages each taking 6 to 8 months. The first priority is to replace the record keeping system that has been cobbled together for the past decade. The new structure will better handle the LCI program and allow for expansion and changes as needed. Eddie is using a programing system called Laravel which is a powerful open-source framework based on php. I don't want to bore everyone with the geeky tech stuff. If you want
- 1052 to discuss details speak to Eddie or me.

- 1053 However, rest assured that Eddie is using standard Laravel procedures and practices to ensure that any other Laravel programmer could read and understand the code that he is writing. 1054 1055 The ultimate goal of this project is to have.

- 1071 The committee revised and submitted to the Board changes to Chapter XI of the running rules 1072 to clarify and align all procedures for obtaining an ASFA judges license. The Board passed this 1073 on to REC to be presented to this ACoD. Upon implementation of this new section, several 1074 policies will be removed as they are being incorporated into this revision.
- 1075 The committee added a new section to Chapter XI to test judges. The Board passed this on to 1076 REC to be presented at this ACoD. The new procedure will define testing judges to ensure that 1077 they are up to date on current rules and policies. The test will be open book like the current test 1078 for new judge applicants.
- 1079 The committee has discussed other areas of the running rules pertaining to judging and judges 1080 to bring them up to date and incorporate additional policies with the intent to remove policies 1081 which have been in effect for a long time. These discussions are ongoing and should be ready for the next ACoD.

## Judges Licensing Committee Report – March 2022

1086 Greg Breitbach, Chair

- The Chair of Judges Licensing has processed requests for apprentice, provisional and breed licensees throughout the year.
- I hear from some applicants and exhibitors about the time it takes to obtain an all-breed judging license. I also hear from exhibitors and others that we have a better trained judge
- when they do obtain their all-breed license due to the time it takes and experience each
- 1002 when they do obtain their all-breed license due to the time it takes and experience each
- individual obtains by working with and learning from the experienced judges they are with at
- each trial where they provisional judge. Training should not end when an individual obtains an
- 1094 all-breed license. Don't think you know it all, be intelligent and allow yourself to ask questions
- when in doubt.
- 1096 Each month a document is published which provides information on rules and policies which
- are not being followed and interpretations for questions posed by exhibitors and judges. Also,
- the current list of judges in an excel spreadsheet is published each month. This has been
- expanded to include if judges are willing to travel outside their immediate areas. These
- documents are currently found at https://www.asfa.org/judges/index.htm on the right side of
- 1101 the page.
- Reminder that judges are to provide the Chair of Judges Licensing an explanation for missing
- an assignment within two weeks of that assignment. Also, it is up to each individual judge to

Limited stake will be offered by all host clubs if there are any breeds approved for Limited status. All rules and procedures pertaining to competition in the Open stake shall apply to Limited stake competition except where inconsistent with the following:

- 1. Each Limited stake shall consist of entries of only one breed, dogs and bitches. All Limited status breeds will be run in braces or tries, if possible. Scores and placements will be tallied by breed.
- 2. Limited stake entry is allowed for hounds of breeds that: 1) are considered sighthounds by their national parent club or the parent club from the country of origin but are not eligible for competition in the ASFA regular stakes, and 2) are on the list of such breeds that the ASFA has currently approved for entry. Such list can be found on the ASFA website.
- 3. Limited stake entry must be allowed for all breeds on the current ASFA approved list, except that a club may offer a Limited status breed specialty trial, at which only hounds of the single specialty breed will be accepted for entry.
- 4. Placements shall be awarded based on the combined preliminary and final course scores (and tie-breaking runs if appropriate). The winners of these classes shall not be eligible to compete in the Best of Breed and/or Best in Field courses.
- 5. No ASFA points or placements towards a Field Championship or an LCM shall be awarded. However, the parent clubs are encouraged to provide recognition.
- 6. All-breed judges are licensed to judge the Limited stake.
- 7. Provisional judges may judge the Limited stake as allowed by Ch. XI, Section 4 (a). However, such judging assignments will not be considered as part of the licensing requirements for additional breeds.
- 8. Limited status breeds are eligible to compete in ASFA Invitationals.

