This is the Time to Make Hall of Fame Nominations



Do you have a remarkable hound or person in mind to nominate for the Hall of Fame? This is how it works. All nominees – hounds and persons - must have been out of the sport for at least 5 years to be considered. Hound nominations are made through the ASFA clubs. Persons are nominated through the Regions. So, to nominate a hound, you will need to work through your club. To nominate a person, you will need to work with your Regional Director. The Hall of Fame Committee will select up to 5 nominated hounds and 3 nominated persons to present for consideration at the 2024 ACoD. The ACoD Delegates will then vote to induct 1 person and up to 3 hounds into the Hall of Fame for 2022. Direct all questions and all nominations to Michael Hussey at dinnree@skybeam.com.

The purpose of the ASFA Hall of Fame is to honor in perpetuity those hounds that have achieved outstanding performances or records in the sport of lure coursing. This fosters the continued remembrance of remarkable individual coursing careers and sets a high standard to help new hounds and owners achieve their goals.

The Hall of Fame shall also honor those individuals who have donated a great part of their life to improve and promote the sport of lure coursing for sighthounds. Since its inception, the sport of lure coursing has continually evolved. That evolution has taken place through the vision and energy of people who should be honored for their efforts on behalf of the sport. We shall endeavor to remember those individuals who have given their time and energy to make lure coursing what it is today. Their commitment serves as an inspiration to those who would, in turn, take the sport to greater heights.

The Hall of Fame was instituted in 1998. The 1998 Annual Convention of Delegates elected to the Hall of Fame the first Field Champion of each breed; the first Lure Courser of Merit of each breed; the first AKC conformation champion of each breed to become an ASFA Field Champion; the only three hounds to obtain the Grand Field Champion title; and the following people: Lyle Gillette, Tom Leone, Betz Leone and Gary Forrester. These hounds and individuals are the Charter members of the ASFA Hall of Fame.

Deadline for Submitting Nominations

The ASFA Hall of Fame nominations for the current year are now open and will remain open through January 31, 2024. They will be voted on at the 2024 Annual Convention of Delegates in March 2024.

Gary Forrester Achievement Award Selection Committee Report Request for Nominations

This is a request for nominations for the Gary Forrester Achievement Award. The recipient of the award for 2023 will be announced at the 2024 ACoD. The nomination and selection processes are described below.

How and When to Nominate

Nominations should be sent to one of the committee members. Their names and email addresses are listed at the end of this report. Nominations must be received by January 15, 2024, for consideration at the 2024 ASFA ACoD. Please also include a writeup detailing the nominee's ASFA lure coursing contributions, and achievements.

Evaluating Nominees

The committee will give preference to people who have been active and involved with ASFA lure coursing for five years or more and who have made a long-lasting, significant, and positive impact on the sport and/or association. The committee will consider, but not be limited to, the following areas of involvement: a) lure field trial participation, b) judging, c) active leadership at the local level-clubs and trial activity, d) ASFA administration, e) promoting ASFA and the growth of the sport, f) improving the quality of trials, and g) exceptional performance or effort in any other area.

Ideally, the committee will name one recipient per year, but there may be good reasons for exceptions. It is possible there may be two or more equally deserving candidates or a team and naming one person might prove to be nearly impossible. Conversely, there may be a year when the committee cannot agree on any recipient.

A person who is not currently a member of the board or an active key committee chair will be given strong preference. This award should not appear to be an "in house" honor.

Selection Committee Process

An active committee of three people will make the choice rather autonomously. The committee members are chosen by the ASFA Board of Directors with consideration to selecting committee members that are spread evenly across the country. The committee chair is tasked with aggressively seeking nominations from the members of the board, from key committee chairs, and by request in the Communique.

The committee will review all nominees (maintaining a file of past nominees to be reviewed each year with the new nominations), make a choice, and then report the choice to both the winner and the board no later than January 31, 2024. This will allow the recipient time to arrange to attend the ACoD, if they wish to do so. ASFA will offer to cover the cost of convention registration fees (only) as a small incentive to encourage the recipient to attend.

All members of the committee must agree on the winner.

The committee chair will supply the ASFA webmaster and the person presenting the award at the ACoD with written information about the recipient, listing major accomplishments.