- 1716 Applicant: a person seeking change from previous status.
- Apprentice: a person seeking a provisional license to judge; has no status as a judge at trials at this time.
- 1719 Chair: the ASFA chair of the subcommittee on Judges Licensing.
- Judge (also, regular licensed, licensed judge): a person who is fully licensed for a breed with no restrictions. At any time the word provisional or apprentice does not precede the word judge, it shall mean an individual who is licensed without restriction for that breed.
- 1724 *Provisional* (also, provisionally licensed, provisional judge): a person who may judge sanctioned lure field trials, with restrictions, as noted in this chapter.
  - *Publication*: an applicant's name shall be published on the ASFA website, or any other method of publication as approved by the Board of Directors.
  - *Trial*: an ASFA sanctioned lure field trial at which ASFA points are awarded to appropriate hounds (i.e., not a fun trial).
- 1730 **Section 2.** General Requirements
  - (a) Every judge (all-breed, provisional, apprentice) will be required to take a 25question open-book test provided by the Chair of Judges Licensing every four (4) years. This test will cover all running rules and policies in effect on January 1 of that year related to judging. Passing grade will be 85%. If a judge has not passed the test within four years, their license will be suspended. The Scheduling Chair will not approve suspended judges for new assignments until they have passed the test. Currently approved assignments will be completed. Judges will be allowed three attempts to pass.
  - (b) All of the following requirements must be met before a license is granted
  - 1. must be 18 years of age or older.
    - 2. must be in good standing with the American Sighthound Field Association.
- 3. must have participated in lure field trials a minimum of three (3) consecutive years during which time the applicant has served at ten (10) or more <u>ASFA</u> field trials in <u>the listed field capacities</u>: <u>field trial chairman</u>, <u>huntmaster</u>, <u>field trial</u> secretary, field clerk, and/or lure operator).
- 1746 **Section 3.** Granting Apprentice License
- 1747 Prior to, or within 30 days following the first apprentice judging assignment, the
- 1748 applicant:

- 1749 1. Must file the appropriate application for apprentice judge license with the ASFA Chair of Judges Licensing.
- 1751 2. Pay applicable fees with application.

- 1752 3. Will be provided with the link to the ASFA's Judges Handbook on the ASFA website.
- 4. Must successfully complete an ASFA test covering knowledge of the running rules and policies related to judging. The required performance level on the test will be 85%. There shall be 25 questions on the test randomly selected from a list of at least 35 questions covering judging rules and policies. An applicant shall be allowed to take the test three times; if the applicant does not meet the performance standard in three attempts, the applicant shall wait 6 months before taking the test again.

When the above requirements have been met, and upon receipt of this information, the Chair of Judges Licensing shall verify the application, and may grant the apprentice license no less than 30 days after publication of the application. The Chair of Judges Licensing shall publish the new apprentice judge's name twice on the ASFA website, and in any other method of publication as approved by the Board of Directors, as may be appropriate at the time.

# **Section 3** now <u>4</u>. <u>Pre-Licensing Requirements</u> <u>Granting Provisional License</u> (apprenticed status)

After successful completion of Section 3:

- a. Any person who seeks a provisional license to judge must, in addition to fulfilling all of the general requirements of Chapter XI, Section 2, apprentice judge all of the courses for a breed with a minimum of three entries:
  - 1. At a minimum of three trials, with a minimum period of 19 intervening days between the first and last trial, and
  - 2. Must judge under three different ASFA judges licensed for that breed.
  - 3. This minimum requirement must be met for five individual breeds.
  - The applicant shall judge at least an entire breed, scoring each and every hound running in every course of that breed. All such apprentice judging must be performed within the United States at an ASFA sanctioned event. Each of five breeds must be judged this minimum number of times before an apprentice is eligible for a provisional license.
- b. The apprentice judge's sheets shall be accumulated all judging forms and JUDGING CONFIRMATION STATEMENTS until the requirements have been completed. including having each licensed judge fill out and sign an apprentice Judging statement as approved by the ASFA.
- c. Prior to being granted a provisional license, the applicant must successfully complete a test provided by the ASFA, covering knowledge of the running rules. The required performance level on the test will be established by the Board. Individuals must apprentice judge under an ASFA breed licensed Judges who are is officially judging the breed for which they are the candidate is apprenticing at the trial. There will be no more than one apprentice per licensed Judge on the field at any time.
- d. When the above requirements have been met, the <a href="sheets">sheets</a> judging forms and <a href="JUDGING CONFIRMATION STATEMENTS">JUDGING CONFIRMATION STATEMENTS</a>, together with the completed application form and Request for Change in Judging Status form, shall be sent to the Chair of Judges Licensing to arrive within one year of the date last apprenticed. Upon receipt of this information, the <a href="Chair of Judges Licensing">Chair of Judges Licensing</a>