INTRODUCING the CANDIDATES



Phil Fullam
Candidate for President

Being president of the ASFA has been an honor. Before being elected president in 2022, I served on the board as First Vice President and CFO. I earned my all breed coursing judging license in 1982.

As you may be able to guess, the demands of my full-time position have limited the time I have been able to devote to the ASFA.

At the end of 2017 I retired from my full-time job as a design engineer. For close to 2 years, I enjoyed traveling, judging, and showing my dogs.

In mid-2019 my ex-employer contacted me about coming back to run the company. After several discussions I agreed to return as an interim general manager while a search was conducted for a permanent company president. Covid hit full force in early 2020, and it was a full scramble to keep the company in operation. The consequence was that my 1 year gig turned into a permanent position. Finally, in Aug of 2023 I submitted my notice to retire as of January 1, 2024.

Leading a volunteer organization is a challenge. In the ASFA's case it is complicated by the structure of our constitution and Running Rules. After 50 years the accumulation of rules and policies makes change complicated and slow, as each new idea must be weighed against what can and cannot be done.

There is a benefit in this structure, as changes require careful consideration, limiting potential catastrophic consequences. On the other side is the problem

that this structure makes it difficult to adapt to changing times and circumstances.

The ASFA organization is a committee-based system, with the board overseeing progress. Two years ago, when I first became president I did not recognize the effort needed to get all our committees populated. This resulted in a slow start, but we eventually caught up.

I feel strongly that if re-elected I will be able to devote significantly more time and effort to continuing the progress the ASFA has made. – Phil Fullam

the 2023 International Invitational Committee Report

The 2023 ASFA International Invitational was hosted by the ASFA Board of Directors and held at Oatlands Plantation in Leesburg VA on September 30th and October 1st. Oatlands Plantation is a beautiful historic property dating back to 1798 that was donated to the National Trust for Historic Preservation in 1965 and is now a National Historic Landmark. Hopefully, all participants had a bit of time to explore the beautiful grounds.

There were 142 entries representing 12 breeds: Afghan Hounds (2), Azawakh (1), Basenji (4), Borzoi (14), Greyhounds (11), Ibizan Hounds (13), Pharaoh Hounds (12), Rhodesian Ridgebacks (20), Saluki (8), Scottish Deerhounds (2), Silken Windhounds (8), Whippets (30).

The welcome party on Friday evening was an opportunity to greet old friends and meet new ones with snacks and libations provided by the ASFA. We had an amazing dinner Saturday evening catered by “A Little Taste of Heaven”, which included a salad donated by “Who Cooks for You Farm” owned by Ping Pirrung’s daughter and son-in-law. We had an amazing raffle with outstanding baskets donated by individuals and clubs.

We were fortunate to have beautiful weather every day. Thankfully, tropical storm Ophelia came through the week before. However, the rain dropped by Ophelia caused problems with one of the fields where cars had been parked for a cross-country event the weekend before. Our field crew employed some inventive rut-flattening techniques to prepare the grounds for coursing, utilizing golf carts and vehicles in what might have looked like a demolition derby.

This year marked a significant milestone as it was the first time that Lure Coursing Instinct (LCI) dogs were integrated into the main event, rather than running on a separate day. The LCI dogs added an extra layer of excitement with some great runs. Best of Breed Trophies

Saturday

Afghan Hound

Gary Forrester Trophy

Gary was active as part of ASFA administration and on the field. One of the first all-breed judges in 1977, he continued judging until 1991; Chairman of judges licensing from 1978 to 1984; was a member of or chaired the following committees: AKC negotiation, computerization, reinstatements, budget, FAN, Constitution revision, rules' nominating, and several investigative committees of the board. He was 2nd VP 1978 to 1989, 1st VP 1980 to 1984, President 1984 to 1988 and the first Field Representative 1990 to 1991. He owned and lure coursed Afghan Hounds since 1974 – “Bandit” and “Piper”.

Basenji

Merv & Wilma Bauer (1920 – 1987) Trophy

Their untiring promotion of Basenjies contributed to ASFA's acceptance of the breed. They were active members of the Central Illinois Sighthound Club, and together they worked to advance Basenjies on the field and in the show ring. The motorhome, packed with a mini-bike for restringing a drag line, lure equipment, electricity, warmth and Basenjies, was a familiar and welcome sight at trials in the Midwest (including Carbondale, Illinois – at the first International Invitational).

Borzoi

“Locket” Trophy

Zaraya of the Wild Hunt, LCMXVII, bred by Ariel Duncan, owned by Leigh Littleton and Ariel Duncan, and chauffeured primarily by Leigh Littleton. #1 lure coursing sighthound in 1983 and 1984, #1 Borzoi in 1985 and again in 1988 as a Veteran, and continuously in the Top Ten from 1983 through 1989, Locket was winner of Best in Field at the 1983 Grand National Lure Course. Locket's goals in life were smiling at as many people as possible, playing the coursing game with intensity and follow, and killing as many lures as possible, and she did a great deal of each. Her last field trial was the 1992 International Invitational at Lexington KY, where at 10 years of age she took first place in the Veteran stake against competition; by this time, she was the only sighthound to have earned an LCM XVII, and had defeated over 2200 Borzoi.

Greyhound

Mike Lorenzo (1948 – 2008) Trophy

This trophy, featuring a brace of coursing Greyhounds, is dedicated to the memory of Mike Lorenzo. Mike and his wife Karen bred and trained many top lure coursing Greyhounds under the banner of the Winds Greyhounds, and over the years traveled many miles to compete against the best runners on the field. Mike was one of the most talented lure operators in the sport, and there was no equipment problem that could best him. He served as Regional Director from Region 9 from 2004 until 2007, and often served as Field Trial Chairman for several clubs. He conceived and co-founded the ASFA National Greyhound Specialty. Above all, he was richly deserving of that rarest of accolades: “sportsman”.

Ibizan Hound

Dean Wright

Dean was the president of the Ibizan Hound Club of the United States when the breed was accepted by ASFA in 1976 and recognized by the AKC for conformation in 1979. Dean has owned and bred Ibizan Hounds since 1967. He owned the first Ibizan ASFA Field Champion as well as the First Ibizan AKC Champion, both by the same hound, CH Sunking Eterna of Treybeau, FCh. Dean served on the ASFA board as a Regional Director for more than five terms and as First Vice President for two terms. He was the chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee. Dean remains very active in ASFA lure coursing.

Irish Wolfhound

Kevin Bryson (1947 – 1999)

A familiar, friendly face behind the lens, Kevin Bryson was a devoted fan, an ingenious artist, and trusted friend within the sport of lure coursing. Creating some of our finest memories on the field, Kevin spent tireless hours working his photographic magic to give us the timeless moments we treasure. Kevin shared his life with his wife Jill, Irish Wolfhounds, a Whippet or two, and Leaping Lizards Professional Photography.

Italian Greyhound

Jack Downing /Teri Dickinson “ Whirlwind’s Italian Greyhound Trophy”

Breeding, showing, racing and coursing Italian Greyhounds under the Whirlwind prefix, Teri Dickinson and Jack Downing were instrumental in getting Italian Greyhounds approved as an ASFA breed, having performed breed presentations at several ACoDs and working tirelessly behind the scenes to promote their diminutive sighthounds from 1993 until 2001 when IGs were fully recognized. As part of their service to ASFA, Jack has served numerous times as Region 4 Director and as an all-breed ASFA judge and an accomplished lure operator, having been named Lure Operator of the Year in 2010.

Pharaoh Hound

George & Joyce Martin

George and Joyce were instrumental in the late 70s and 80s. George was the RD for Region 2 from 1985 – 1986. George attended Several ACoDs even when he was not the RD. They competed with their Pharaohs on the West Coast, and “Bandit” was their most notable Pharaoh Hound.

Rhodesian Ridgeback

Meg Willis-Redfern Perpetual Trophy

Meg is a long time Rhodesian Ridgeback breeder with the kennel name of Rare Earth Ridgebacks. Meg was instrumental in helping achieve recognition of RRs in the ASFA through her advocacy for the breed. From her breeding program, focused on form and function, to mentoring people in the RR breed about coursing, she led the change in making RR coursing a reality. Today, RRs are a huge part of coursing, both in large entries and the fact that RR owners are out working the trials in every capacity, including some of our top huntmasters, lure operators, and judges. She is a mentor and friend to many and has one of the best senses of sportsmanship in the lure coursing arena. Meg has been a strong advocate for the ASFA and believes deeply in the premise upon which the ASFA was founded.