- shall verify the application, and may grant the provisional license no less than 30 days after publication of the application. The Chair of Judges Licensing and shall publish an applicant's a new judge's name twice on the website, and in any other method of publication as approved by the Board of Directors, as may be appropriate at the time.
- e. The Board, upon recommendation of the Chair of Judges Licensing, and no less than 30 days after second publication, with no negative comments or rules violations, shall approve the application for an Apprentice license and include the apprentice judge's name in the monthly judge's report sent to the Scheduling Chair and website for publication.

The ASFA Board of Directors may approve specific other field trial sanctioning organizations, judging at whose trials (as a licensed, or the equivalent, judge under that organization's rules) may be used in substitution for the apprenticing requirements indicated above. The Board may also indicate what class of events of such another organization shall be considered trials for the purposes of this chapter. For apprentice requirements fulfilled in this manner, rather than in addition to submitting judge's sheets and apprentice judging statements as indicated in (d) above, the applicant must submit the published results of the field trials of the other organization(s), showing the number of breeds and hounds judged. The combination of records submitted, for apprenticing at ASFA trials, and judging at other organization's trials, must meet the requirement given in paragraph (a) of judging each of five breeds at a minimum of three trials apiece. Applicants who satisfy apprentice requirements in this manner must also take and pass the ASFA judge's test before provisional status can be approved.

# Section 4 now <u>5.</u> Provisional Status (seeking regular license)

Provisional judging assignments shall not be counted toward licensing requirements unless the assignment was published in the premium list or the Judge was assigned to the breed to replace another Judge out of necessity. The provisional must still judge with a published ASFA licensed judge for that breed.

- (a) During the period for which a provisional license is granted, the applicant is free to accept judging assignments. (On all premium lists, announcements, flyers, and so forth, an asterisk preceding the judge's name shall denote provisional.) The provisional license encompasses all breeds, but at no time shall a person judge more than four breeds in addition to Singles stake and <u>Limited Provisional breed</u> stake, for which he is not regularly licensed at any one trial without special dispensation <u>from the ASFA Judges Chair as stated in Section 8 of this chapter. In each planned case where a provisional or licensed judge is to judge more than four breeds provisionally at one trial, the respective Regional Director must write a letter of approval to the Scheduling Chair in advance of, or together with, the sample premium list. There will be no exception without such written dispensation. This provision applies both to Regional Invitationals and to standard trials.</u>
- (b) Any person seeking a regular license for a breed must judge the performance of a minimum of five hounds in one stake <u>or seven hounds in one breed</u> for three breeds:
  - 1. At a minimum of three trials
  - 2. Under three or more different ASFA licensed judges

The provisional judge shall, on each occasion, present the <u>ASFA</u> licensed judge with form (see sample) <u>a JUDGING CONFIRMATION STATEMENT</u>, as approved