Saluki

Bill Henry (1929 - 1983)

Bill was the 2nd VP – 1980 until his untimely death in Texas on January 9, 1983. An active judge and competitor on the field and a colorful “protest digester” on the board; may have been one of the only 2nd VPs to call an ACoD to order. President of Galveston Bay Saluki Club for many years and an officer (and active club member) of the American Saluki Association. Bill owned many top winning Salukis (bench and field) under the Henrad Kennel name.

Scottish Deerhound

Robert Sellers (1934 - 2002)

The Bob Sellers Memorial Trophy is offered in memory of Bob by his many friends in the lure coursing community. Bob, with his wife Norma, was the breeder of many top lure coursing Scottish Deerhounds under the Vale Vue kennel name. He was also a long-time ASFA judge and lure operator, and he served as President of the Scottish Deerhound Club of America. Vale Vue was the home of the first ASFA coursing trials on the East Coast, and Bob’s enthusiasm and love for lure coursing helped bring many new people into the sport over the years.

Whippet

Tom Leone (1917 – 1980)

Together with both his wife Betz, and his friend Lyle Gillette, was a solid part of ASFA’s formation and early years. He served as ASFA Treasurer from March 1976 to 1980. Sheridan Seabiscuit, UD was his 5th Whippet FCh. Tom was an active judge, lure operator, and always ready with a smile and calm demeanor.

Borzoi

Darkling Perpetual Trophy

Will be presented to the Borzoi earning the right to represent the breed in the Gillette Stake in memory of SilkenSwift Blaze's Darkfire. "Darkling", the #2 Borzoi on ASFA's Top Lifetime Achievement record, passed away on December 26, 2008. Darkling began lure coursing September 27, 1998 and retired almost eight years later on January 1, 2006. During that time, Darkling successfully participated in seven International Invitationals. He competed in ASFA trials in 16 states from Florida to Wisconsin, Colorado to Texas, Iowa to Pennsylvania, and from Delaware down the East Coast to his home state of Georgia. His record as #1 ASFA Borzoi in 2000 and 2001, as #2 Lifetime Borzoi, as well as his 69 Best of Breed wins, speaks volumes about his performance. But more significantly, we will never forget his noble presence and confident and peaceful demeanor when off the field.

Ibizan Hound

Eterna Perpetual Trophy

The Eterna Perpetual Trophy will be presented to the Ibizan Hound earning the right to represent the breed in the Gillette Stake, in memory of Ch Sunking Eterna of Treybeau, FCh, LCM, who was owned by Dean Wright and Kathy O'Brien. Eterna was not even old enough to compete on the day that Ibizan Hounds were eligible to enter their first ASFA Field Trial on April 16, 1976. Eterna turned one year of age two months later in June and became the first Ibizan Field Champion. In January of 1979, when the breed was eligible to compete for an AKC Breed Championship, Eterna went to Florida in January along with 20 other Ibizan Hounds. Eterna did not place on the first day but earned 3 5-point majors on the next three days, making her the first AKC breed champion. Finally finishing her LCM at the age of 10, Eterna did truly combine form and function the way that it should be.

Irish Wolfhound

Woople Perpetual Trophy

The perpetual trophy for the Gillette Stake was inspired by the memory of the past Irish Wolfhounds who demonstrated the beauty in the show ring and the drive in the field. Jill Bryson commissioned this trophy and dedicated it to her IW Woople, CH Franjo Pearla Dhu at Aeroglen, LCM, RA, RATi, TKN, VC.

Rhodesian Ridgeback

Nitro Perpetual Trophy

This trophy is donated by Gayle A and Paul Kytta II in memory of BIF DC Rare Earth Top Fuel Eliminator, LCM7, VLCM4, GRC. JOR, MC, DC, CGC, TDI, TT, HIC, VC. Nitro was ranked nine times in the ASFA Top Ten Ridgebacks, achieving the #1 spot in 2010. He retired in 2016 as the #2 ASFA Lifetime Ridgeback and as the highest ranked male Ridgeback in ASFA history.

Whippet

American Whippet Club Perpetual Trophy

Representing the breed in the Gillette Stake American Whippet Club.