- by the ASFA, which the licensed judge completes, signs and returns to the provisional judge for mailing to the <u>Chair of Judges Licensing</u>. All such forms for a single breed must be dated within a three-year span of time. Provisional judges must be fully licensed for at least one breed within three years from the date of their provisional license or revert to Apprentice status.
  - (c) When the above requirements have been met, the provisional judge shall notify the Chair of Judges Licensing in writing using the Request for Change in Judging Status form, listing each completed breed and assignments, accompanied by the JUDGING CONFIRMATION STATEMENTS forms signed by each licensed judge for each judging assignment.
  - (d) The Board, upon recommendation of the <u>Chair of Judges Licensing</u>, and <del>in</del> no less than 30 days after <u>second</u> publication, <u>with no negative comments or rules</u> <u>violations</u>, shall determine if the applicant shall be granted a license for the breed or breeds for which the license is sought.
  - (e) <u>Upon completion of public comment period, the applicant's name will be published as an ASFA licensed judge for that breed(s) and sent to the Scheduling Chair in the monthly judge's report be included on the monthly judge's report sent to the Scheduling Chair and website for publication.</u>
  - (f) AKC licensed Judges who are currently in ASFA Provisional Status may use an AKC assignment, when judging with a fully licensed ASFA judge, where breed entries meet the entry requirements, to count towards that breed's license approval. The Provisional judge will be required to provide a signed ASFA JUDGING CONFIRMATION STATEMENT from the ASFA licensed judge and documentation supporting their assignment, and which includes the number of hounds in that breed judged on that day.

# Section 5 6. Granting a Licenseing for Additional Breeds.

- Any <u>ASFA</u> judge regularly licensed in at least three breeds may seek an additional breed by meeting the following requirements; so long as those requirements are met, Singles stake shall also count as an additional breed.
- 1875 (a) Provisionally jJudge provisionally the breed or Singles stake for which the license is sought at no less than three trials with three different ASFA licensed judges. (Judging five hounds per stake is a requirement for the first three breeds only and does not apply to any breeds thereafter, or to Singles stake.)
- 1879 (b) AKC licensed Judges who are currently in ASFA Provisional Status may use an AKC assignment, when judging with a fully licensed ASFA judge, where breed entries meet the entry requirements to count towards that breed's license approval.

  The Provisional judge will be required to provide a signed AMERICAN SIGHTHOUND FIELD ASSOCIATION JUDGING CONFIRMATION STATEMENT
- from the licensed judge and documentation supporting their assignment, and
- number of hounds in that breed judged on that follow the procedure outlined in Section 5 (f) above.
- 1887 (c) When the <del>above</del> requirements of Section 6 (a) have been met, <u>the provisional</u> 1888 <u>judge shall</u> notify the <u>Chair of Judges Licensing</u>, <del>in writing, that a license for one or</del>

- more breeds is being sought using the Request for Change in Judging Status form, listing each breed and assignment, accompanied by the Judging Confirmation Statement(s) for each judging assignment signed by the ASFA licensed judge.

  (d) The Board, upon recommendation of the Chair of Judges Licensing, and in no less than 30 days after publication the second publication, with no negative comments or rules violations, shall determine if the applicant shall be granted a license for the breed or breed for which the license is sought.
- 1896 (e) <u>Upon completion of public comment period, the applicant's name will be</u>
  1897 <u>published as a licensed judge for that breed(s) and the judge's name will be</u>
  1898 <u>included in the monthly judge's report sent to the Scheduling Chair and website for publication.</u>

# **Section 7. Granting All-Breed License**

- After approval of eight (8) breeds, the Provisional judge may apply for all-breed status 1901 using the Judge Change Status Request form. The Board, upon recommendation of 1902 1903 the Chair of Judges Licensing, and no less than 30 days after second publication, with no negative comments or rules violations, shall determine if the applicant shall be 1904 granted an all-breed license. Upon completion of public comment period, the 1905 1906 applicant's name will be published as an all-breed licensed judge and the judge's 1907 name will be included in the monthly judge's report sent to the Scheduling Chair and 1908 website for publication.
- Section-6 8. No person shall accept a fee for judging but may accept reimbursement from the host club to defray expenses.

- (c) A judge whose license has lapsed for a period of 12 months or more may be 1912 reinstated upon request and payment of the application fee, if any. This may be 1913 1914 waived by the Chair of Judges Licensing upon presentation of hardship, health, out of country or other valid reason. - Section 9 11. Two provisional judges may be scheduled to judge a breed, however, the assignment shall not count toward fulfilling the licensing requirements of either judge.

The COVID-19 outbreak and response has had a 2028 dramatic impact on legislatures and policymaking at all levels of government. - Massachusetts Senate Bill 885 and House Bill 1437, which protect dog owners in Massachusetts

- 2039 The COVID-19 pandemic threatened to alter housing arrangements for Massachusetts

- 2042 encounter limitations on housing options based upon the breed, size, weight or appearance of
- 2043 dog owned. These bills would accomplish the following:
  - Block home-owners associations from prohibiting the keeping of certain types of dogs based on breed, size, weight or appearance;
  - Block state-aided public housing from prohibiting the keeping of certain types of dogs based on breed, size, weight or appearance; and
  - Prohibit companies offering homeowners or renters insurance coverage from refusing to issue, renew, cancel, or charge or impose an increased premium or rate, upon the keeping of a specific breed of dog upon the property.
  - Prevent hotels from objecting to the accommodation of dogs with owners during a declared state of emergency.
- 2053 The AKC supports this legislation, which will protect many responsible dog owners in 2054 Massachusetts from housing and insurance discrimination based solely on the dog's breed,
- 2055 size, weight or appearance.

2056 In the same way, the AKC believes that insurance companies should determine coverage of a 2057 dog-owning household based on the dog's deeds, not the dog's breed. Under breed specific

If a dog is a well-behaved member of the household and the 2060 community, there is no reason to deny housing or cancel coverage. In fact, dogs are a 2061 natural alarm system whose bark may deter intruders and prevent theft.

breeder/dealers, research facilities, intermediate handlers, and carriers—to establish 2075 emergency/contingency plans in the event of a natural or manmade disaster or other business

The rule requires regulated entities to:

- Create emergency contingency plans within 180 days after the effective date the rule becomes final (i.e., July 5, 2022).
- Provide contingency training to their personnel within 60 days after the contingency plan is put in place

The American Kennel Club (AKC) believes USDA APHIS' adoption of this final rule is an 2084 important and appropriate next step in helping protect both the dogs kept, and staff employed by, regulated facilities. Emergency contingency planning can prevent loss of animal life, reduce disaster recovery timeframes, better ensure continuity of regulated businesses, and reassure the public that facilities have measures in place to safeguard animal welfare during emergencies. Click here to read AKC's formal comment to USDA APHIS 2089 encouraging adoption of the final rule.

2090 The American Kennel Club's (AKC) own Care and Conditions of Dogs Policy features 2091 operations guidelines that state "Each kennel should maintain an emergency preparedness 2092 plan adequate for the type of facility owned and breed(s) of dogs maintained therein." To 2093 that end, entities regulated under the AWA that are also subject to AKC inspections have likely 2094 already incurred any costs of implementing emergency contingency plans to be in 2095 compliance with AKC's Care and Conditions of Dogs Policy.

The quorum for such a meeting shall be a majority of the Board of Directors.
- 2. (b) The Board of Directors shall have the authority to conduct its affairs by mail. Questions to be voted upon submitted by the President or by one-third of the members of the Board shall be distributed to members of the Board by the Corresponding Secretary within three (3) days of receipt. Each member of the Board shall have fifteen (15) days from the date of mailing to send comments to the Corresponding Secretary. The Corresponding Secretary shall distribute such comments and a ballot to the Board members within three (3) days from the expiration of the period for comment. Each member of the Board shall then have fifteen (15) days from the date of mailing to return a marked ballot to the Corresponding Secretary. The Corresponding Secretary shall tally the ballots received and, if a majority of the members of the Board have responded, shall record the vote on the question and distribute the results to the members of the Board.
- 3. (c) The Board of Directors shall also have the authority to conduct its affairs via electronic meetings. Meetings held in this manner shall follow the ASFA Electronic Meetings Procedures, a Board policy found in the ASFA Administrative Policies.

# Cover Letter for Records 101

So, we now have been following the new protocol for trial submissions for a year and the biggest problem is still missing FTE entries. For the most part it is because the owner did not mark the entry as such and the required copy of registration and certification (if required). I will continue to rely on each FTS to question each unfamiliar entry.