Best in Gillette Stake

Lyle Gillette (1910 – 1993) Trophy

The Father of organized lure coursing and ASFA. Tirelessly began promoting the sport in 1971; launched ASFA in 1972; Chairman '72 to '75; President '76 & '77. Without his vision and drive, we would not be here now celebrating the winners of this International Invitational.

Afghan Hound

“Bandit” Tamora’s Image of Ali CD LCM7 CAN FCHX TT

Bandit shared a home with Gary & Marietta Forrester in Pennsylvania. #1 Sighthound (all breeds) in '76, '77 and '78 and #2 lure coursing Afghan (Top Ten) as of 2011. Bandit has 1167 hounds defeated, 31 Best of Breeds, and 4 Best in Fields. That black & tan, always impeccably groomed, very calm – until slipped and then a burst of power with the black and tan coat flowing in the wind! “Bandit” actively competed for 6 years and was known to be flown to some trial sites by his own personal pilot, Gary.

Azawakh

“Cinnamon” Multi CH Kel Simoon Cinnamon, FCC

Cinnamon was the first Azawakh to fulfill the requirements of ASFA Field Champion. She was also a great show dog, a loving mother and a wonderful pet. Cin was tragically killed when she escaped from our yard in April of 2000. Her legacy lives on in her daughter, SBIS, Multi CH Kel Simoon Essari, FCC and her litter sister, SBIS, CH Kel Simoon Celie, FCC. These three dogs were the only Azawakhs awarded the FCC, before the breed was fully recognized.

Basenji

“Sheena” Patrician Sheena Crimson Art, LCM3

Sheena was owned by Dave and Carol Phelps of Maryland. #1 ASFA Basenji in 1988 and was #1 ASFA lure coursing Basenji of all time, as of 1989. Sheena proved that Basenjies were truly competitive! Sheena was a pet that everyone hopes they will have one day. Unless something was moving, she was perfectly content to lie in front of the wood stove on a cold day. On the field she ignored the other dogs, and all her attention was focused on catching the “bunny”. She squeaked and fought to be released when she heard the lure machine. All she wanted was to kill that bag at the end. Sheena would leap in the air to try to see where the bunny went if she lost sight of it. Sheena never did learn to “cheat”. Sheena helped change the attitude toward Basenjies as lure coursers.

Borzoi

“Pyerun” Caspian Prince Pyerun Duncan, LCM2 CANFCH

Owned by G Ariel Duncan. The first LCM Borzoi on Sept 17, 1977, and first LCM II Borzoi in April, 1979. Dubbed “the alligator” by many lure operators in the later years of competition, this red dog’s zeal for plastic set the standard for the others to follow.

Greyhound

“Fantasy” Treybeau’s Fantasy, LCM 7 (March '84 – Sept '91)

Fantasy lived to run, and with Dean and Sandy Wright’s help, she loved living. She began accruing lure coursing titles with a FCh in 1985 and finished her LCM 7 in '91. She was #1 lifetime Top Ten coursing Greyhound (1995); 847 hounds defeated, 133 BOBs, 30 BIFs, 151 Firsts, 2394 ASFA points, and ASFA Top Ten every year from 1985 to 1991, seven years and #1 for six of those years from '85 to '90. “THE PAST IS ONLY A MEMORY AWAY”.

Ibizan

“Flyer” Treybeau’s Spanish Flyer, LCM3

Flyer was one of the first three Ibizan Hounds to compete in an ASFA trial at Vale Vue Kennels in 1976. Flyer was the first Ibizan Hound to earn the LCM title and was an original inductee into the ASFA Hall of Fame. Flyer was in the ASFA Top Ten ASFA 1976 to 1982; #6 Lifetime Ibizan in 1995 with 461 dogs defeated and 24 Best of Breeds. Flyer proved to all that you run on your heart and the desire in your head. It makes no difference as to your conformation.

Irish Wolfhound

“Joshua” CH Just Plain Joshua Murphy, FCH

Josh was owned by Deborah Keplinger Sanders and bred by Dr Paul Palmer. Josh was the first Irish Wolfhound Field Champion (1974) and the first Irish Wolfhound Dual Champion. He received his AKC conformation championship two weeks after finishing his ASFA Field Championship. Josh is the only Irish Wolfhound to achieve his FCh under the original ASFA format, having to earn his points competing against Greyhounds, Salukis and Whippets. In the beginning, before ASFA instituted breed stakes, the dogs competed in mixed stakes determined by a random draw which included all breeds entered in the trial.