# I would like to say a big Thank You to all the FTS who have responded quickly to my email for information.

Some suggestions:

When making your roll call sheet if you have any unfamiliar entries, mark their name and have the person(s) doing roll call direct owner to see FTS to confirm that is not a FTE.

If you have an FTE that did not bring all required information have them, email or fax directly to me. This will expedite your ability to submit the results instead of waiting for them.

It is helpful when you list the breed initials by the call name on the Single Record sheet. If one of entries are missing information, I now have a breed to search by.

If you plan to submit the results via email, please minimize the number of files you send and try to keep in the same order that you would always use to submit.

Please submit results as soon as you can. The quicker I have them the sooner I process and post results.

As always, please contact me should you have any question(s). Email is always the best way to reach me, but you can call me if you need an answer quickly. But if you do call, I typically do not pick up if I do not recognize the number so leave a message. I may be listening and will pick up immediately.

# Records 101 (update 02/22)

# Daily Requirement

- A completed copy of the FTS Report (example included) completed in entirety.
- Per capita sheet for each day.

#### **Premiums**

- An updated copy of the premium list is required only if there were any changes to the course plan or change to judge's panel. For changes to the judge's panel the Chair of Judge's must be notified of change and reason.
- Although it is not required a copy of premium is appreciated.

# Entries that must be submitted with your trial results

- Entries for all hound(s) that are marked as FTE (First Time Entry). This must be accompanied by proof of registration (examples AKC, UKC or CKC) (Waived for NGA registered hounds & proof of certification if entered in a regular stake. This includes the Single Stake and the LCI stakes in respect to requiring the certification. If proof of certification has been waived, a copy of the signed waiver and proof of the title must be included.
- Entry forms that indicate a change in the information (titles, address, etc). If the change is in ownership an updated copy of registration reflecting said change must be attached.
- Entry forms that reflect that said hound is working off a dismissal.

### Record Sheets

- All record sheets completed in entirety that includes the BIF sheet. All information needs to be legible and as accurate as possible.
- O-TRIALS15 When two judges are used, they shall be designated on the record sheet as Judge 1 and Judge 2, alphabetically by last name. This is for all judges whether Provisional or full judge.
- O-TRIALS04 The Field Clerk's name shall be indicated on each record sheet, but the Field Clerk's signature is not required.
- Per Ch V Sec 6 (g) hounds can no longer be left tied. There must be a runoff or a forfeit. The only tie that can stand is if it is the result of an error found during post trial review by the FTS which then a note must be attached explaining the problem.

- Any hound listed but did not run will need to have an acceptable reason (per the ASFA Running Rules) listed on the record sheet. If nothing is
  noted or it just says pulled, the hound will count for per capita. If an owner is unable to separate their hounds and decides to pull an entry
  there is no refund for this!
- On the Single sheet if you could list the breed with the call name it is helpful to me if there are questions.

# Per Capita Sheet

- There must be a sheet completed for each day.
- If you are paying the fee by Paypal send it to treasurer@asfa.org. Put Paypal transaction ID on allotted space.

#### Additional Info

• Trial results can be submitted by email if you are able scan all record sheets, required FTS paperwork, all entries that are required to be submitted along with any required registration, certifications, etc that you need to send to Records into a file (suggestion is to put it all in a PDF file) and submit the payment via paypal.

# **Special Note for Invitationals**

The Regional Director is responsible to order the Rosettes and Medallions from the Awards Chairperson a minimum of 2 weeks prior to the trial. An estimate of the number of items required as close as possible is required. After the trial all remaining Rosettes and Medallions are to be returned to the Awards Chairperson within 2 weeks after the trial.

# Most Frequent Records Errors

- 1. FTE entries not submitted, typically because owner has not marked as such.
- 2. Incomplete Records sheets. Must have call name & registration number.
- 3. Not marking forfeits, just marking the placement(s).
- 4. Entry size is to be  $5 \frac{1}{2} \times 8 \frac{1}{2}$ .
- 5. Giving hounds placements that have not total 50% of possible combined score.
- 6. Per capita difference between check submitted and my count. Without some sort of per capita break down I have nothing to try to figure out where the error might be.