Italian Greyhound

“D” FCC DC Whirlwind Blew By You LCM VFCh OA NAJ JOR VCM

“D” was an IG lure coursing pioneer. Born in February 1995, he ran in his first trial in March 1996, the year IGs were admitted to the Miscellaneous Stake. Famous for both suicide bunny kills and sideline histrionics, his durability and enthusiasm opened the mind of many a skeptic. He coursed in an era when the Miscellaneous Stake was optional and not offered at all trials. Competitors were few and far between. Despite that, he earned enough points to meet ASFA Field Champion requirements three different times. He was first awarded a Foundation Coursing Champion title, then after a rule change, earned the Miscellaneous Field Champion title. After IGs reached full recognition in mid-2001, he went on to earn Field Champion, LCM and Veteran Field Champion titles. His first entry in a standard ASFA stake was in the veteran’s stake at the 2001 II. Among D’s groundbreaking accomplishments were - first IG to earn an ASFA title, and the first IG dual titlist. He was the #1 Lifetime Miscellaneous Under 18” from 1996-2001, the entire duration of IGs competing from that stake, the #1 Miscellaneous Under in 1997, and a member of the IG Top Twenty every year from 1996 – 2004. “D” ran his last trial in 2006. Breeder/Owners Teri Dickinson & Jack Downing.

Pharaoh Hound

“Bozo” CH Kamaraj Ra-Harakhte, LCM 6, CAN FCH

Bozo was owned by Frank Belinowiz of Massachusetts. Bozo is the only LCM 6 Pharaoh to date (2-94). #1 lure coursing Pharaoh ending 1989. A lure operator’s worst nightmare. The BOZO Trophy is to honor all Kamaraj Pharaoh Hounds in the past, such as: BOZO, #2 Lifetime Ranking Pharaoh Hound; Tiye Tu, 1999 BIF at the II; Luxor the Brod, 2001 Gillette Stake Winner; Seeker “Shut Up”, Hall of Fame.

Rhodesian Ridgeback

“Ida” BII FC Redwing’s Private Idaho LCM13 VFCH SC CGC

Ida was owned by Chuck Harper and Jeff Nearhoof. Bred by Sue and Dick Kaehler. In a crowded field of great coursing Rhodesian Ridgebacks, “Ida” has left a lasting impact on the sport. Blazing a coursing path since 1999 through 20 different states, she has set many records and often been a pioneer, most notably as the first Ridgeback to go beyond LCM 5. Ida won Best in International Invitational in 1999, was the #1 Ridgeback for 1999, 2000, 2001 and 2002, and remained in the Top Ten for 2003 and 2004. She also went BOB at four non-consecutive IIs, and seven Regional Invitationals in four different regions. Ida has been #1 Lifetime Ridgeback since 1999.

Saluki

“Haseeb” Sur-Ra Haseeb Amon Kahtahdin, LCM 8

Haseeb was owned by Dean Wright & Janis Copenhaver. Haseeb was the Number 1 Lifetime Saluki ending in 2000, with 976 hounds defeated, 56 Best of Breeds, and 13 Best in Fields. He made it look so effortless and easy over his many years on the field. Haseeb competed in 365 ASFA trials, plus some trials in Canada. Haseeb was a loner at home, preferring to do things alone. He would play for hours with an old football, throwing it in the air and chasing it.

Scottish Deerhound

“Pyns” AM/CAN CH Pibroch’s Pyns Of Vale Vue LCM

AmCanCH Pibroch’s Pyns of Vale Vue, LCM, owned by Norma & Robert Sellers of PA #4 lure coursing SD of ’89.

Whippet

Betz Leone (1918 – 1993)

The “first lady” of ASFA, helped put together the first ASFA lure course on school grounds a stone’s throw from her home in California and continued to be an active judge and handler throughout her lifetime. She was the FAN co-editor and printer (crank-style) beginning in 1974 and continuing for several years, served as Regional Director from 1981 to 1984 and 2nd VP in 1986 & ’87. Always willing to help, always with a smile, always the lady.