# · Organization of Trial Records for Submission \*previously listed in the rulebook

The following required items must be promptly sent to the Records Coordinator following each trial, indicated in Ch. VI:

- 1. Proper per capita fees made payable to the ASFA in USD. Current fee for each hound entered on the Record sheet which has not been excused as lame or in season at or prior to roll all. Only lame, in-season, hounds pulled due to change of judge/lure operator or hounds determined to have a breed disqualification are eligible for refund of the entry fee. Ch. I Section 3 The record sheet should reflect the refund was given. All other hounds listed will count toward per-capita. Just writing PULLED is not acceptable and will be counted. All per capita fees shall be paid with a club check, certified check, money order or through an electronic funds transfer (EFT). Do not send cash or personal checks. If you use Paypal send to <a href="mailto:transfer@asfa.org">treasurer@asfa.org</a> and mark on the per capita sheet.
- 2. A copy of the approved premium list only if there are any course plan changes or changes to the judging panel. A letter of explanation of these changes.
- 3. All record sheets for every course, including re-runs and runoffs if required. Notations of reasons why hounds who were entered did not run, e.g., absent, bitches in season, lame, dismissed, disqualified under the ASFA breed disqualifications, excused by the Field Trial Chairman, etc. filled out and written legibly.

The following must also be included:

- 1. Proof of registration, completed certification and entry forms for hounds entered for the first time.
- 2. Entry forms that include notations for hounds working off a dismissal.
- 3. Entry forms that include any indicated change of information (e.g. new titles, address change or change of ownership [changes to ownership require and updated copy of registration showing the change]).
- 4. Per Capita Report Sheet

The preferred order to use in organizing this material for submission is:

- 1. Per capita payment and worksheet showing entries for per capita. If submitted by EFT please mark the amount and date submitted on the worksheet.
- 2. Premium list if needed
- 3. Record Sheets in the alphabetical breed order: Best in Field/Event record sheet (filled out completely).
- 4. Any entries should be in the same alphabetical breed order.

Chapter VI Section 3: The host club shall maintain a completed set of all the records submitted for a period of one year following the lure field trial(s).

# Filling in the Trial Record Sheets

The record sheets must be completely and legibly filled out. This includes the complete names of the judges, the call names and registration numbers of the hounds, etc. If an entered hound is not competing, the reason should be entered on the record sheet, as should the reason for any excusal, dismissal, or disqualification. For tie runoffs, the blanket color and total score only should be entered in the "Runoff" column; similarly, for Best of Breed runs, enter only these items in the "BOB Runoff" column. This becomes even more important since not all entries will be submitted with the results.

# **Submission of Records**

With the changes in regard to submission of trial info it will become even more important to have contact information for the FTS as with the limited information being submitted I have to rely on the FTS to make sure that I get the needed information. So, if you have an entry and you are not familiar with the hound or owner please confirm with said owner that the hound indeed was previously entered in ASFA. Since the only info that I will be getting is the registration number and the call name I foresee problems! If I have trouble getting in touch with the FTS this will delay results being entered and subsequently getting posted on the Web. Trial Fees

NBQ --receives no points

The winner of Best of Breed receives the higher number of points available from the Open, Field Champion or Veteran stake, but must defeat the winner of the other stake(s) in a run-off.

**Note**: A hound must defeat a qualifying hound to count as a qualifying placement towards title requirements.

The hound winning BIF now gets 4 points for each hound that has competed in BIF in addition to the points earned in the regular stake up to a maximum of points.

<sup>\*</sup> Example: a hound places second in a stake/flight of 3 = 9 points.

A single entry in a stake, who defeats another hound to win Best of Breed, will earn a qualifying (competitive) first placement for defeating a qualifying hound. A single entry in a breed, awarded Best of Breed, will earn a first placement for winning Best in Field against a qualifying hound.

- an additional 300 points and
- four (4) additional First placements from the Field Champion stake over qualifying hounds

LCM II, LCM III, etc.: same as Lure Courser of Merit.

Veteran Lure Courser of Merit requirements:Veteran Field Champion title,an additional 200 points and

• four (4) additional First placements from the Veteran Field Champion stake over qualifying hounds.