Highest Cumulative Score Trophy

Gallant Greyhounds Trophy

“Apple” Inphenite Defying Gravity J Vookles

The Gallant Greyhounds Trophy is awarded to the NGA Greyhound with the highest cumulative score for both days. The Gallant Greyhounds Trophy is dedicated to the NGA Greyhounds who participate in ASFA trials and are the backbone of the Greyhounds in ASFA. They have been in ASFA since its very beginning and are direct ancestors in recent generations of many of the lure coursing Greyhounds of other registries.

Trophies

The President's Cup

The President's Cup is offered in memory of ARNOLD ROSS who served on the ASFA Board as President in 1978 and 1979. Arnold competed on the West Coast with his Whippets. Ross was ASFA President when the first ASFA International Invitational was held in Carbondale Illinois. This was a one day II on Saturday, with the top hounds of each breed competing for top honors on Sunday. Today, Best of Breed hounds, from both days of the II, compete in the Best of International Invitational.

"Links to the Past"

The remarkable "Links to the Past" II Chain was awarded for the first time at the 2007 International Invitational' a truly fitting tribute to the 35th Anniversary Year of the ASFA. It is absolutely spectacular.

This truly unique trophy was the brainchild of Kathy Nelson and Jack Helder and was purchased (and is maintained) by individual donations from ASFA clubs and their memberships.

The "Links to the Past" Best in II Trophy is hand-crafted in sterling silver and is comprised of a chain bearing engraved links that recognize every Best in II hound in ASFA's history, stretching back to the first II in 1976. The hound's name is on one side, and the year on the other. The trophy links every former Best in II hound within one exceptional trophy. It remains in the possession of the ASFA President for presentation at IIs and is displayed in a case to protect the chain. Best in II hounds, and those who owned a former Best in II winner, can purchase an engraved sterling silver "take home link" – for a donation toward the future costs of maintaining this one-of-a-kind historical record – to us in display or as a piece of jewelry.

On Saturday, I judged Silken (6), Basenji (4), IB (12), Pharaoh (8) and the LCI Stake (15). There were a few courses where I wished that ASFA had the ½ point possibility that we do in Canada, as I would have made use of it! Upon arriving at Oatlands Plantation, we were met by the bustle of people scurrying to prepare for ASFA's coursing event of the year. The hospitality tent was raised and lined with tables covered with trophies and rosettes to be awarded, and an array of raffle items.

The camping area was already scattered with spacious RVs, pop-up tents, and teardrop and other campers. Vendors were setting up along the fence with a variety of goods to peddle including quick release coursing leads, blankets, decorative hound collars and a wide variety of other dog related paraphernalia. We found a quieter spot in the corner and maneuvered our Flagstaff to rest in a pleasant space for the weekend.

Hospitality generously invited all to a pizza party on Friday evening. Personally, I really enjoyed that time to catch up with friends I had not seen in years. Having been involved with coursing since 1972. many dear friends have passed on, so seeing the ones still involved meant a great deal. It brought up memories of years past when more of my time was spent running my dogs.

The workers should be commended for rallying to put on an event of this magnitude. Eddie Kominek was most often found behind his computer busily doing the paperwork for three separate fields, which is a feat in itself. The inspection committee had an effective method of checking the dogs, using 2 people for each line so one watched coming and one watched going away. I had not seen this done before, and I may suggest the method for our regional club to try. The hunt master and paddock personnel had challenges because of distances from the parking area to the field. Still, they seemed to be efficient in their duties. Field clerks and runners were kept busy, so the paperwork didn't get hung up and could be processed quickly. The three event chairs did a tremendous amount of preparation for the event, and it all came together as a success. It was great to see so many people pitching in to keep things running throughout the weekend. All deserve a pat on the back.



I was lucky and thankful to judge on field three with Laurie Soutar, and the talented photographer Dean Lake. Joe Shoemaker, the President of the Michigan Gazehound Association, the club I was affiliated with for 30 years, was in charge of the equipment on the field. Joe kept things running without problems. It is always a pleasure to watch sighthounds doing what is in their genes to do, and for the LCIs, to also enjoy the pursuit of the plastic. Many running styles were exhibited, ranging from creative renditions of the course plan to running with clear focus on the task at hand. All still provided the opportunity to witness the grace and beauty of the dogs in motion.

Field three was very long and narrow; the visibility to the far end was not optimal for judges or lure operators. It had drop offs and there were groups of trees on each side of the course. In the prelims, hay bales at the end of a basically long straight stretch clued the dogs into early cutting of the corner near them. This led the lead dogs over the crest of a hill to the pulley set in that depression, which resulted in the dogs disappearing from view momentarily. In the final runs, the long straight became the stretch coming into the lure box. It tested and provided proof of endurance, or not, with its slow but steady rise uphill. One observation we found interesting is that the direction in which the course ran best, changed from Saturday to Sunday according to the different breeds running the course.

I want to thank the ASFA for the opportunity to judge at the II. The opportunity to watch canine athletes doing what they enjoy was certainly blessed by the wonderful weather.

Grand National Trial Procedures

The Grand National follows three days of ASFA coursing, held on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. Hounds earning the right to run in the Grand National Best in Event (BIE) must have earned a Best of Breed (BOB) on any of those three days. All hounds intending to run in the Grand National BIE must have run at least three times on Sunday as well, making the BIE run itself equally challenging for all. No hounds are allowed to compete in the Grand National BIE, who have failed to earn a qualifying score in each of the required two days of coursing. The BOBs who have met these requirements are advanced to the Grand National BIE, which consists of one course of approximately one mile in length, depending upon course conditions. Similarly in singles, high in trial Singles, who have run two of days including the mandatory Sunday running also get a chance to run the combined course to earn Best Single for the Grand National.

Not surprisingly, Salukis, renowned for their endurance, have dominated Grand National winners over the past 49 years with 14 Salukis winning the BIE title. This is followed by eight Whippets, seven Greyhounds (including the 2023 Grand National winner), and also seven Afghans. Borzoi have five winners, followed by three Irish Wolfhounds, and two Scottish Deerhounds. Ibizan and Pharaoh Hounds are represented with a single BIE winner for each.

1977 is the only year in which the BIE was not run. In all 49 years of the Grand National, only one hound, Whippet CH Affinity Caught Sneaking Out LCM3, won the Grand National BIE in consecutive years. Two other hounds have won the Grand National twice, including Afghan Alfie's Ebony and Ivory FCh in 1984 and 1986; and Saluki Shafiq Precocious LCM2 NACC NACM in 1989 and 1992.

Awarded Annually at the CLCA Desert Dog Classic by Darci Kunard

The CLCA Desert Dog Classic is held in the height of the summer heat in Falcon, Colorado. The courses are long and grueling, with Best in Field offered on each of the 3 days of the event. Typically, roll call comes quite early to beat the heat and to allow exhibitors time to take in the gorgeous nearby scenery, which includes Pikes Peak and the Garden of the Gods.

The CLCA Desert Dog Classic began in 2010. Pete Lowe and I became the moving force behind the creation of the event, with Pete as Field Trial Chair and me as Field Trial Secretary. A few years later, Michael Hussey took over as Field Trial Chair.

The first Desert Dog Classic BIF winner was my Pharaoh Hound “Kaba”, affectionately known as “KK”. He went on to win the Desert Dog Classic Friday BIF again in the following year. KK absolutely loved to lure course. His barking could be heard around the course. He wore a massive smile at the end - right until he chomped down on a large summer sausage which was

used to ensure his quick capture. KK went on to compete in 9 ASFA International Invationals, and he spent many years in the Top 10 for ASFA Pharaoh Hounds. KK, whose life spanned from 12/13/2006 to 6/16/2021, sparked my love for lure coursing. He was loved by me and my husband Matt Kunard, and resided in Denver, Colorado. He was officially known as Multi-BIF, UKC CH, AKC DC Naha Atomic Blond Revival, RN, MC, NAJ, AXP, MJP, NFP, CA, CGC, TKA, LCM2, V-FCh, HIC, VCX.

The KK Trophy is the CLCA Desert Dog Classic Perpetual Trophy for Friday's Best in Field Winner. It is dedicated in Memory of Pharaoh Hound Kaba. The KK Trophy bears the list of winners dating back to the event's inception.






THE ASFA CODE OF CONDUCT


